### NOW WHAT

Just over six weeks ago, we made the leap to living out what God has been etching on our hearts for the last several years - working with the Cambodian people through In His Steps International. Here we are. We made it! I (Jacob) still look back to that moment when I embraced the calling - it's surreal sitting here typing this newsletter. When we arrived, we were overwhelmed with getting settled in which has left us VERY thankful for Eric & Ginny Hanson (In His Steps' directors). They have made our transition wonderful and have been such a big help in navigating what it takes to adjust.

One way I know we are in the right place is the way our hearts are becoming more sensitive to the needs of others. We have plenty to adjust to and the transition is not always easy, but I know there are kids out in the Saang District (a rural area where In His Steps does a lot of their ministry) who have no place to lay their head at night, little food for dinner and face abuse/neglect on a daily basis. Wow, I suddenly feel as though we have it easy. We have a roof, safety from abuse, food on our plates and love from many.

IHSI offers hope, dignity and purpose to those taken advantage of and forgotten. No one qualifies more than a child at risk for human trafficking. Until now, IHSI placed these children in Cambodian foster families. However, there are now more children than families to care for them. And so one of IHSI's current projects is raising funds for the Saang Safehouse near IHSI's Foundation Center.

Why do we share this with you? For two reasons. When we put our budget together, we wanted to re-invest into IHSI. This is the beginning of that -- we are grateful for your generosity which allows us to give in return. Second, we are so honored to be part of this life-changing project and wanted to invite you to participate as God leads. So check out a few details below.

**Specifics:** Fully staffed by Cambodians, fully cares for 12 children - education, meals, medical care, job skill training/higher education, social development and spiritual discipleship.

Cost: \$45,000 to build and \$28,000/year to operate (includes education fees, staff salaries, food, clothing, etc.).
