CAMP HOST OR WAGON TRAIN MASTERP

I well remember my first sermon as your pastor. Somehow you had invited me, a retread, to be a leader of this congregation. A year out of the ministry had led me to the conviction that I could not return to the same sort of pastoring that had characterized my life over the previous 30 years. Although the congregations I had served had all constructed new facilities or conducted building projects, some purchasing additional property, I had not been truly obedient to the great commission.

My evangelism efforts were more predatory. I was there for people who visited the church or otherwise made the initial contact with me. In followup many of them accepted Christ and were added to the congregation. But it was more like a hyena circling the zebras, picking off the weak ones. Plus, as a young guy I was more intimidated by successful business people and those better educated than I. A step away from ministry in 1999-2000 provided an opportunity for a reassessment of what it meant to be a preacher. Even while sitting on the bench for fourteen months, I was convinced that a real minister must get into the fray and fight the good fight, engaging the culture and serving as a faithful ambassador for Jesus Christ.

I've known 'camp host' preachers. I had been one. Isn't it true that there are caravaners and settlers? These days I see my role much more as one of the guys trying to steer the wagon train toward high ground. It means constantly checking the gospel compass and making adjustments in our direction. Same old compass...

constant course adjusting. This 'take' on ministry might lead an observer to conclude that outsiders are more important to me than the insiders. I prefer to use the analogy of the putting the 99 safe-and-sound sheep in good hands while looking through the bushes for lost lambs. Oh, I know that this may all sound a bit like 'look at me', am I noble or what? I don't mean that. I know full well that I often fall short in ministry. Sometimes I do look past our own dear ones while surveying the white fields. That isn't good, for sure. You've been gracious about that.



BATHTUB BAPTISM...THE ANGELS REJOICE FOR JOHN WALCH




DR. GLEN BASEY TO SPEAK
