

BUDDYTIME...MAKING THE WORLD A BETTER PLACE



In December of 2007 I walked a Peruvian beach with my longtime partner in ministry, John Hendee. I journey to South America at least once a year as the Director of Biblical Studies for Project New Hope International. But as we spoke over the din of breaking waves our energized conversation focused on engaging non-church people in compassion campaigns. Over the decades we have had our annual retreat below the equator in Chile and Peru. Other times we've taking fishing trips or camped in solitary places, always emerging from our spiritual mountain top with ideas which have changed the course of our lives. BuddyTime was birthed on the beach just north of Trujillo. It functions mainly in North America.

BuddyTime has three components: Camaraderie, Character Conversations and Compassionate Action. Usually BuddyTime is a weekly or bi-weekly gathering, including most any mix of people...men, women, children. Friends, neighbors, co-workers, family members, church members...any combo works. Church people, agnostics, atheists...y'all come. A few minutes are spent catching up with one another, then, using an article downloaded from my website, <u>www.BuddyTime.org</u>, the group discusses a character trait such as 'service', 'compassion' or 'availability. Finally, the confab is wrapped up by working out the details of the group's 5-7 week service project.

In addition to the local compassionate action plan everyone is asked to consider traveling to South America for the annual Rendezvous in Peru. This
