- C. The Text (3-11)
  - a. "And hereby we do know that we know him if we keep his commandments" (3) [Know God = Keep Commandments].
  - b. "He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him" (4) [Know God = Keep Commandments = Know Truth].
  - c. "But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him" (5) [Keep Word = Dwell in Love = Know God].
  - d. "He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked" (6) [Abide in Light = Walk as He Walked].
  - e. "Brethren, I write no new commandment unto you, but an old commandment which ye had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which ye have heard from the beginning" (7) [Commandment = Word].

- f. "Again, a new commandment I write unto you, which thing is true in him and in you: because the darkness is past, and the true light now shineth"(8) [Keep Commandment = Know Truth = Abide in Light].
- g. "He that saith he is in the light, and hateth his brother, is in darkness even until now" (9) Abide in Light = Dwell in Love].
- h. "He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him" (10) [Dwell in Love = Abide in Light = Walk as He Walked].
- i. "But he that hateth his brother is in darkness, and walketh in darkness, and knoweth not whither he goeth, because that darkness hath blinded his eyes" (11) [Dwell in Love = Abide in Light = Walk as He Walked = Know God = Know Truth = Keep Commandments].

        - 1. "Whosoever denieth the Son"
        - 2. "the same hath not the Father"

    - a. "(but) he that acknowledgeth the Son"

  - D. The Spirit (20, 27)
    - a. The Anointing
      - i. "But ye have an unction"
      - ii. "But the anointing"
    - b. The Administrator
      - i. "from the Holy One"
      - ii. "which ye have received of him"
    - c. The Advantage
      - i. "ye know all things"
      - ii. "ye need not that any man teach you"
      - iii. "the same anointing teacheth you"
        - 1. "of all things"
        - 2. "and is truth"
        - 3. "and is no lie"
      - iv. "even as it hath taught you"
    - d. The Abiding

- i. The anointing "abideth in you"
