involved in: Wittunga Botanic Gardens Master Plan; the Blackwood Road Management Review; upgrading of the Blackwood streetscapes, Blackwood and Coromandel railway station gardens; plans for Waite Street Reserve upgrade; and many other initiatives.

"It was indeed an honour and a most gratifying feeling to be awarded the Mitcham Council's Award for excellence in community service during the Australia Day ceremony at Carrick Hill," comments Geoff Bartlett, BAG secretary. "The Award really acknowledges individual efforts by many local Hills' residents who have a great passion for the district."

While Onkaparinga Council recognised the 'Coro Alive! 175' Coordinating Committee by presenting it with the 'Community Event of the Year Award'.

Over 70 events were held from January to November last year by 18 organising groups from the community. These ranged from concerts to historical discovery sessions, guided walks, orchard open days, bus tours, exhibitions, celebratory church services, picnics and a community festival.

"There was also significant support from the cities of Onkaparinga and Mitcham. The award really is to the people of Coromandel Valley and close neighbours that organised and participated in the celebrations," said Trevor Conlon, CoroAlive! 175 President

Friends of Shepherds Hill Recreation Park received an Excellence in Environmental Achievement from Mitcham Council for its work in Shepherds Hill Recreation Park. The group's dedicated volunteers work hard to advance the environmental rehabilitation of the Park in particular the Grey Box grassy woodlands. Blackwood resident, the eminent botanist Enid Robertson AO is the Patron.

Alan Dandi, Secretary for the group said they were really chuffed with the award. "We practice minimal disturbance bushcare techniques to minimise the risk of new weed invasions in areas we've cleared of weeds," he said, and added new volunteers were always welcome.

An Australia Day Commendation was presented to Hawthorndene resident of 40 years, Brian Langsford for his contribution to Scouts and the Red Cross Blood Service over the last 35 years.

He is the District Commissionaire for Scouts SA and has organised eight national jamborees.

It's on ... campaign begins

As Federal election announced for September 14 - six months out

PRIME Minister Julia Gillard received a warm welcome at the first Community Cabinet meeting held last month at The Hub Recreation Centre (Aberfoyle Park High School), despite the vocal protesters against live animal exports outside.

Community Cabinet meetings are part of the Prime Minister's commitment to provide opportunities for people to bring their concerns directly to the government, and they also give the government first hand access to community perceptions and expectations.

With the general election happening on September 14 this year, some may see it was a political move to hold the first meeting in Boothby.

The Boothby electorate represents 'middle Australia' and the outer suburbs of this electorate include Springfield, Crafers West, Blackwood, Happy Valley, Marion and Oaklands Park.

It is held by the Liberals' Andrew Southcott and is the most marginal seat in the country by just 0.3 per cent, following a redistribution last year.

After welcoming the people to the land, Aunty Josie, a Kaurna Elder lightened the mood by advising people to ask the questions but to 'make sure you get the right answers.'

There were also a few jocular moments between attending ministers with Mark Butler MP highlighting he'd been to the same school as the Prime Minister - but a few years later!

Flanked by Senator Penny Wong and Hon Kate Ellis, Ms Gillard shared some of her personal life growing up in South Australia, and how her parents had focused on opportunity and education to give the family a better chance.

She also spoke of what the Government had achieved since it had been in power, highlighting the National Broadband Network, the focus on clean energy, hospital care and the money being spent on infrastructure in SA.

Somewhat reminiscent of a first day at school, the eleven ministers present then explained what they'd done that day in South Australia, and then questions were welcomed from the floor.

The 300-plus audience was made up of people of all ages, and all backgrounds. Concerns raised from the floor were primarily social issues.

The Prime Minister fielded questions ranging from the issues of single parents shifting onto the 'Newstart' allowance, the low pay for childcare workers, mental health funding to a query about the problem of youth violence.

Questions were also asked about climate change, food labelling and world poverty, but it was the asylum seeker and refugee issue which attracted a larger number of questions, including two secondary school students grilling the Prime Minister on this

The Prime Minister and relevant ministers answered the questions politely and eloquently, but didn't reveal anything new.

Ms Gillard responded to one query about refugees by highlighting the Government was lifting the refugee intake to 20,000, and was focused on deterring asylum seekers from taking the dangerous journey to Australia by boat.

She admitted youth violence was a difficult issue, but stressed work had gone into programs which focused on helping youth have good role models and encouraged team work.



Not much longer to hold on

THE long awaited upgrade to Blackwood's public toilets located near busy shopping precincts at the top end of Shepherds Hill Road is programmed to start towards the end of March; subject to the development application being approved.

Plans for the toilets include a unisex accessible toilet facility for people with disabilities, baby change facilities, hand dryers, separate female toilets with two pans and separate male toilets with two pans and urinal. The toilets will have new tiles on the floors and walls, new partitions and doors, new toilet pans, hand basins, skylights and upgraded security lighting.

Mitcham Council initially approved \$50,000 to refurbish the toilets last year and this was increased to \$74,000 at the Full Council meeting held on 22 May 2012. Work hasn't started until now as it was dependent on Council adopting the 2012/2013 budget.

"During the upgrade temporary toilets will be provided including a disabled toilet," confirmed a Council spokesman.

"On Easter Sunday we seek to do something all together different as we try to come to terms with the surprise and wonder of the resurrection," added Jason.


"It certainly is a contrast to emerge on Easter Sunday with a new found hope in the miracle of Easter. We love it when people join us in that

Coalition proposes environmental group action plan for Australian youth

Wanted: Green Army projects

A 'Green Army' of young Australians will take on environmental projects to clean up our community under the Federal Coalition's Environment Plan.

At the Belair CFS Station on Sheoak Road last month; Greg Hunt, the Coalition's Shadow Minister for Climate Action, Environment & Heritage; Andrew Southcott, Federal Member for Boothby; together with Dale Thompson, CFS Sturt Group officer announced the 'green' plan.

"We are tackling environmental issues head on with a 15,000 strong Green Army which will enable teams to operate in nearly every community across the country," said Mr Hunt.

The Green Army will be comprised of teams of up to 10 people including a co-ordinator to tackle local environmental projects. Participants will receive a training wage and supervision.

Each project may take up to 25 weeks to complete.

"We are asking the community to submit ideas for worthwhile projects," said Boothby MP, Andrew Southcott. "It may be cleaning up a local creek, restoring a bushwalking path, rejuvenating sand dunes or reducing flammable undergrowth like feral olives in at-risk bushfire areas," he added.

Sturt Group CFS officer, Dale Thompson was supportive of the plan, commenting that, "this is an ideal opportunity to reduce some of the bushfire risk in the Adelaide Hills by removing feral and flammable vegetation.

"The 'Green Army' working in conjunction with locals Council could have a significant impact in reducing the impact of a bushfire."

Andrew agreed saying, "We are keen for local environment groups or councils to be involved. They may work together with the Green Army to get the job done or they may act as co-ordinators for projects which they see as a priority for our area.

"Areas such as Brownhill Creek, Sturt River, Belair National Park, and the coastline could be possible options for a Green Army scheme."

Challenge to sort out Coromandel Valley history

THE highly successful calendar of community events organised to celebrate the discovery of Coromandel Valley 175 years ago, finished in November last year.

These events promoted community spirit and activity that will no doubt continue in the minds of those who participated for many years to come.

However, a legacy of the activities is a large amount of verbal and written records and recorded interviews now in the possession of the Coromandel Valley and Districts National Trust Branch.

This is great news for the community but leaves an interesting but challenging task to collate and make available the information gathered.

The destiny of this information is to become part of the formal records system known as Collections MOSAIC, a data base for historical collections, being introduced throughout National Trust of SA branches.

Over the last two years many hours have been put in to transferring previous records from the old systems. This work has largely been achieved, and is being continued by Ashley Phillips and Maxine Conlon.

Ashley and Maxine, together with David Wyatt constitute a working group from the Branch Committee focussing on the processing of information in hand in preparation for addition to the formal records. (This includes the "new" information collected throughout 2012.)

There is a need for volunteers to help sort or prepare written documents as electronic files, as well as transcribe audio files to text.

To assist in this task the Branch is seeking a control pedal and software intended for use with a computer, or to borrow (or have donated) a foot pedal transcription machine.

BELAIR resident Nick Wilkey presented Council with a new and exciting vision of an edible garden trail throughout the City of Mitcham recently in an attempt to reignite Council interest in community gardens.

As reported in this paper last month, council withdrew support for a community garden at the end of last year citing financial reasons; the council is already in deficit by \$1.5 million.

The deputation, 'Community Gardens: a Sustainable Way Forward' proposes maintenance of several sites in the City of Mitcham

through community and business sponsorship.

"It focuses on community business support through the development of co-partnerships and has a strong core value of inclusion of all groups, such as minority and cultural, to encourage community involvement from all sectors," said Nick.

He added a number of local businesses had already offered their generous support to the project through allocation of funds or through the supply of products, including plants and equipment hire, as well as labour and knowledge.

This community gardens' model is based on ones in Adelaide's sister cities of Austin, Texas and Auckland, New Zealand.

Sites currently being considered for the project include the Blackwood Hill Reserve, Carrick Hill, and Flinders University. Nick hoped every councillor would embrace the vision, the sustainability aspects and community benefits.

Several experts were already on board and once a group has been formalised, Nick is keen to hold a public forum and to work with interested groups, organisations, businesses and the Council to move the vision forward.

In order for the new project to move forward, the current motion would need to be rescinded and supported by a majority of Mitcham councillors.

Help kids avoid obesity

by Caron Milham, Consultant dietitian and author

MORE than 50% of Australian adults and more than 25% of primary school children are either overweight or obese. Being overweight as a child increases the likelihood you will become overweight as an adult and if coupled with bad eating habits, this can be a death sentence.

Eating a diet high in fat (especially saturated fat), sugar and kilojoules, coupled with little exercise can increase not only the risk of becoming overweight but also can increase the risk of diabetes, heart disease and some cancers. Eating an unhealthy diet and/or being overweight can also have many short term consequences such as reduced concentration, energy and performance in school and sport.

Our eating habits as adults are affected by many factors. From early on, our eating environment and early education around food and exercise behaviours strongly influences our eating and exercise habits and taste and food preferences as adults. It is very important therefore to educate our children and ourselves as early as



From early on, focus on exposing children to the many and varied tastes and textures of healthy foods. Take them shopping and let them 'help'.

Involve them in cooking with simple things to begin with to appreciate all

aspects of food like pita pizza using vegies, lean ham and cheese. (You can even make a face), wholemeal pancakes, popcorn, fruit jelly, yoghurt and banana-yoghurt smoothy.

Let them have their own vegetable patch (or even a pot with tiny tomatoes). We are more likely to eat our own produce and it tastes better

Educate them on the immediate positive aspects of eating healthy by explaining they will feel better, have more energy and confidence, jump higher and run faster rather than talk about

Do not limit altogether, fast food, high fat food or sugar snacks like chocolate, cakes, chips or

Call them 'sometimes' foods – otherwise they may binge when they're out of sight or when they get older and can buy their own. Tell them when and how much they can have.

Make available at home, a tasty variety of nutritious food choices and make less available foods high in kilojoules, fats and sugars like convenience snack foods.

Make water their primary fluid. Limit milk and juice and only have cordials and soft drinks occasionally, if
