THE BEAL JESUS ASOLID ROCK

Jesus business is doing quite well these days. I'm not referring to what takes place at the corner of Second and B streets on Sunday morning. These days there is an immense interest in most any book, article or documentary that claims to have discovered something new about Jesus. Dan Brown's novel, The Da Vinci Code, would have you believe that Jesus and Mary Magdalene had a thing going. The so-called Gospel of Judas (not written by Judas) claims that Jesus and Judas collaborated as close friends to bring about a phony 'salvation'.

Were I a gambling man I'd have bet a bunch that in the weeks prior to Christmas the networks would be scrambling to air shows which would debunk Christianity. By now I'd be rolling in dough. Folk lacking in scholarly credentials needed only to say they had a document which once and for all settled the matter, and reporters came a runnin'. The claim is that all documents needed to be viewed as having the same spiritual content and historical significance, regardless of when they were written, the special agenda of the writer or dating of the material. If such claims are true then we are camped on a sand bar rather than a solid rock.

Yet we have little clout. Our members

will probably not send letters to Newsweek or the History Channel decrying their weak cases for an ordinary Jesus and 'smoke and mirrors' Gospel writers. I'm afraid this sort of toning down Jesus will persist. So I'm suggesting that you do some homework, friend. For my part, I'll preach from the Gospel of Luke throughout 2009. Perhaps you would be willing to read a few reliable books...including the Bible. My second suggestion is *The* Case for the Real Jesus, by Lee Strobel. Call Evangel Family Book Store at the Mall, 772-2849, to have them hold or order a copy for you. It is well worth the \$22 price tag. I remember Mr. Strobel writing that sales in scandal are high. Simply saving that the Bible is the Word of God and reliable won't stir much interest. But tell the world that you have found a new piece in the Jesus puzzle and you'll create a stir.

This flurry of books, articles and documentaries objecting to Jesus being God in the flesh is not new. What is different is the way that such attacks can be communicated to the whole world these days, including the internet. So don't be shaken. A storm is always a good time to check out the sturdiness of your dwelling.






