PROOF POSITIVE

The evidence is solid. Religions all over the world have practiced animal and human sacrifices for ages. A young man from Kenya tells of having to spend so much time appeasing the bad gods that there is no opportunity to enjoy the good ones. Sacrifices are made and homage paid to ward off the tricks and devious will of evil spirits. A recent visit to an archeological dig in South America helped me see this so vividly. When the rain refused to fall it was assumed that the rain god was unhappy. So somebody was offered as a sacrifice. If dry weather persisted there might be a string of executions.

The Old Testament is not so different. People sinned and lambs bled. It happened over and over and (it seemed) for ever and ever. And then something absolutely mind-boggling occurred. To the uneducated eye it may have seemed like just another execution outside the walls of Jerusalem. Some might have assumed it was another case of 'what goes around comes around'. But it soon became clear that the unthinkable had happened...and right under their noses.

The God of the universe had just made a sacrifice. Let me say that again... instead of God asking for yet another lamb...God, himself, brought his own son to the altar. It is a jaw dropping

thought! At the sight of this we should be falling to our knees. Instead, you'll hear how people are unhappy with God. Things in life haven't gone as expected. We have suffered loss. Life has sprouted some bad fruit. And where, somebody may demand in all seriousness, is God?

Lest we have one moment of doubt about God's intentions for us, friend, we need to look at the cross. Before this old world started spinning, God was conjuring up a plan to redeem us. Before Adam or anybody smudged their white robes, God was there with a plan to deal with our failures. And it was expensive for him. I don't expect that setting the stars in place was much of a chore for God. Designing systems within systems was right up his creative alley. What was hard was this thing called redemption. It is free to us...but murder for God.

It isn't about fairness. If it was we'd still be sacrificing. But it isn't even close to fair. It is about goodness, generosity, mercy and extreme love all wrapped up together. We call it grace. So stop the sacrifices. Stop talking about doing the best that you can. That never was enough. What is enough is Jesus. The divine answer for your wretchedness is the cross

ROGUE RIDERS TO ENJOY SPRING FLING



SAINTS ALIVE AND GOOFING OFF




There is nothing serious about this, friend. Expect some foolishness for sure. There is enough going on in our lives to keep us on

This letter contains news that fills our family with great joy, much excitement and profound peace. Brian and I have completed the undergraduate portion of our nursing studies and have worked for almost 2 years as RN's here in the USA. We have sought out every opportunity to grow as healthcare professionals and though we still consider ourselves 'babes' in the field, we are ecstatic to finally set out to Glorify Him abroad.

5 months from now we will be relocating to Tacna, Peru where we have previously lived and served, where we have deep ties to the local community and where we are thrilled to work alongside our good friend, Ebel. Ebel is a doctor from Tacna and since 2001 we have discussed the desire to serve the materially poor of both Peru and Africa. At last it is coming to fruition! Together, undergirded by a concerted international effort, we aim to establish a Santuario, a place of healing for the weary and heavy laden. The property where the clinic is to stand is adjacent to both the existing church and the ecological park we were blessed to help establish 4 years ago. What an honor it will be to participate in a ministry that seeks to reconcile and restore each one of us in a holistic manner

Not only do we seek to serve the poorest of the poor in Tacna, we are pleading with Him to restore us and renew us through the very process of serving others. Our expectation is that we may Glorify Him with our hands this coming year, while our hearts might be refined and enlarged. We long to know Him more intimately so that we might learn to live more harmoniously and dynamically with ourselves and our neighbors. Brian and I have been blessed beyond measure by the prayers, encouragement and love that you have consistently offered us. Over the years you have heard us mention both Egypt and Sierra Leone. The people and situations within these countries remain on our hearts and minds and we remain quite open to the possibility of serving amongst them. As for immediate future. Peru is where we feel confirmed to love, live and serve. After Brian completes his Masters in Family Nurse Practitioner we will see where He leads!

nation. Contact the church office at office@cc-ashland.org if you are interested in a disk and Brad will let you know when they are ready. They should be ready be mid May.




