




Rice Casserole

Dear Ask Annie,
Years ago my Mom made a sausage casserole. I can't find the recipe. I remember there was rice in it. Do you have any ideas so I can relive my youthful meals?

Joan from Boynton Beach, Florida

Dear Joan,
Here's an old southern favorite that a friend served me years ago. Hope this is what you are looking for. —Annie

SOUTHERN SAUSAGE RICE CASSEROLE

- 1 pound sausage
- 2 packages dry chicken noodle soup
- 6 ounces wild rice
- 4 1/2 cups water
- 1 large green pepper chopped
- 2-3 celery stalks, chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon sage
- 1/2 cup sliced or slivered almonds

Small onion, chopped
Salt and pepper, to taste

Using a large skillet, cook the sausage. Drain and set aside. Mix the soup mix, water and rice in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Simmer for 7 to 8 minutes. Using a large casserole dish, combine the rice mixture with the sausage. Add the chopped vegetables and spices. Garnish with the almonds.

Cook uncovered for one hour at 350 degrees.

Dear Annie,
My Aunt Bess use to make a pie with Karo syrup, nuts and chocolate. Do you know what I am talking about? Aunt Bess was from Kentucky and she said the pie was popular in her hometown.

Little Bess from New York

Dear Bess,
Your Aunt was probably referring to a Kentucky Derby pie. It's an easy recipe to prepare. This recipe prepares two pies, so invite some friends or relatives over. Serve with a dollop of whipped cream on each slice. Enjoy! —Annie

KENTUCKY DERBY PIE

- 2 pie crusts
- 1 cup pecan halves
- 1 12 oz. package semi-sweet chocolate chips

- 4 whole eggs, beaten
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup light Karo syrup
- 1 stick butter, melted
- Whipped cream

Divide the pecans and chocolate chips equally in the bottom of two pie crusts, uncooked. Combine the remaining ingredients in a bowl. Pour over the nut and chocolate chips in the pie pans. Bake in a 350-degree oven for 10 minutes, then reduce the temperature to 325 degrees and bake for 30 minutes. Serve each slice with a dollop of whipped cream. Makes two pies.

Upscale weddings in Atlantic City

■ *Grand opening set for late summer or early fall*

Here Comes the Bride

Atlantic City is venturing into the upscale wedding business. The setting is the top floor of The Pier at Caesars, the high-end Boardwalk shopping mall that juts hundreds of feet into the ocean. Investors are spending millions on the project, although they declined to divulge the exact amount. A grand opening is tentatively scheduled for late summer or early fall, but the developers are already booking weddings and other special events ranging from bar mitzvahs to corporate get-togethers to charity galas. Weddings are expected to start at about \$50,000 and top out at more than \$100,000.

Camps vary, ranging from game strategy to all-inclusive poker trips. MGM Puts Atlantic City Land Up For Sale

Gaming giant MGM Mirage Inc. says it may sell off 14 acres of waterfront land next to Trump Marina Hotel Casino as it looks to trim its real estate holdings. The company also said it wouldn't rule out selling a 72-acre parcel adjacent to Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa, although that land remains the proposed development site of the now-delayed \$5 billion MGM Grand Atlantic City gaming resort. MGM, the second-largest gaming company behind Harrah's Entertainment Inc., is also considering the sale of undeveloped land in Las Vegas as part of plans to strengthen its finances.

More AC Building Postponed

The latest casino to go by the wayside is a proposed megaresort by Penn National Gaming Inc. Blaming the recession and Atlantic City's withering casino market, Penn said it is scrapping plans to build on a 23-acre site along the Route 30 corridor, far away from the existing casinos. Penn now joins the developers of three other proposed casinos that have shelved their projects because of the economy. MGM Mirage has indefinitely delayed plans for a massive \$5 billion gaming complex that would rise next to Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa. Pinnacle Entertainment Inc. is waiting out the recession before starting work on a \$1.5 billion casino at the former Sands Casino Hotel site.

THE KITCHEN DIVA by Angela Shelf Medearis

A cool salad

■ For hot summer days

Calypso is probably best known as a type of Caribbean folk song. It's inspired by a combination of musical styles and languages common to Trinidad. Calypso music is rhythmically smooth, and the words are often colorful and sharply critical in a witty way. This recipe for Calypso Black Bean and Corn Salad draws inspiration from the Caribbean, the easy spirit of the Islands and the music heard there. The salad takes only a few minutes to assemble, and it can be served either cold or at room temperature. Best of all, most of the ingredients can

be found in the pantry or the freezer.

This festive salad instantly became one of my all-time favorites when I was challenged by chef Bobby Flay on his Food Network show, *Throw down With Bobby Flay*. I decided to serve the Calypso Black Bean and Corn Salad as a side dish with my fiery Jerk Chicken. The wonderful thing about this combination of black beans, corn and spices is that it perfectly compliments the smokiness of barbecued meats. It's unique and colorful, and it tastes better the longer it sits in the pepper-infused citrus marinade. The judges loved my dishes, and I was declared the winner of the challenge. While it was wonderful to claim a culinary victory over chef Flay, the real winners were the guests at the barbecue. They got to eat some of the best dishes in Texas!

Try this delicious salad, and you'll feel like a winner, too!

CALYPSO CORN AND BLACK BEAN SALAD

- 1 (10-ounce) package frozen corn kernels, thawed
- 2 (15-ounce) cans black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 large red bell pepper, seeded and diced
- 1 small fresh jalapeno chili, seeded and minced
- 1/2 cup firmly packed chopped fresh cilantro
- 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lime juice
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Combine the corn, beans, bell pepper, jalapeno, cilantro, lime juice, oil, sugar, salt and pepper in a large bowl. Taste and adjust seasonings. Cover and chill one hour or overnight to combine flavors. Serves 4 to 6.

VA Home Loan Has Its Benefits

If you’ve never used your VA eligibility to buy a home, this could be the perfect time to do so. Between the warmer weather and the current price of real estate, you could find a real bargain. With a VA home loan, you likely won’t make a down payment, you won’t pay mortgage insurance premiums, your closing costs are limited and you could get an even better interest rate than is being offered in the open market. Your first step will be to get your Certificate of Eligibility. You’ll need to complete a VA Form 26-1880, available online at www.homeloans.va.gov. Gather up your discharge documents, such as your DD 214. You’ll need those, too.

The next step, before you ever look at real estate, should be to sit down with a lender who handles VA guaranteed loans. (If you haven’t yet applied for your Certificate, ask your lender if it can do so online. Some can.) Find out

the state of your credit and how much of a loan you qualify for.

The next step is to find a property you like. Keep in mind that there’s a limit. The VA program won’t guarantee loans over \$417,000 (\$625,500 in Alaska and Hawaii).

If you’ve already used your eligibility to buy a house, your eligibility can be restored to buy a second house if the loan on the first one was paid off. If there are complications, such as a buyer assuming your first loan, you’ll need to talk to the VA Regional Loan center near you. In some cases your eligibility can be restored or you may have remaining entitlement, depending on the circumstances.

If you’ve never owned a home, consider pre-purchase counseling. For information call HUD at 1-800-569-4287.

She’s 100 and still loves Bingo!

During the years I lived in Las Vegas and played nearly every night at a North Las Vegas Bingo hall, I got to know one of the most energetic and funny women I have ever known. When I met Louise she was in her early nineties. Last month she celebrated her 100th birthday. I decided to use her birthday as an excuse to drive the seven hours it takes to return to Las Vegas for a visit...and some Bingo.

The Bingo hall where Louise and I so often played devoted one of its marquees to a simple statement: “Happy 100th Birthday, Louise.” She’s quite a gal. Although she has lost much of her close-up vision, she still plays several times a week, using one of the electronic Bingo devices that play the game for you and alert you when you’ve won. And, in spite of catching the spotlight by turning 100, she is also in the record books as the oldest still-active dance teacher in the U.S. Yes, you heard me right. Despite failing eyesight and a slower gait, Louise still teaches a weekly dance class. At a special 100th party for her, she even got up and danced.

At the party I had the chance to talk to her about the last 100 years; I also talked to her about our favorite game. “Bingo keeps me alert,” she told me. “I think a lot of older people like playing Bingo because it’s good for the mind.”

Because she is now a centenarian, it’s safe to say that Louise discovered Bingo well after she became an adult. We consider the 1930s as the era in which Bingo really got started in this country. So, it’s safe to say that she has played an awful lot of games in the decades since she first starting playing.

I bring all of this up, not only because of just what a special person Louise is, but because of the fact that Bingo has become a place where she can still be among friends and still compete with others. Lucky for her, she is still mentally sharp. Many senior citizens who are much younger can’t say that. She is a living example of what many psychologists have said over the years...Bingo IS conducive to good mental health and can keep our minds sharp and alert. Additionally, Louise finds a safe haven where she plays. She is treated with respect. And that is the point I want to make this month. Bingo is often perceived as a “game for the older crowd.” If you look at the demographics, a case can be made for that assessment. But, there are still a lot of people of all ages at most Bingo games. I have never seen a time when the older or more frail among us has not been treated well at the sessions. People always make room for Louise, as she and a friend come in and out of the room. We all look out for her, as we do for all of those who need extra time or some assistance.

So Louise, Happy Birthday. Thanks for brightening our evenings. Thanks for your love of dance and Bingo and life itself. We can all learn something from you. And, in the coming years may you continue to love the game and even yell “Bingo!” now and then.

Filmmaker Sacha Baron Cohen sued over alleged Bingo flap

Richelle Olson, the executive director of Desert Valley Charities in Palmdale, California, has sued actor and filmmaker Sacha Baron Cohen, NBC Universal and others for claiming that “Bruno,” a character being played by Cohen in an upcoming film by the same name, was a celebrity and would appear and call numbers at the charity bingo game she runs for senior citizens. When “Bruno” arrived, Olson says he was an “extreme, outrageous, offensive caricature of a gay man dressed in sexually revealing clothing.” Olson claims Bruno used “vulgar and offensive language” while calling Bingo, and when she tried to intercede, a “physical struggle ensued” and Cohen “offensively touched, pushed and battered” her, causing her to fall to the ground. The suit says Olson was rushed to the hospital and that she has been confined to a wheelchair and walker ever since. Attorneys for Cohen and *Bruno* have accused Olson of making a “demonstrably ludicrous and false complaint” and demand she remove her complaint. The attorneys claim that Cohen never touched Olson, and that Olson assaulted Cohen by “grabbing his arms from behind and attempting to pull him out of a chair.” It goes on to say that Cohen “of-

fered only light-hearted comments that were met with general laughter from the audience, and even applause.” Olson reportedly signed a release promising not to sue.

Blind woman hears Bingo

A blind woman from Rochester, New York, says it is a joy to be able to hear her electronic Bingo machine in the wake of her two-year battle to allow the devices to be audible. The Rochester *Democrat and Chronicle* reported that Joanna Richardson, 51, who was born blind, convinced state officials to allow electronic Bingo devices to audibly notify users if they won. The New York State Racing and Wagering Board, which supervises Bingo games in the state of New York, previously had banned audible electronic Bingo machines due to complaints from other players. But after Richardson’s two-year campaign of e-mails and telephone calls, the state group capitulated to her request and allowed the devices to alert users if they are victorious or are only one number away from winning. “She’s a profile in persistence,” said Joe Mahoney, the state agency’s spokesman.

Skydiver Bingo

Orange Beach Parks, in Orange Beach, Alabama, hosted a fundraiser for the American Cancer Society in which skydivers jumped out of an aircraft at 10,000 feet and parachuted to Earth, their target being a large Bingo-style grid with squares that were bid on for

cash prizes. The first place winner walked away with \$1,500, while second place earned \$750, third place won \$500, and fourth place snagged \$250. Skydivers were provided by Emerald Coast Skydiving.

Retired British nurse, 76, banned from Bingo

Rosalyn Clemson has visited the same Mecca Bingo Hall in Great Britain every week with her friends for more than half a century. But when Clemson, 76, decided she wanted a change of scenery and organized a group trip to a rival hall, the Bingo company didn’t take it well. Instead, Mecca said she had broken membership rules and, despite playing at the same hall for more than 50 years, Clemson and her husband were no longer welcome there or in any of the 100 Bingo halls they operate across the UK. The frail pensioner says the ban has left her emotionally devastated and depressed. She said her only crime was to ask fellow players if they wanted to visit another hall 15 miles away for a change. Mecca managers said her offence was to have approached members at Mecca offering coach trips to competing Bingo clubs, a serious membership violation.

HEALTHY NEWS

Here's part two of a summer's worth of sunburn relief. At least a few of these remaining 10 folk remedies are sure to work for you.

Lemon water

Mix the juice of three lemons into two cups of cold water and sponge on the sunburn. The lemon will cool the burn, act as a disinfectant and will promote healing of the skin.

Milk

Make a compress of whole milk (or buttermilk) and apply to the burned area for 20 minutes; repeat every two to four hours. Wash the milk off so you won't smell sour! The fat content of the milk is soothing for burns.

Oatmeal

Put some oatmeal in tepid bath water; soak for a few minutes, then air-dry yourself.

Peppermint

Apply peppermint oil to the sunburned skin. You can also make a mild peppermint infusion and use it as a wash to cool the sunburn.

Potato

Grate a potato and apply it to the burned area. The starch will cool and soothe the burn.

Shower

Take a warm shower to draw out the heat of your sunburn. The warm water will increase circulation to the area while hydrating it, thereby speeding the healing process.

Tea

Make some tea, cool and apply to the burn. While any tea may be beneficial, mint tea, such as peppermint or spearmint are especially good. The teas have tannins that help the healing process.

Witch hazel

Make a decoction of witch hazel and apply with a compress.


Yarrow

Native Americans used an infusion of ground yarrow as a wash.

Yogurt


Apply plain yogurt with live cultures; let it stand for a few minutes, then rinse off under cool water. Another remedy using yogurt is to mix equal parts of yogurt and mashed strawberries and apply to the sunburned area for 15 minutes. Rinse with cool water.

■ Store bonus goes to charity

Lottery bonus goes to food bank

A \$100,000 bonus that went to a Southeast Washington, D.C., supermarket that sold a \$144 million Powerball ticket will go to charity. The Capital Area Food Bank will get the money that Giant Food received as part of the lottery winnings, officials from the store said. It is traditional for the store that sells the winning ticket to get a bonus. This was the city's largest Powerball win. Giant has had a long relationship with the food bank. The donation will go toward construction of a larger distri-

bution center, which will allow twice the amount of food to be distributed throughout the city. —*Lottery Post*

Rancher wins biggest single Powerball prize ever

A North Dakota rancher struggling to eke out a living claimed one of the biggest undivided jackpots in U.S. lottery history — \$232 million — after buying the ticket in a town by the name of Winner. Neal Wanless, 23, said he intends to buy himself more room to roam and repay the kindness other townspeople have shown his family. Wanless, who is single, lives with his mother and father on the family's 320-acre ranch near Mission, North Dakota, where they raise cattle, sheep, and horses. They don't own a phone, a mobile home of theirs was repossessed last year, and they have fallen behind in their property taxes. Wanless will take home a lump sum of \$88.5 million after taxes. —*AP*

Wisconsin gets first Power Play lotto win

A Marshfield, Wisconsin, man is a million dollars richer, at least before taxes, after winning the Powerball lottery. Rafael Ruiz Jr., 28, is also Wisconsin's first Power Play winner. Ruiz matched all five Powerball numbers, which typically means winning \$200,000. But since he chose the Power Play option, his winnings multiplied by five. Ruiz won using Powerball quick pick, and says he is determined to win even bigger using the same numbers again. He took home \$682,000 after taxes. —*WSAW, Wausau, Wisconsin*

Virginia high court rules lottery must be accessible

Federal and state laws require the Virginia Lottery to ensure that its games are accessible to people with disabilities, the state Supreme Court has ruled. But nothing in those laws specifies how accessibility must be achieved, the court said in a unanimous decision reviving a lawsuit filed by four disabled Virginians who identified 16 lottery retailers unable to accommodate their wheelchairs. The court returned the case to a circuit court judge to determine what actions, if any, the Virginia Lottery must take to comply with state and federal disabilities laws. The judge had ruled that the lottery's program is not covered by those laws, but the Supreme Court disagreed. —*Virginia Lottery*
