



■ Fruit Cocktail and Lemon Dream Cake

Dear Ask Annie,
A friend told me there is a recipe for a fruit cocktail cake. I would love to try it. Have you ever heard about this recipe? Thank you.
Lynne F., from Philadelphia

Dear Lynne,
I went to a ladies luncheon a couple of years ago. We were served a fruit cocktail cake. I asked my friend, for the recipe. I am also giving you my friend Sally's lemon cake recipe. This recipe is easy and very tasty. Enjoy! —
Annie

FRUIT COCKTAIL CAKE

- 1 1/2 cups flour (regular not self-rising)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 can fruit cocktail (15 oz.)
- 14 ounces fruit juice (orange or pineapple)
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- Whipped cream

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Using a large bowl, blend the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Add the fruit cocktail, fruit juice and egg. Stir all ingredients until well blended. Pour into a 9-by 13-inch pan. Spread the pecans and brown sugar over the top of the cake. Bake for 45 minutes. Top with whipped cream.

SALLY'S LEMON DREAM CAKE

- 1 yellow cake mix with pudding
- 3/4 cup canola oil
- 1 11-oz. can mandarin oranges
- 4 eggs
- 1 can crushed pineapple, drain and save juice
- 1 large cool whip
- 1 regular-size package vanilla instant pudding

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Using a blender, mix the cake mix, oil and oranges. Pour in a greased and floured pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes. Allow the cake to cool for a little while. Prick the cake with a toothpick. Pour the juice over the cake. In a separate bowl, combine the cool whip and vanilla pudding. Remove the toothpicks from the cake. Ice the cake with the frosting mix. Keep cool until ready to serve.

Blackjack back with a catch ■ Vending machine burglar caught at Caesars

\$2 Blackjack is Back
Resorts Atlantic City has decided to bring back \$2 blackjack tables. With high rollers being few and far between during the economic recession, the Atlantic City casino is hoping that the everyday gamblers can help improve revenue. There is a small catch to the \$2 tables, however: Players must pay 25 cents a hand to the casino. That fee goes toward offsetting the operating costs of running such a small stakes table. The casino is attempting to attract novice players with the low table limit. This is not the first time Atlantic City casinos have offered a \$2 table. In fact, the tables were commonplace before casinos became greedy and took away the games. Now that they are starving for customers, the casinos have started to rethink their high limit tables.

Former State Officials May Work With Casinos

As members of his administration search for new jobs, outgoing NJ Gov. Jon Corzine signed a law permitting former state officials to go to work for companies that do business with casinos. Corzine signed the bill along with several others that cleared the Legislature on the final day of its lame-duck session in January. The legislation allows law firms and other companies that do business with casinos to continue that work after they hire former state employees, but imposes a two-year waiting period during which the ex-state employees cannot deal with casinos. The bill cleared the Senate 23-11 and the Assembly 42-31, despite the objections of lawmakers who said it would pose conflicts and bridge the longstanding divide between government and Atlantic City casinos.

Casino Vending Burglar Nabbed

The Press of Atlantic City reports that a serial burglar of casino vending machines struck one time too many. Casino security officers arrested Bernard Snead as he tried to flee Caesars Atlantic City, where a surveillance operator spotted him on video. The 43-year-old man was wanted in the Dec. 12 burglary of five vending machines at the Claridge Hotel Towers. After a Caesars security officer and Bally's officer apprehended Snead, he was found with items from a vending machine burglary at Caesars earlier in the night, police said. Snead is charged with criminal mischief, burglary and theft in both cases, and at press time was being held in the Atlantic County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 bail. He was also arrested in December 2004 for breaking into 17 vending machines at six different casinos.

Lady Gaga Hosts Gay Marriage Event in AC

Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD) Media Award nominee Lady Gaga hosted an event to benefit four regional gay marriage groups. The Hands Up for Marriage Equality took place Jan. 16 at Club Worship inside the House of Blues at the Showboat Casino and Hotel in Atlantic City. Proceeds benefited four regional gay rights organizations advocating for marriage equality: The Power, Empire State Pride Agenda, Garden State Equality and Equality Pennsylvania. "I am honored to be able to continue to raise awareness and money for this cause and these outstanding organizations," Lady Gaga said in a statement. "Organizations like these are in the trenches every day working on behalf of all of us whether you are LGBT or straight." Showboat Casino and Hotel offered a special nightlife room rate for attendees.





It's a tricky business when you hit a winning streak at Bingo and your buddies have to sit there and watch it happen. If these guys are truly buddies, then they should be happy you're winning. If they act otherwise, it's either because they may not be the friends you thought they were, or—and I'm leaning toward this second observation as the right one—you may have celebrated your winnings just a little too forcefully and ticked them off.

Did you simply act happy at your good fortune, or did you rub their noses in it? Was it really just a generic "Woo-hoo!" or was it more of a "Woo-hoo, check it out losers, I rule and you drool!" If the latter was the case, then what you did was squander their opportunity to be happy for you by making them annoyed by your behavior. Put simply, you were a poor winner.

In a group competition like Bingo, where there is typically only one winner, it's very important to be gracious when you win. Remember, in the process of your winning, 150 other people lost. Of course it's OK to be excited—you know how funny it is to watch someone lose control of

themselves and scream or laugh or do their version of the happy dance when something exciting happens to them. But you should also know how annoying it is when someone turns a win into some kind of victory and everyone else's defeat. I believe the phrase you used was "Eat my dust." You're basically kicking dirt in their faces and expecting them to enjoy it. Not gonna happen.

And so, Big Bucks, my advice is to enjoy your winning streak, and encourage your Bingo buddies to enjoy it WITH you, by letting them be part of the excitement of your win and not victims of it. Sure, they're going to be a little jealous. Heck, the whole Bingo hall is. Be joyful, and try not to make their envy any worse. —*Guy*

Dear Guy,

What's your feeling about Bingo machines? I've been curious to try one, but I also like dabbing on paper Bingo cards and the machines look like they might be boring—they do all the work for you while you sit there twiddling your thumbs waiting for the machine to go beep. —*Len C., via e-mail*

Dear Len,

The machines are as fun as you make them: You punch in the number and the machines tracks your cards so you'll never miss a Bingo. Obviously, the big attraction is that they allow a slow player to play more cards. They also give people with disabilities, who might not be physically able to dab paper cards, the opportunity to play along with the best.

I've tried Bingo machines and definitely see their merits. And that's saying something, because I'm not a big fan of most technology. (I find it pushy.) And it definitely cuts down on missed numbers.

But, bottom line—I prefer my good ol' ink dabber and paper. If I didn't have something in front of me to think, I'd get way bored way fast. —*Guy*

The homeowners association hedged, saying it didn't have a problem with the flag itself, just the pole, and it threatened legal action.


He won in the end, and kept his flag proudly flying. But there never should have been an issue in the first place.

I'd hate to think that this case got so much attention because its owner is a Medal of Honor recipient, as there have been other cases of homeowners being told to take down their flags. **What about those
Multi-hour sessions?**

In previous columns I have talked about myriad kinds of Bingo sessions. The “standard” session runs about an hour. You can't buy-in after a certain point and the rules are pretty universal.

Then there is what you might call an “augmented” session. This is the kind where you not only have a chance to play regular games, you are often bombarded by runners who are trying to sell you every manner of special game and contest and card. This kind of session allows the player to engage in a variety of very interesting games of chance (all at a higher cost). But, there is a

downside for those NOT interested in this extra layer of gaming. The constant hubbub in the aisles of people hawking all the different games can make it hard to concentrate. The third type is often seen at Bingo halls on Indian reservations and occasionally at major halls in gaming cities, such as Las Vegas and Atlantic City. These are often expensive, multi-hour sessions. Some are set up so you can play all the games or just some of them. An expensive buy-in makes you eligible for the entire session...some of which can run as long as three hours. A cheaper buy-in lets you participate in most, but not all of the sessions.

The neat thing about many of these multi-hour sessions is that, at some halls, the payouts can be enormous. And, some have “special” sessions. Many are on a monthly or quarterly basis. Some of these promise incredibly high payouts. Personally, I can't sit still for

three hours of non-stop Bingo. Additionally, I can't afford the buy-in necessary to participate. But, for dyed-in-the-wool Bingo fans, these marathon sessions can be just what the doctor ordered. Many people on limited incomes find them so enticing that they curtail their other Bingo playing just to save up for these occasional games.

The amount of personnel and coordination that go into these sessions is hard to fathom, unless you've been behind the scenes. It's time to once again pay tribute to the managers and callers and runners who make Bingo possible. During the years I played every night (when I lived in Las Vegas), I began to realize that even though most of the callers and other employees always seemed to have a smile on their face, what they were doing was hard work. How they kept smiling was a mystery.

Once I mentioned in this column that I might be able to be a caller—having been a radio announcer all my life—but I could not be a runner because I could not keep track of all the payouts.

The bottom line this month is that no matter what your taste in Bingo—short, regular session, or marathon, multi-hour session—there IS something for everyone. Again, use the *Bingo Bugle* as a guide to what is being played where and when. Also, you can always go to an Internet search engine and put in the name of your city and the word “bingo” and check further.

Old Scientific Instruments

Q: In researching, we found our four teaching devices in an 1848 catalog on *Optical, Mathematical and Philosophical Instruments*. Can you tell me anything about them? The set originally had nine pieces. —Margie, Tucson, Ariz.

A: The writer describes “movable astronomical diagrams” made by Benjamin Pike Jr. of New York. Each is a 4- by 7-inch flat wooden frame with glass discs in the center. When hand-cranked and held to light, they demonstrate eclipses, orbits and tides.

Old scientific instruments and teaching devices are popular today. As information becomes increasingly digital and abstract, pieces from simpler, earlier eras of scientific exploration hold fascination for collectors. Items in top shape sell high, and several auction houses hold sales that include them.

Christie’s London has a department that includes scientific antiques, and we asked James Hyslop, science specialist there, about the frames.

The frames were made by several

firms in the 19th century, he told us. “They would have been used in conjunction

with a projection lantern,” he added. Value is increased if there is a maker’s stamp on the wooden frames.

Without seeing the pieces, pegging value is tricky. But Hyslop added that if condition is fine and the mark is present, value on each could be \$500 or more. Without a mark or if condition is compromised, value is more like \$100 to \$200 apiece.

“The market for this sort of lantern accessory is very strong at the moment,” he said. A single 19th-century microscope slide sold for over \$1,000 recently!




Pull tabs

■ *Are there some rules?*

Dear Aunt Bingo,
One of our local Bingo halls has started not showing what prizes are still available for pull tabs, and for coin and 13 boards they are not showing how many winning numbers have been signed up for. I understand that they are trying to get people to buy tickets even if there is only one prize remaining, but I don't think it's right to hide that information, as I think anyone buying those tickets should have an idea of their odds of winning when they purchase tickets. Is there anything in the rules that requires them to disclose this information? This one hall is the only place that does this. I have stopped buying them because I may be purchasing a ticket that has absolutely no chance of winning. —*MMR, via e-mail*

Dear MMR,
You are not the first player to voice such a concern. And I have sat in more than a few Bingo halls with players grumbling that the management refuses to introduce a new pull-tab series until a major portion of an old series has been sold—regardless of how few prizes remain. Between you and me, I kind of keep

an eye on it myself, and if a series seems to be played out, I'll stop buying until a new series begins. That said, I've been skunked a couple of times by not buying into pull tab series I thought were done, only to see a \$1,000 prize go to someone else. That hurt!

I'm glad you appreciate that most halls are selling these pull tabs to make money for charity, and of course would like to sell as many as possible before starting a new series. I'm afraid I do not know what the laws are governing sale of pull tabs: Maybe a hall must sell a percentage before it can end it; maybe it can stop selling at any time.

But I suspect that all the hall is really doing is trying to do its best to make as much money as possible from each series. After all, what sponsor wants to give away thousands of dollars in prize money if people haven't bought in enough to fund the prizes? —*Aunt Bingo*

Dear Aunt Bingo,
I am one of the people that must use a machine to yell Bingo for me, as I have paralyzed vocal chords. I'm lucky enough to speak with just a whisper of a voice. Virginia Lottery Moves From TV to Internet

Beginning in 2010, Virginia Lottery drawings will take place on the Internet. The daily draw shows and twice-a-week Win For Life drawings that were held on TV are now available online only, according to the lottery's web site. The Mega Millions drawings will continue to be televised. The move is a cost-saving measure, according to the site. The lottery had paid TV stations to air the drawings. Lottery officials noted that large numbers of people already turn to the Internet and mobile devices to check winning numbers, making this a logical move. —*Virginia-Pilot*

County Claims \$1 Million Chunk of Lotto Prize

A Long Island couple that won a \$162 million jackpot may lose \$1 million of it, according to Suffolk County, NY, officials. County officials say Richard and Mary Morrison owe \$950,000 stemming from an audit of a homeless shelter they ran for 20 years. The audit showed the couple doled out bonuses to themselves, billed the county for benefits they later pocketed and bought big-screen televisions. A judgment against the couple was filed in 2008. Richard Morrison told reporters that the county's claims were baseless. The couple opted for a lump-sum payment, which will give them roughly \$100 million before taxes. A Suffolk County judge has ordered that \$1 million of the winnings be placed in escrow based on the charges. —*New York Daily News*

Indiana Woman Wins Hoosier Lottery Illegally

An Indiana woman who won \$1

million on a scratch-off lottery game will be serving probation instead of spending her winnings. Betty Jacobi, 54, who managed a convenience store in New Salisbury, Indiana, bought the \$20 ticket from her own store, a violation of lottery policy. Because Jacobi couldn't legally claim the money, prosecutors said she gave the ticket to her daughter, Joni Magner, who collected the prize, including a \$30,000 first installment. But the family's plan started to unravel when someone sent an anonymous tip to the Hoosier Lottery, telling them to check store surveillance video. When they did, investigators said they discovered that Magner wasn't even in the store on the day that the ticket was purchased. Jacobi pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor count of unlawfully purchasing a lottery ticket. Her plea deal calls for her to serve 60 days probation and perform 24 hours of community service. —*6 News, Indiana*



