A Science of Emotions

- The scientific study of emotions is fairly new
- Reason was thought to be what made us particularly human
- Emotions were seen as disruptive
- But research has flourished in the past 30 (or so) years


A Science of Emotions?

- Emotions are inherently SUBJECTIVE
- How can one go about objectively studying the subjective?
- Mistake to assume that there can be no objective criteria to subjective experience
 - Example: Color

- Philosophy








How universal are emotions?
