I'm sitting in the Lima, Peru, airport as I write to you. Although I contend that I could survive here with my limited Spanish, the sandwich I've just ordered will be filled with surprises. My buddy, John Hendee, invited me to



do some preaching and teaching in Trujillo, so I'm still swimming in the joy of that recent experience. Teams from around the West converged on that city of a million souls. They completed a septic system and construction projects, between VBS type ministries with kids in the poorest part of town.



Most of the 300 baptized so far in 2010 have Catholic roots. They are

now overjoyed to have direct access to God, minus a rigid church system. The Restoration Movement offers them a breath of fresh air. You know that I find fulfillment in helping new converts get a grasp of the 'plot' of the Bible, develop dynamic prayer lives and other foundational tools. I've been making these treks to South America for thirteen or fourteen years, so many precious friendships have developed. I'm loved by their leadership team, so there is no need to develop a 'trust base' each time I arrive. We just pick up where we left off.



John likes telling the folk in Peru that I come from a large church. He explains that his 'large' has to do with many lives touched each week by our congregation. Who knows how many young preachers download and use our PowerPoint sermons on a regular basis (found on OutsideTheWalls.com)? will take the place of both our early-in-the-month 39Plus gathering and the July Rogue Riders outing. Please accept our invitation. Jim


OLD TIME MOVIE NIGHT...FREE

PRAYER THOUGHT

Dear Family,

I don't know how many of you watch Christian television. I find it every now and again, usually when I am tired and channel surfing at an odd hour of the day or night. Recently I came upon a program all done up in popular talk show format, complete with a live band playing music reminiscent of the stuff I remember from my younger years when I used to tune into Saturday Night Live. (I'll go ahead and date myself here and let you know that for me SNL means the days of Chevy Chase and Dan Ackroyd, just so you know where I'm coming from.)

The moderators of this show (a man with a female co-host) were addressing subject material all too familiar-yet-confusing to what I am sure is a primarily Christian audience: the role of men versus women in the context of the marriage relationship. Forgive me for a little cynicism here, but the person doing most of the talking was the guy, which I found interesting in light of the main idea that was being developed. The main idea, which seems very popular in Christian "how to get along with your spouse or potential spouse", manuals, is this: men are born brain damaged. (Sorry, guys.)

For those who may not be familiar with this notion, the basic proposition is that the baby boy brain is bathed in certain chemicals in utero that render it less developed in the type of neural circuitry necessary to engage in the kind of talk that women thrive on: the sharing of feelings. You can't expect your guy to have much to say in this area, girls, because he can't help it. His brain just isn't on the same playing field as yours in this department. If you play it smart, you'll get most of your "strokes" from God and a good group of girlfriends.

True? I'll leave that question to be further explored by the research professionals who specialize in these things. I would like to submit, however, evidence from the word of God regarding some pretty "emotional" men that suggest another truth: Men in prayer, under the influence of the Holy Spirit, are capable of an amazing range of expression on behalf of self, family, and nations. Check it out: Peek in on Moses as he intercedes for Israel after they've blown it by worshipping a golden calf. (Read the entire story in Exodus 32) Hear David's heart as he grieves for his sin with Bathsheba in Psalm 51. Think big boys don't cry? Listen to Jeremiah in the book of Lamentations. Of course, you could jump to the New Testament and look at Jesus himself, who "... offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the one who could save him. . ." (Hebrews 5:7). Next time you're in a tight spot, go to the garden and "sweat bullets" alongside the One who knows what it is to sweat blood . . . literally.

I offer these observations not so much to make a case one way or the other in the ongoing battle of the sexes as to make an old point in a different way: prayer (Continued from page 5)

changes things. Going to God with whatever "it" is can alter outcomes, even if the only alteration turns out to be inside the interior world of the person offering the prayer.

I think there's something extremely valuable in that, whether you are male or female. And guys . . . good luck with that brain damage.
