**Dear Penny,**  
 I am including two recipes for "Butter Cookies." I would suggest trying both to see which one you like best. The first recipe, which suggests adding jam, is very appropriate for the winter holidays. —  
**Annie**

**BUTTER COOKIES**

- 1/2 cup butter (1 stick)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup flour
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Pinch of salt

Allow the butter to soften to room temperature. Using a large bowl, mix all the other ingredients into the butter. Allow to chill for at least one hour. Pinch off small pieces of the mixture and roll into balls

the size of a large marble. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake in a pre-heated 350-degree oven. If desired, make a depression in each cookie before cooking and fill with your favorite jam. Bake for 10 minutes. Makes about 50 cookies.

**FRENCH BUTTER COOKIES**

- 1 cup flour (sifted)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup butter (softened), no substitutes
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla or 1 tablespoon brandy or rum

In a large bowl, mix the flour, sugar and softened butter together. In a small bowl, mix the egg yolk and vanilla (brandy or rum). Add this

mixture to the large bowl and shape into a ball. Roll into 2 two-inch logs. Chill for two hours. Cut in half lengthwise. Slice into 1/8 inch slices and bake in a pre-heated oven at 350 degrees on an ungreased cookie sheet for 8 minutes. Makes about 30 cookies.

## A man crashes a women's poker tournament

■ **Former dealer gets arrested ten years later**

### Women Object to Man Winning 'Female' Tournament

Women are usually the ones that take exception to being excluded from an event because of their gender. In Atlantic City, however, there was a reversal of fate and it was women that were upset that a male won a ladies poker tournament. The event took place at the Borgata Hotel & Casino and not only did a man enter the field of 260 women, he won the tournament. Abraham Korotki claimed that he was just turning up for a World Poker Tour main event that was being held in Atlantic City in the future. At the time he entered, there was no major reaction from the women players. When he won, however, the mood quickly turned sour with some women in the audience try-

ing to figure out why he entered the tournament. Joe Lupo, Borgata's Senior Vice President, later said that by law, the casino must allow any person over the age of 21 to participate in their tournaments. —*Casino Gaming Web*

### Casino Robbery Suspect Caught in Ghana 10 Years Later

A former AC casino dealer who's been on the lam for 10 years after being charged with armed robberies of five casinos and a bank has been arrested in Ghana. The FBI says it got help from Scotland Yard to track down 32-year-old Edmund Osei in Ghana. He was arrested by Ghanaian police after what officials call a diplomatic process. Osei, who once worked as a poker dealer at the Trump Taj Mahal, is accused of taking \$60,000 from the casino and a bank during a robbery spree in 1999. He disappeared after failing to show up for an ar-

raignment in January 2000. It was unclear when he would be returned to the United States. —*Philly.com*





**Women Object to Man Winning 'Female' Tournament**

The event took place at the Borgata Hotel & Casino and not only did a man enter the field of 260 women, he won the tournament. At the time he entered, there was no major reaction from the women players. When he won, however, the mood quickly turned sour with

some women in the audience trying to figure out why he entered the tournament. Joe Lupo, Borgata's Senior Vice President, later said that by law, the casino must allow any person over the age of 21 to participate in their tournaments. — *Casino Gaming Web*

**Casino Robbery Suspect Caught in Ghana 10 Years Later**

A former AC casino dealer who's been on the lam for 10 years after being charged with armed robberies of five casinos and a bank has been arrested in Ghana. The FBI says it got help from Scotland Yard to track down 32-year-old Edmund Osei in Ghana. He was arrested by Ghanaian police after what officials call a diplomatic process. Osei, who once worked as a poker dealer at the Trump Taj Mahal, is accused of taking \$60,000 from the casino and a bank during a robbery spree in 1999. He disappeared after failing to show up for an arraignment in January 2000. It was unclear when he would be returned to the United States. — *Philly.com*

**Homeless Veterans Need Warm Clothes**

Your mission for the week: Outfit a homeless veteran in warm winter clothing. If you're near a VA hospital, call Volunteer Services and ask what it needs for the clothing closet. As veterans come in off the street for medical services or leave after treatment, staff will help them find the clothing they need from the closet. You don't need to spend a fortune. Charity organizations such as Goodwill and Salvation Army often have great stuff, a lot of it in new condition. You can find jeans for less than \$5, shirts and sweatshirts for a few dollars. Warm winter coats are often at a premium in the clothing closets. No matter the size, someone can use what you donate. (Ask what sizes are especially needed.) Add gloves, hats and mittens. Don't donate used shoes or boots, however, and no used underwear. When veterans leave the hospital

(perhaps after they've been there 4-6 weeks for detox or other treatment programs) for a shelter or halfway house, they're given goodie bags with shampoo, disposable razors, shave cream, handkerchiefs and new socks and underwear. Add a duffle bag to hold all the stuff a veteran takes when he leaves.

If you're a homeless veteran reading this and if you want to come in from the cold, go to a library near you. Chances are they have computers. Check [www1.va.gov/Homeless](http://www1.va.gov/Homeless), which is the Homeless Veterans Program Office. Look on the left side of the screen and click on VA Homeless Coordinators. There's a link to help in all the states. There are all kinds of programs, including medical and dental assessments and referral, shelter assistance, permanent housing and employment assistance.

## HEALTHY NEWS

### Nicotine Addiction

#### ■ A Women's Health Crisis

Cigarette smoking kills more than 173,000 women in the United States each year. In addition to the risks both men and women face from smoking, women are at risk for a unique set of complications, including certain cancers and problems with fertility and pregnancy. In addition, a recent study showed that smoking is even more dangerous to women's hearts than men's. Women who smoke have heart attacks nearly 14 years earlier than women who don't smoke. But for men, smokers have heart attacks about six years earlier than men who don't smoke.

#### Overcoming the Urge People trying to quit can:

- Work with a doctor to set up and stick to a quit plan.
- Ask friends and family to help them stay away from cigarettes and "triggers" that make them want to smoke.
- Take medication to help quit smoking and participate in counseling.

#### It's Never Too Late

At any stage of life, smokers can decrease their health risks by quitting. Examples of the potential impact on a smoker's health from quitting include:

- Within five years, the excess risk of death from coronary heart disease decreases 62 percent; stroke decreases 42 percent, and lung cancer decreases 21 percent.
- Within 10 years of quitting, the risk of dying of respiratory disease decreases by 18 percent.
- Twenty years after quitting smoking, a woman's overall risk of dying may decrease to the level of a nonsmoker.

### Managing Your Medication

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

My 71-year-old mother is having a hard time managing and remembering all the different medications she has to take, and I'm worried she's taking way too many drugs. Any suggestions?

#### OverMedicated

#### Dear Medicated,

The challenges of managing medications can be difficult for many seniors—especially those who take multiple drugs for various health problems. Here are some tips that can help.

#### Drug Review

Nearly half of Americans age 65 and older take five or more prescription drugs, and 12 percent take 10 or more. Unfortunately, the more drugs a person takes, the higher their risk for potential medication problems, and the more likely they are to take something they don't need. If you have questions or concerns about the various medications your mother is taking, gather up all her pill bottles (include all prescription drugs, over-the-counter medications, vitamins, minerals, and herbal supplements) and take them to her primary physician for a drug review. Go through each one together. Once you've agreed on which ones, if any, to change or drop, make a master list of the remaining ones as a reference, and with every change, update it.

#### Get Informed

Most medicine problems can be avoided or solved by communicating with the doctor, so don't be afraid to ask lots of questions. Here are some key points to cover when a new drug is prescribed (you may need to help your mom with this):

- Tell the doctor about all the medicines she's currently taking (bring her drug list

along), include information if she's being treated by another doctor for something else, if she has any allergies or side effects from any particular medicines.

- Be sure you know the name of the newly prescribed medicine and can read the handwriting on the prescription. If you can't read it, the pharmacist may not be able to either. Also ask if there's a lower-cost generic version available.
- Ask about the possible side effects the new medicine can cause, and what should be done if they occur.
- Find out how and when the medicine should be taken, how much to take, and for how long. (Note: not taking medication as directed can cause serious health problems.)
- What foods, drinks, other medicines, dietary supplements or activities should be avoided while taking the medicine?
- What should be done if a dose is missed, or an extra one was inadvertently taken?
- When should the medicine begin working, and what, if any tests are required to monitor her reaction to the treatment?

**Savvy Tips:** If you have any doubts about a prescribed medication, do some research online at sites like [www.drugdigest.org](http://www.drugdigest.org) or [www.medlineplus.gov](http://www.medlineplus.gov), or ask your pharmacist.

It's also a good idea to submit all prescriptions to the same pharmacy or chain. Typically, pharmacy computer systems automatically flag any potential drug interactions.



#### Medication Reminders

Studies estimate that two-thirds of Americans that use medicine fail to take their drugs as prescribed, mainly because they either don't remember, can't afford them or experience unpleasant side effects. If forgetfulness is the problem, here are some tips that may help:

- Keep your medicines in a place you'll notice them like your bedside stand, kitchen counter, etc. Don't keep them in the bathroom medicine cabinet where they're exposed to damaging humidity and heat.
- If you can, take medicines at the same time each day. To help remember, try linking your medicine to something you do regularly like brushing your teeth or eating lunch.
- Use calendars, pillboxes or medication timers (see [www.epill.com](http://www.epill.com)) as reminders, and to keep organized.
- Keep a written schedule or checklist of the pills you take and how often to take them.
- Put reminder notes around the house (on the refrigerator, by the phone, etc.).
- Ask a friend or relative to call and remind you.
- Monitor your disease. Home blood-pressure or blood-sugar testing, for example can help motivate you to take your medication.
- Remember to order refills in time to avoid lapses in treatment.

**Savvy Resource:** The American Society of Consultant Pharmacists offers a free packet of information on medication problems, including a list of dangerous drug interactions. They also offer a national directory of senior care pharmacists that help older patients by managing their medications. 




**Embezzler Forfeits Kansas Lottery Prize**

The good news: Paul W. Lyle recently won the grand prize in a Kansas Lottery second-chance drawing. The bad news: The former radio executive was also charged with embezzling a reported \$87,750 from his employer to feed an out-of-control addiction to scratch-off state lottery tickets. The lottery drawing, billed as "Cruisin' and Cash," featured a grand prize package of a 2009 Cobra 230 boat and trailer, boating accessories, about \$2,000 in cash, and NASCAR racing tickets. Total value: \$96,000. Lyle pleaded guilty to the felony charges. As part of the plea bargain he agreed to turn over his entire lottery winnings to help pay the anticipated restitution to his employer. —*Joplin (Missouri) Globe*

The youngest Powerball winner ever has packed up his millions and moved to Tampa Bay, Florida, fulfilling his dream of working in the wrestling business with a wild new TV show. 

