Josh and I turned our slender craft around and got in a holding pattern next to a cliff, in hopes of spotting the other guys. Somehow a rogue current caught the end of our sixteen foot Red Otter and in a second we were overboard. At that moment we didn't speak of making it to our campsite downstream. Dinner was the last thing on our minds. We were holding on to the capsized canoe and that had our full attention. I coached my young buddy to hang on. We were swept away by the liquid muscles of the Rogue River. Hang on to the canoe! That was our objective. At a bend we managed to swim ourselves and the sleek shell to a sandbar where we righted our rig and shook water from our gear.

Sometimes I hear fellow preachers talk about our labors for Christ as though we, too, are just hanging on. Our ofttimes unfriendly (to Christians) culture would upset us and send us to the bottom of the river, it seems. So we hold




on. I'm no spiritual giant, but it seems that despite a set back now and then, we are really doing more than that. A fortress mentality has some folk sounding like Jesus had better come soon or the church will be squashed by the weight of a hostile world. It just ain't so.

It is certainly contrary to what Jesus said. He warned of hardships, bumps and thumps and such. But his theme was always one of infiltrating and bringing change to our world, what-

#### Dear Family,

Ah, the month of February! As the month progresses we see visual reminders of romantic love everywhere. I don't know about you, but it seems to me that most of what I see centers primarily on one

It continues to show up on screen printed t-shirts coupled with (sometimes questionable) Valentine sentiments. Or, if your sweetie adores an overstuffed teddy bear toting a heart between his fat, satiny paws, this too can be had at most department store chains.

In light of Jim's recent encouragement to take another look at Psalm 119, I did a re-read or two and found to my surprise that "the heart" was practically jumping off the page at me! Turns out the Psalmist had quite a bit to say about the seat of his own emotions, and that made me think about my emotions as I approach God in prayer. May I share portions of a few verses for your consideration?

- "I will praise You with uprightness of heart . .
  ." (Verse 7)
- "With my whole heart I have sought You . .
  ." (Verse 10)
- "Let my heart be blameless regarding Your statutes . . ." (Verse 80)
- "Your testimonies . . . are the rejoicing of my heart." (Verse 111)

It seems that God takes notice of one who will approach Him without reserve. It also seems that he appreciates one who returns again and again with the priority of putting Him first. In each instance where the heart is mentioned in this Psalm (I counted eleven) I feel the need to remind myself of the obvious: the writer was engaged in a real "conversation" with the One he cared about the most. Centuries later, Jesus would tell us the following: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." (Matthew 5:8)

In light of all this, I think I'll be praying in the com-

ing month with renewed focus and appreciation for the simple fact that the Lover of my soul cherishes the gift of my undivided attention. Care to join me?
