I am still trying to get my mind around the immensity of this global ministry, friends. David Bruce has had 2 billion hits on his www.HollywoodJesus.com website. There he does a spiritual 'take' on current movies. Just recently he has made the bold move of putting our Sunday sermons there on HJ. You'll also see videos of our conversations from Church at Louie's Bar and Grill. Frankly, I am stunned by these developments. It means that the PowerPoint sermon you and I experience together on Sunday morning is cyber-cast all over the planet, sometimes before it is presented at our church in Ashland.

What it comes down to is this: You are part of a 'congregation' of countless people from every con-

tinent. On Sundays you see a presentation that is more than trendy. It is ahead of the game. Now David has plans (again including our congregation) which will impact the world even more.

I know this means that we don't 'do church' as we have for decades and decades. I want to share a bit of my heart with you. For years I've wondered what impact my sermons were really having. I had a difficult time remembering what my own sermons were about even a week or so after they were preached. I couldn't expect more than that of you. Unlike more skilled preachers, I hadn't written books that would be kept around for future reference. When a sermon went out through my lips that was that. Certainly the Holy Spirit worked through my preaching. The Word of God bore a harvest. But the harvest was limited. Limited to those who were present on the particular Sunday who came with 'ears to hear'.

These days I prepare sermons with a variety of people in mind. My first audience is you. But another audience is standing right behind you. Some of these are pastors and youth pastors who download and use our sermons every week. Still others are folk who tap into HollywoodJesus.com looking for David's latest movie review. Out of curiosity or out of need they check out the Spiritual aspect of a particular movie. Low and behold! There is a spiritual message which begins with a synopsis of the movie (written by David), followed by my sermon presentation you saw one Sunday right here in Ashland, Oregon. A few years back we'd have stood in disbelief if told that one day our church would be impacting the world this way. If you are not one to use the internet this may not seem very impressive. We live in a world where essentially every young person with access to a computer is surfing the web. When they discover a site as inviting, open, professional and spiritual as HollywoodJesus.com or www.OutSideTheWalls.com they return to it over and over. I'm happy to report that the response is overwhelming.


