WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT EASTER?

A few years ago a few preachers were chatting and somebody asked if we'd all seen the (then) new movie, The Passion of the Christ. One guy blurted out that he didn't plan to view the Mel Gibson production because 'Easter has little to do with my faith'. Stunned, I listened to him blab on about why the resurrection wasn't a core teaching of his church. I didn't know whether to cry or execute a 'citizen's arrest' on the guy.

Let's make it perfectly clear Christianity is built on the mind-boggling events of a particular week-end we call Easter. On a certain Friday Jesus Christ was impaled on a wooden cross...amazingly, with his full permission. Did the angels hold their breath all Saturday? On Sunday an empty tomb became a megaphone in God's hand to declare a resounding "Yes" to Job's pressing question: 'If a man dies will he live again'?

My faith is all about Easter. Paul said if that story is not true we, of all people, are most to be pitied. If the resurrection story <u>is</u> true, then every other narrative pales in comparison.

Perhaps you have a friend or family member who has yet to see the significance of the cross and the empty tomb. Would you let me tell them those stories this Easter, April 8? Josh McDowell writes that one of the main reasons Christians don't share their

faith is this simple reality: they don't feel confident in telling the Jesus Story.

What do you think? Invite your friend (s) to worship with you that day. Offer to drive. Have them over for lunch or make reservations somewhere. Don't let anything keep you from attending and bringing somebody with you to hear this newscast, albeit 2000 years after the fact.

This story is what saves. Paul says the Gospel is what saves us. It is message of blood and guts and damning sin. Try to tell the story without ripped flesh and the suffocating work of the cross...well you won't have the gospel. It is a tale of love beyond any other love humanity has ever

known. We are more likely to send chocolates or a bouquet of wild flowers. God sends his son and has him brutalized. There is nothing pretty about it except the abundance of love which brought it all about. But it is this amazing display of love that gets us looking inside ourselves, isn't it? After a harsh assessment of self and the price tag God puts on us at Calvary ("I love you *this* much") I have to drop to my knees in gratitude or shrug it all off and live another day devoted to self.

Salvation will have little appeal to us unless we know we are hell-bound without God's forgiveness extended to us at the cross. It's all part of the story that must be told. I'll be most happy to do the telling.

Here's something else you can do. Bring a card to church with you on April 1, Palm Sunday. Include on the card the names and addresses of folk we can invite to Easter worship. I'll write a letter telling about the Flowering Cross, special music and an interesting message. No pressure...just a bit of nudging.

So...let's not forget Paul's comments about glorying in the cross...or Jesus' talk of being lifted up and drawing all people to him. This is it. I'm a great sinner and Jesus is a great savior. The cross is God's solution to my heart's pollution. It's a dreary tale unless you include the main pieces of the puzzle: a willing sacrifice and a grave that wouldn't take 'no' for an answer.

THE PAYOFF

A question that is always in the back of our minds when we attempt to do something for the Lord is does it make a difference. It nags at the mind of the pastor on a Monday morning. The Sunday school class teacher feels the same uncertainty. Go down the list of all who serve and you will find that at least now and then the same question comes up.

When we ask ourselves that question of course we really mean, did it make a difference for the people who we are trying to reach with the gospel. Are they any closer to God now than they were before the sermon, the SS class, the midweek Bible study or prayer we just said for them?

That is why we try to do a questionnaire at the end of each Alpha course. It is a simple thing with places for the respondent to give feedback on their experience. I particularly like questions 9 and 10. After asking the respondent to comment on their relationship with God prior to Alpha question 9 asks, "How would you describe yourself now in terms of the Christian faith?"

Here are some responses from a recent Alpha course. "More in touch." "Learning." "...the roles of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit better defined in my mind." "New and improved relationship with God."

Question 10 goes on to ask, "In what ways, if any, did you benefit from the Alpha Course?" Here are some responses to this question. "Meeting people and different ideas." "Enjoyed open discussions and new ideas." "A greater appreciation for the writings in the New Testament, an awareness of the significance of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit..." "Healing and miracles."

Alpha participants filled two tables at the November potluck. Many attended services with us for the first time. The warm welcome was much appreciated.

Alpha is one way to help us carry out the Great Commission. It is an easy way to do it. The next course starts with the invitation dinner at **6:00 p.m.** on **Wednesday April 18, 2007**. Consider inviting a friend to meet our Savior at Alpha. It makes a difference.
