- 3. Please sign the Rental, Release & Indemnity, and Hold Harmless Agreement.
- **4.** Every Unit / Group must have someone with **First Aid and CPR, and Adult Leader Training**. Indicate name and expiration date on form. <u>Be prepared to show proof of current certification upon arrival.</u>
- **5.** If the Unit / Group will be doing **Aquatic Activities**, please indicate name and expiration date of certification in the appropriate area. *Be prepared to show proof of current certification upon arrival.*
- **6.** If the Unit / Group will be doing **Shooting sports**, please indicate name and expiration date of certification in the appropriate area. *Be prepared to show proof of current certification upon arrival*.
- **7.** If the Unit / Group will be doing **Climbing / C.O.P.E.**, please indicate name and expiration date of certification in the appropriate area. <u>Be prepared to show proof of current certification upon arrival.</u>
- **8.** Non BSA groups may use Camp Bob Hardin as long as they follow BSA guidelines and policies as set by the Palmetto Council BSA and Camp Bob Hardin. Equivalent certifications may be accepted.
- **9.** A \$100.00 security deposit check will be sent with the Reservation / Usage Permit. A separate check for balance of fees due upon arrival. Deposit check will be returned after campsite inspection prior to departure.

CAMP BOB HARDIN - GENERAL RULES

- 1. The Scout Oath and Scout Law are the primary rules of Camp Bob Hardin.
- 2. A responsible adult who is at least 21 years old must accompany the group at all times.
- 3. Only those facilities requested and approved on the permit are to be used by the requesting organization or Scouting Unit.
- 4. **Trash:** All trash or refuse is the responsibility of the organization or Scout unit. The camp does not usually have trash pick-up. You must carry out all trash and refuse with you. If this is not possible, please consult with the Ranger in advance of your activity date for alternate arrangements that may impose an additional charge.
- 5. **Camping:** All camping is to be done in campsite areas or the activity field or other area designated by the Ranger. No trenching of tents.
- 6. **Leave No Trace** principles are to be followed. No cutting of any live trees without prior approval from the Ranger.
- 7. If you dig a hole for any purpose, return the area back to the way you found it. Check with the Ranger before digging any holes because of underground cables, pipes, and tubing that carry vital services.
- 8. **Fires:** All fires must be attended or dead out. Campfires are to be in established fire pits only.
- 9. No fires may be built within 25 feet of any building or structure. This does not apply to charcoal grills.
- 10. No dish washing at water fountains, water faucets or the sink in the latrines.
- 11. **Fishing:** No fishing from docks located in the Swimming and Boating Areas or in the swimming area itself. Fishing must be under adult supervision (18 years of age for fishing).
- 12. **Swimming/Boating:** Must have a responsible adult (at least age 21 or older) to supervise all swimming and boating activities. This person must be qualified in water safety training with current certification. (BSA Lifeguard, Red Cross Advanced Lifesaving, Water Safety Instructor, YMCA Senior Lifesaver) or must have assistants so qualified. (Copy of current certification must be presented upon check-in). Swimming is to be done only in the approved areas.
 - No diving off the docks. All life saving equipment must be furnished by the unit or organization.
- 13. **No Fireworks:** They are against the law in North Carolina and strictly prohibited on all Council property by action of the Council Executive Board and BSA National Policy.
- 14. **Cleaning of Facilities:** If a building is used, all floors must be swept and/or vacuumed before leaving, any spills mopped, kitchen equipment cleaned/stored, refrigerators cleaned, and no food is to be left. Carry all trash out.
- 15. Please respect our neighbors and remain on camp property.
- 16. No loud music please.
- 17. The use of illegal drugs and alcoholic beverages is strictly prohibited on Boy Scouts of America property.
- 18. No decorations are to be left in any building. If you put it up, you must take it down. No nails.
- 19. Toilet tissue, paper towels, and hand soap will be supplied for bathrooms. (Not for latrines in camping areas).
- 20. Rifle Range/Shotgun Range: Must have a responsible adult (at least age 21 or older) to supervise these shooting sports. The adult must be either NRA or BSA certified in shooting sports for rifles and shotguns. Either NRA Instructor or BSA Shooting Sports certification must be current and a copy of their certificate must be presented upon check-in. No hand guns allowed. The unit organization must supply rifles, shotguns and/or ammunition. Only .22 caliber rifles on the rifle range are permitted. Black powder .50 caliber or .52 caliber are also permitted. The skeet range can handle
 - 12, 20, or 410 shotguns. Cub Scouts are not permitted to shoot rifles or shotguns; only BB guns.
- 21. **COPE:** Prior arrangements must be made to participate in COPE. Only currently certified COPE instructors may open the course. Check with Ranger for availability, current rules, and usage. This area is "OFF LIMITS" unless prior arrangements have been made.
