# CRISS-CROSSING WITHIN OUR CULTURE

I am so fortunate to be a pastor. Every day I get to do what I really want to do...serve God without having to pump gas or sell shoes to pay the bills. Because of my vocation I daily have opportunity to mingle with citizens of our community and engage in potent conversations.

So very often I urge (harangue?) you to develop such connections with the unchurched. Yet when I reflect on your busy schedule I realize that many of our people have little discretionary time. You slave away all week, take a breather on Saturday (if possible) and still manage to head to Second and B on Sunday. This is why I'm encouraging you to consider *BuddyTime*. Every week Buddys gather with a few other folk with the intent of *making our* world a better place. Here is the gist of it all.

CAMARADERIE...Spend a few minutes catching up on what is going on in each other's lives. It's all about cultivating genuine friendships. The group consists of 3-6 or so people. CHARACTER CONVERSATIONS... Your group of Buddys will read and discuss an article about character issues we all face.

COMPASSIONATE ACTION... Finally, you'll lay out plans for touch-

ing individuals or families with compassionate service. There is even potential for some or all of your group to participate in PERU RENDEZ-VOUS...an annual work trip to Trujillo, Peru. The first trip is scheduled for Spring of 2009. Later this month I'll be meeting with a dozen churches in Phoenix, Arizona, to present and launch **BuddyTime**. Their pastors are eager to get on board. They, too, long to see their members engage Christians and others in meaningful and loving relationships that lead to making our world a better place. Here are some reasons I believe in **BuddyTime**:

- ➤ It gets us out into the world as Jesus commanded. It is 'Good Neighbor' behavior.
- ➤ This is for men, women and older children.
- ➤ It is an opportunity to get in the harness with co-workers, neighbors, family members and others for personal growth, fellowship and compassionate labor.
- ➤ It taps into the nobility that resides in most people...the desire to help bring positive to change to the lives of others.
- ➤ It provides a setting for genuine conversations, real friendships and working together.

- ➤ Meet with whoever, wherever and whenever the group decides.
- ➤ It's more than more talka, talka, talka.
- ➤ You don't need to be a Bible scholar to participate. Just be real!

Have you even wondered when you'd have the chance to move beyond theorizing and listening to sermons to actually move out into the world to do some lasting good? As a preacher who has delivered thousands of messages I'm especially thrilled to lead a ministry that helps our folk be witnesses in our Jerusalem, Judea and beyond. This isn't a Bible study and the meetings probably won't include prayer, but *BuddyTime* springs out of our hours and hours of Bible study and will be bathed in prayer by believers.

On Wednesday, February 27, we'll have an information meeting in Fellowship Hall for anybody interested in being a Buddy to the world. Dessert and beverages will be provided.


