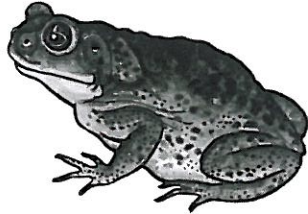

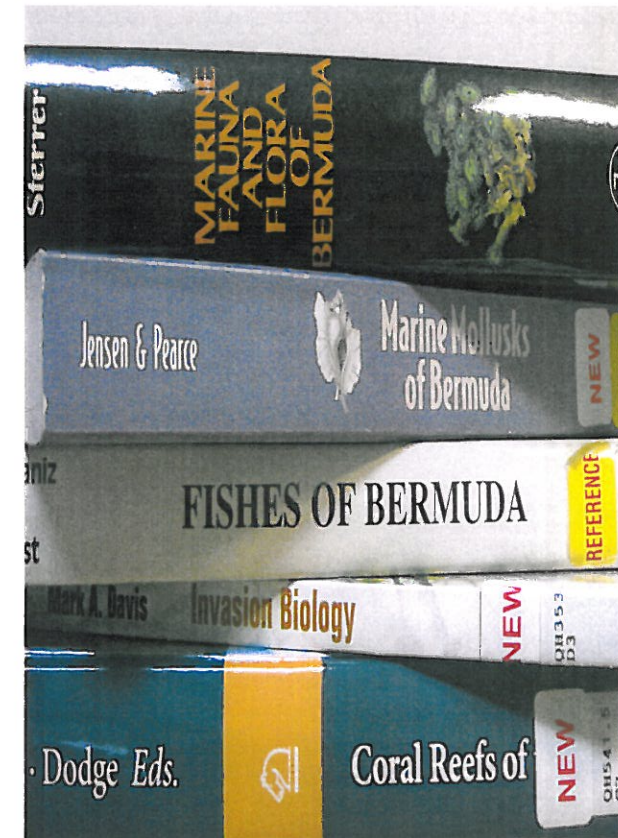

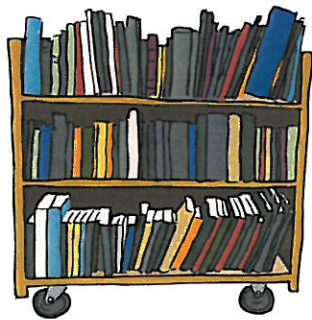

LIBRARY OVERVIEW

The library at BAMZ is a resource for you! Our library resources provide support materials which can be used by school children, teachers, parents, students, visiting researchers as well as our own staff. The library at



BAMZ is housed upstairs in the Natural History Museum. The library's core collection focuses

on **Bermuda's terrestrial and marine natural history**. Our collection also encompasses **zoo animal husbandry** and **island ecology**, as well as some of the broader environmental issues affecting our world. Subjects such as **biodiversity, global warming, invasive/native/endemic species and sustainable development** are all areas of interest, and we have been building a resource of relevant materials on these subjects with a particular focus on Bermuda.

BERMUDA PUBLICATIONS

Our Bermuda-based resources continue to increase and are a gold-mine of information. Heavily used publications include —

BIBLIOGRAPHY

The Bermuda Natural History Bibliography forms part of the Bermuda Biodiversity Project Database. The bibliography is a fully searchable computerized database containing nearly 5000 references. All of these references are historically or scientifically relevant to Bermuda and most are available as hard and electronic copies from the library. This database will be available in the near future on the BAMZ website at www.bamz.org.
