THE MATTER OF MONEY



At a recent pastor's prayer meeting each of my fellow preachers explained how the current spike in everyday expenses is hammering their

congregation. Ours is no exception. Take a look at the chart in the foyer and your eyes will see red. Our budget is sensible, our spending is cautious, but income doesn't match either budget or spending.

I expect that a good part of this is my own doing. I've always prided myself in not haranguing our folk about dollars. Doing a better job of warning our congregation about the coming shortfall might have helped avert this crisis. These are tough days for individuals so it stands to reason that these are also tough days as a group of individuals. I have some suggestions for your consideration. Try these on for size, please.

PRAY. We should *always* start here. God is our provider. Let's ask him for assistance...as a congregation and as individuals and families. Sometimes God will answer our prayers by speaking to us. Just writing this puts a bur-

den on my heart to seek God's provision...beginning with me.

CONSISTENCY. Although I've not known, nor even asked, about anybody's record of giving, I've always had the feeling that if everyone was simply faithful on a week-to-week basis a good bit of stability could be realized in church finances. When we miss a week it is easy to forget that the budget never takes a vacation. Some folk find that offering envelopes help with this. They sit right there staring us in the face, inviting us to keep current even when we need to be absent from the Sunday assembly.

A STEP FORWARD. This year our church increased our weekly Mission giving to 12% of the General Fund. Prior to this we dedicated one out of every ten dollars received to world evangelism. Perhaps a 5% or 10% boost in personal giving would stretch our faith...and give our ailing balance a needed hand. Salary increases had been put on hold for a few years but were included in this year's budget. That too put a strain on an already stretched church check book.

PRAY. Oh, we need plenty of this!]

THE LONG VIEW. Maybe you know

that a family gave the church a large financial gift many years ago. We don't actually manage the money, but receive a quarterly check. The Wilson Estate funds aren't used for general fund needs, but they have been wonderfully useful for special projects. When Everett McGee passed away our church received a gift of over \$209,000. Again, we only have use of the interest from this account which we receive monthly. The income is split 65% goes to Missions, 10% to Benevolence and the remaining 25% is added to our general fund. God bless those dear saints who had the forethought and faithfulness to make certain they would not stop giving to Kingdom work when they departed from the earth. The Wilsons and McGees are still impacting our church and world evangelism! May their tribe increase! Although we are not praying for any of our number to graduate to Glory in the immediate future, what a great example these folk have left us...the example of planning for their 'after' life. We are encouraged to give 10% of our earnings to Kingdom work...why not make plans to put 10% of our estate to work for God when we are gone?

So there. You are paying wildly rising prices for gasoline and everything related to oil. Grocery costs are higher every time you head to the store. And now we inform you of a treasurers pen that balks at writing with black ink! Will you join me in facing this as a spiritual challenge? Lord, help me to be more like Joshua and Caleb than the other ten guys who spied out Canaan! Help me to see the big challenge ahead...but also have confidence that 'if God is for us, who can be against us'.

We've dug in our heels before. We've found power in praying together. Let's do it again, friends!
