the world's coldest baptistery. We all followed and looked down into the chilly water, unsure just how deep it was. Prayers were offered and Brian confessed his need for and his faith in Jesus Christ.

Somebody tied several towels together, making a rope for our escape to high ground. Suddenly Brian was sliding down the bank, splashing into the cold stuff. I joined him. It was a rather fast-paced event. I dipped him quickly. He seemed unfazed by the frigid water. We were pulled up the bank by our families and changed into dry clothes. Brian was so full of joy.


I've often reflected on that glorious day. Brian never complained about the shock of near-freezing water. He'd have done much more for Jesus if God had allowed it. The apostle Paul spoke some about such things... filling up the suffering of Jesus. I know Paul's remark was connected to the persecution he had endured. In my 'Minister's Report' I told how I've started sending out email devotions to people who have responded to my offer to be their pastor. I have lots of contact with people each week who live all over the valley. Many of them have no immediate plans to attend our fine church, but are willing to keep in contact with this preacher-man. My main focus was my upcoming mission trip to South America. But another upcoming event is Christmas. I've invited a bunch of our folk to participate in the Christmas Sunday service (following breakfast in Fellowship Hall). It (Christmas morning) should be a grand time.

The Treasurer's Report was better than last month. A nice refund from SAIF helped. Also, our expenses were down. Our contract with nursery workers ended in October. That saves us some cash. The church bus was recently sold. That saves us insurance money, plus we received cash for the bus. Our air heating/cooling fan needed to replaced in October...that was a \$460 unexpected expense. Then too, some money came in from the Silent Auction. All in all, an encouraging month.

Elder's Report. Your elders met in October and made a list of possible cost saving actions we may have to take in the new year...all the way from paid staff reductions to keeping a better eye on the thermostat. Also mentioned were a reduction or elimination of the magazines we provide for our people each week, recovering costs of books provided to adult Bible school students, and Jim analyzing his pay package in hopes of spotting savings opportunities. The Deacons reported on having a work day with plans for yet another.

The budget needs to be prepared for presentation to the church in December. Doyle called a budget committee meeting for November 16.

Under New Business, we all expressed gratitude to Chrystal Garcia for offering to take photos of our people, with all proceeds to go to the church. Thanks, Chrystal. See her amazing work at Crystal Garcia Photography on the internet.

Missions. The Stringers have just returned from a short-term mission trip to TCMI. They hope to host a meeting of all folk interested in possibly joining them on such a trip. More later. It was also mentioned that our support of SABI (South African Bible Institute) will cease with our December payment.

Worship. We commend Chris M. for doing a good job of leading our worship time. Thanks, Chris. It was a fine gathering. The spirit was on of optimism and excitement.

God In The Dock is a reference to God being 'in court', a British term. C.S. Lewis wrote this collection of essays on theology and ethics. It is deep water, but worth your best effort.

<u>The Apostle...A Life of Paul</u> is superb. Since I'm preaching from Acts these days, you may find this to be a timely read. I love it.

### JOSUE AND LOVELY LAURA TO WED





We are grateful for this annual time of mission work as well as the money provided by the Mission Committee this year which allowed Karen to join me.


