Although she skipped the photo booth which projected black and white snap shots on an adjacent wall, Ms. Stewart ate dinner among artists and notable names such as Ciara, Anne Hathaway and Sarah Jessica Parker.

"I love this museum. I have a routine. I get off the plane in London, and I drop my suitcase at the hotel, and I go immediately to the Tate. It started years and years ago, and I can't explain it. It's inexplicable. Why do we love a boy? Why do we love a book? Why do I love the Tate? I don't know. It's just a wonderful, exciting place to see old works and new works and I've always had this great affection for it," Ms. Parker, an Honorary Chair, told Guest of a Guest in an exclusive interview.

"I think it's amazing, and everyone I know that steps into that museum is always thrilled by what they see - young and old."

Tate Americas Foundation is an independent charity which raises support for Tate. The live auction on Thursday evening raised more than \$500,000, and the overall event pulled in more than \$2 million, which will be used to acquire art. Since 1999, more than \$100 million of art and cash has been donated.

"The auction went amazing. I'm really happily surprised," said Co-Chair Christen Wilson. "I think the most important thing is the people that showed up. Everyone from Zurich to Tokyo - from all over the world."

In addition to artists, such as Ernesto Neto, faces of fashion "showed up" to celebrate as well.

"What's not to love about art? It's like insulin," Women's Creative Director for Calvin Klein Francisco Costa told Guest of a Guest. "It's like blood. It keeps you awake."
