'Being' the Church vs 'Going to' Church

Some years ago I was out of the ministry for a time. For a season I worked as a river guide in Washington and Alaska. Taking guests to the haunts of Brown Bears, Bald Eagles and Trumpeter Swans was a childhood dream come true. Every day was great... but Sunday. I found church disconcerting. Actually services went about the same as the ones I had conducted for 30 years. And that's what troubled me. I'd never had this view from the pew. The preacher usually had a good sermon and the music was consistently uplifting. But it was mostly a spectator event. I decided right there (if God ever allowed me to preach again) to make the Sunday assembly a time of participation. Evangelicals have talked a good talk about how we have abandoned the clergy/laity system... but it was in full force.

These days I want every Sunday to be a time of involvement. You recently saw that in an even bigger way when Juanita Hernandez and her crew led the service. There is more of that on the horizon. I think Jesus must like it. While a pastor may have more religious training than some in the congregation, there are plenty of folk with great experience, wisdom, skills and a passion for God. I'd like to see that all unleashed.

The Rogue Valley has a good supply of polished speakers. And I admire that in a preacher. But we have an op-

portunity to experience 'being' the church instead of 'going to' church. This doesn't mean there's no place for leaders and coordinators, elders and a pastor. But those roles ought to open doors for the congregation, not close them. Part of my slowness in this matter has been simple laziness. It is easier to find an order of service that works and just work it. Sermon preparation is already a collaborative effort. I write it. David Bruce puts it in PowerPoint format and adds his magic. Brad works on it too. Karen adds appropriate songs. David Lockwood runs the computer on Sunday. Jim Farmer is the living concordance. I tell people that the sermon is actually preached by the whole congregation, since everyone is invited to contribute, come Sunday.

These days I want every Sunday to be a time of involvement.

But what I'm really committed to these days is having Sunday gatherings where there is more give and take...testimonies, stories of faith,

There is a wonderful palette of fabrics just waiting to be put together, much like in a puzzle. It's great to take squares of fabric and spread them out on tables to see if we can create some sort of design. We pin them together and sew them into "blocks". Then all the blocks are sewn together, put with batting (filling) and a backing into a frame. We "tie" the quilt with cotton crochet thread.

The Piece Corps could be for you! We create laprobes, baby quilts and full size quilts. The quilts are given as gifts when there is a new baby born to a church member, there is a wedding of a church member, or when there is a need.

Each year we create one special quilt for a drawing towards the end of the year. The funds raised help to buy supplies for the next year's quilt(s). Soon we will be looking at patterns and fabric for our next quilt.





A friend recently told of getting the giving statement from his church in January. He was shocked to find that he had given about \$1800 last year,

compared to the \$2700 he had guessed had been given. When he looked more closely it dawned on him that he had given \$50 each week every single Sunday he was in church. But, he recalled, he had not given when he was not present. Work and vacation had resulted in enough absences that the final tally was more than 25% less than he'd have thought.

In most any church, including ours, that kind of behavior would have a large impact. Or in a positive sense, consistent giving by everyone (whether present or not) has the power to keep a church financially healthy.

Philippine College of Ministry, located in Baguio City in the Cordillera Autonomous Region of Luzon, is a four year college founded in 1992 for the pur-

pose of educating church leaders for the newly planted Churches of Christ among the mountain peoples of northern Luzon. The Churches of Christ are the offspring of missionaries of the **Restoration Movement** inspired by such New Testament thinkers as Alexander and Thomas Campbell and Barton W. Stone.

The mission of *Philippine College of Ministry* is to prepare Christians for full-time Christian ministry of teaching and preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and oversight of the church's ministry as well as in vocations associated with the Church (Christian schools, children's homes and hospitals). PCM also offers opportunities to study Christian faith and ethics to those expecting to follow other professions.

Students at *Philippine College of Ministry* are exposed to a balanced program of study, worship and practical experience. In addition to course work, students are required to attend chapel and are given opportunity to sharpen their skills by serving in preaching, teaching and music ministries in local churches in and around Baguio. Many journey to villages on weekends to serve in recently planted churches.

Gene and Janice Stringer will be traveling to PCM with some friends, Tom and Roberta Fort, who first introduced them to the college during Winema Week of Missions in 2005. The plan was to travel together to PCM in the spring of 2006 but that plan fell through and ended up being delayed until March 2007.

In the meantime it was learned that PCM was looking for someone to teach a physical science course for their students in order to qualify their degree programs for full accreditation. Dean James Huckaba learned of Gene's background in teaching and invited him to become an adjunct faculty member at PCM specifically to develop and teach the needed course. The first edition of the course is now scheduled to commence on March 19, 2007 with 32 students. It is an intensive course running 6-8 hours a day for four days. If all goes as planned this will become a regular offering of the college alternating with the life science course every other year in March.

The week of intensive course work at PCM ends with commencement on Saturday March 25, where Gene has agreed to deliver the commencement address. After that a few days will be spent visiting the rice terraces north of Baguio and some of the mountain people of central Luzon. The trip will also provide opportunity to revisit some of the friends and familiar places around metro Manila where Stringers lived around 20 years ago while teaching at the University of the Philippines.
