After accepting the Treasurer's Report (Eleanor Olson), we moved on to Jim's minister's report. He expressed great joy that Nathaniel Rogers was baptized this morning. Yipee! He also reported that Laurie Royer has agreed to help him by posting photos of our friends and members on a new bulletin board in the Foyer. This will appear when the Silent Auction is completed. Helen Jane has asked him to take over the duties as wagon master of our Rogue Riders program for a time. Jim acknowledged the loss of the Wing family since Michael has been hired in the music department of a Medford church. He concluded by noting that Fall is actually the beginning of much of the church's year. These are good times for us, he said.

The Elders recommended the purchase of additional pew Bibles, some of them with large print. We all agreed.

The Deacons reported that a work day is planned to help Katie Anderson move her supplies to a central location. Another work day is slated for October 16...everyone is invited.

Deaconess report: They joined the Deacons on work days in August and September. They have purchased shelving to assist Katie in storing her equipment and supplies. We'll still have a church potluck in October since the picnic is on a separate week-end. October is Pastor Appreciation

Month. Jim said that the perfect gift for him would be a collection of recipes from our folk. We'll present these to Jim and Karen at the October potluck. (A cookbook with blank pages is in the foyer where you can tape you recipe as a gift to Jim).

Doyle and Ed, our trustees, reported that they are recommending that non-designated memorial and estate funds be put together in a church building fund. The Wilson Fund will remain separate from this.

Regarding worship, Jim noted that Lori Jo will be planning services now.

The Missions Committee recommends that we fund a college scholarship for one student from Christian's Haven (\$2160). They also want to help Karen Larsen (\$1500) join Jim on his next trip to Peru. The committee also suggests that we fund travel expenses (\$500) for Cory and Janice Lemke who will be conducting a seminar her early next year. All of this was approved unanimously by the board. The money will come from the Opportunity Fund.

Kay Killian reported on the current Silent Auction..a goodly number of items have been donated and enthusiasm is running high. The funds received will help offset recent expenses of painting the church and replacing a long stretch of sidewalk.

We agreed to purchase three additional shelving units from the Building and Maintenance fund.


