Remembering Richard (Dick) Franklin Adkinson

On July 25, Brother Dick Adkinson, went home to be with the Lord. Brother Dick was 83 years old. For 63 years, he faithfully served as a preacher of the Gospel. For the last six years, until his passing, Brother Dick was the pastor of Lights Chapel Baptist Church. During his tenure the church grew in number and strength. For example, in 2009, the church had 19 additions, 9 by baptism. These additions came during a difficult time when he was loosing his eyesight. The next year the church had 14 additions. These additions came during a difficult time when, in addition to his worsening eyesight, his wife Marilyn was fighting cancer. About 17 month ago, after 60 years of marriage, Brother Dick lost Mrs. Marilyn.

Lights Chapel deserves high praise for how well the church took care of its pastor. After Mrs. Marilyn's homecoming, the church, continued to take meals to the house, take care of Brother Dick, providing transportation wherever he needed to go, doctor, hospital, visiting people in homes and hospitals. Whatever he needed they provided. I personally saw members carrying him food and when he was too weak to eat or take care of himself, the church fed him and did the most humble tasks without a negative word or sign of fatigue. Every time I have commended them for the wonderful, faithful way they have ministered to their pastor, their response has always been something like, "We could not do anything different; He showed us how to love." What a legacy!

What can a minister do that helps teach others how to love others, as God has loved us? Recently, I saw a minister who met Brother Dick over 35 years ago. The minister said, "You have lost the greatest minister I have known."

What helped make Brother Dick an effective servant of God?

- 1) He gave himself to Jesus. First, he put his faith in Jesus, as his personal Savior. Second, he followed Jesus' call for him to be a minister of the Gospel.
- 2) He remained faithfully committed to God's call on his life.
- 3) He was a lifelong learner. He continued to study God's word. At the funeral home, Sidney (Sid) his 85-year-old brother said, "I can no longer call Dick to explain the Greek and Hebrew to me. I am going to have to find someone else." "Wow!" What a testimony to Brother Dick's lifelong commitment to learning.
- 4) He truly cared about people. He really cared about the church. He truly cared more about others than he cared about himself.
- 5) He had a vision for the work of the church and how the church is to respond to others.
- 6) He was trustworthy. You could trust what he taught. You could trust his example. You could trust him.
- 7) He was positive. He was an encourager. Despite loosing four sons, he and Mrs. Marilyn continued to be positive. Despite loosing Mrs. Marilyn, Brother Dick remained a positive encourager to others. His life and example teaches the rest of us how to live by God's expectations.

May his tribe increase!




