RESIDENT MAIL:

Statement of the Issue

MJDA recognizes a resident's need for and right to send and receive mail consistent with the preservation of safety and security.

Nature of the Issue

- 1. Residents should be able to maintain correspondence with families and community.
- 2. Residents have the right to certain confidential correspondence.
- 3. Resident's mail may be limited as unrestricted correspondence jeopardizes safety and security.
- 4. Residents have the right to court and/or facility due process when correspondence is restricted.
- 5. In order to preserve the effectiveness of correspondence, mail is processed in a timely manner.

Position Statement

It is the position of MJDA that correspondence is an important part of a resident's life. Facilities should establish and follow policies and procedures that allow for correspondence to be processed in a timely manner and to be unrestricted unless the correspondence places persons at risk. Whenever mail is restricted, the facility shall ensure due process.
