When asked to give names of folk we helped get into the Kingdom we may cry out for a place to bury our head. But don't do that. Instead just decide to go to the river and get started.

If you are interesting in learning some fishing skills I'd be most happy to meet with you to make a plan, get geared up and make a few casts. This is no mere hobby or a job for those professionals. Fishing is every believer's business... our main business. It's time to get our feet wet, dear friend.


Remember to bring hot dishes already cooked! The ovens are set to just keep food hot.


