Q: Any info about our child's wooden high chair? The only mark I could find was "patent pending" on the underside of the tray. —*Vee, Hampden, Maine*

A: Seen in photos, this is an attractive sack back Windsor style high chair with an oval seat. The patent mark tells us it was mass-produced. The bowed back with decorative center accent and fancy turning on spindles points to a better grade product. This was a good chair when made. It appears to date from the 1940s, but it must be seen for definitive dating.

Today, the old chairs appeal primarily to doll collectors, as they are a good way to display a large doll. Retail, chairs of this vintage average \$200 to \$400, depending on condition and where sold.

Q: My mother got this Shirley Temple pitcher at a World's Fair in, I think, the 1930s. Is it worth anything? —*Grace, Saluda, Va.*

A: In the 1930s, the Hazel Atlas Glass Company made cobalt blue glass mugs, pitchers and cereal bowls with a white decal of the movie moppet's face. In the 1950s, Temple resurfaced on TV, and many old favorites were reissued. In the 1970s, Temple cobalt glass was just plain faked.

Collectors accepted the repro cobalt glass pieces, and that keeps prices of the originals down. Prices today range from \$10 to \$50, or whatever the seller can get. The fact that your pitcher (actually a creamer for the set) is authentic will matter to a discerning buyer willing to pay more for the real thing.

Spinach and Strawberry Salad

- 1 pound strawberries, hulled and sliced
- 3 tablespoon lime juice
- 2 teaspoon honey
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 container (12-oz) baby spinach
- 10 ounce (2 cups) chicken breast meat, coarsely shredded
- 3/4 cup walnuts, toasted and coarsely chopped

Salt and pepper

1. In blender, puree 3/4 cup strawberries with lime juice, honey, oil, 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper. Transfer dressing to large serving bowl. 2. To bowl with dressing, add spinach, chicken and remaining strawberries; toss to coat. Sprinkle salad with walnuts to serve. Serves 6.

Honey-Vanilla Ice Cream Sandwiches

- 1 pint honey-vanilla ice cream, softened
 - 12 very thin oval (4-by-2-inches each) butter wafer cookies
 - 1 pound fresh cherries
1. Working quickly, spread ice cream on 6 cookies, using 1/3 cup for each; top with remaining 6 cookies. Place ice cream sandwiches on cookie sheet in freezer to harden ice cream. Serve with bowl of cherries. Serves 6.
- TIP: When assembling the sandwiches, some ice cream will likely drip down and freeze onto the cookie sheet. If you line the pan with parchment, removing the sandwiches should be a cinch.





Lemon Cake

■ A fool proof recipe

Dear Readers,

I'll say it again to guarantee that all of my readers are aware of it. I made a big mistake. I submitted a recipe that was given to me by a good friend and an excellent cook. Several of my readers and I have discovered that the recipe is worthless. I am asking all of you to completely ignore the recipe for "Sally's Lemon Dream Cake" in the March issue of *Bingo Bugle* as it does not satisfy the standards that both our readers and I demand. I am very sorry for this error. I will do my best to make sure this does not happen

again. A special thank you to Eve Younglove, Lou Reed, Carol Klaus, Carol Nicholson, Judy Gibbons, Liz Chapman, Carole Puglisi and Kaye Anderson for pointing out the error of my ways.

I am going to take a chance and include another recipe for a lemon cake. This recipe is for a "Lemon Surprise Cake." I know this one is fool proof. —Annie

LEMON SURPRISE CAKE

- 1 Duncan Hines lemon cake mix
- 1 cup apricot nectar
- 4 eggs
- 1/3 cup oil
- 1 3.5-ounce package lemon instant pudding
- 1/2 cup confectioners powdered sugar
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- Flour

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

In a large bowl, combine the cake mix, apricot nectar, eggs, oil and pudding mix. Beat thoroughly with an electric mixer for about 2 to 3 minutes on medium speed. Coat a Bundt pan with no-stick cooking spray. Dust with flour. Pour the batter into the Bundt pan and bake for 35 to 40 minutes. Cool for at least 25 minutes.

In a mixing bowl combine the confectioners sugar, lime juice and lemon juice. Stir well. (If you wish, you can bring this mixture to a boil first and simmer for 2 to 3 minutes). Remove the cake from the cake pan and glaze with the confectioners sugar mixture. Do this by slowly pouring the glaze over the cake. Serves 8 to 10.

CHOCOLATE HAZELNUT MOUSSE

- 2 cups heavy cream
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

19 ounce Nutella
In a large bowl beat the cream and vanilla extract with an electric mixer until a soft peak forms. Add the Nutella to the cream mixture and beat until a firm peak forms. Fill eight individual custard bowls. Garnish with whipped cream. Serves 8.

Plans to turn Steel Pier into an environmental landmark

■ *Hard Rock plans to develop a \$300 million casino-hotel in AC*

Bally's Turns 30

Bally's Atlantic City is celebrating its 30th anniversary in Atlantic City. It has become one of the most celebrated hotels in the country since its grand opening. The property, which has experienced uninterrupted success over the past three decades, combines the elements of a great location and links to the "old Atlantic City" that existed on the land where Bally's now sits. Today, Bally's is a renowned casino resort, offering guests an extensive range of gaming options, an array of acclaimed restaurants for every type of taste, exquisite accommodations, a complete health club, a beach bar, the Grand Ballroom, convention and meeting facilities and entertainment, year-round. Steel Pier Adding Wind Turbines

For more than a century, Steel Pier has been known as an entertainment center. Now there are plans to turn it into an environmental landmark as well. Atlantic Pier Amusements Inc., which operates the pier's amusement park during the warm-weather months, plans to install as many as 10 wind turbines later this year, pending approval of a state bill to permit the high-tech windmills on oceanside piers. Atlantic City already boasts five such units along the White Horse Pike, operated by the Atlantic City Utilities Authority. Each is 397 feet high; combined they generate 19 million kilowatt hours of emission-free electricity a year. Steel Pier's would be about half as tall, and each would generate 2.5 million to 3 million kilowatt hours annually. Operators believe the turbines will be a tourist draw, and will include an education center on wind energy as part of the project.

MGM Borgata Sale Approved by State

MGM Mirage Inc.'s plan to sell its 50 percent stake in the Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa here because of overseas business ties was unanimously approved by the New Jersey Casino Control Commission in a session that lasted less than 15 minutes. The Commission signed off 5-0 on the settlement reached between MGM and the state Division of Gaming Enforcement that has MGM selling its half-share in Atlantic City's most profitable casino. MGM has been in a joint-venture ownership with Boyd Gaming Corp., with MGM the silent partner and Boyd the operator. Under the settlement, MGM will transfer its 50-percent stake into a divestiture trust, of which MGM will be the sole beneficiary. The trust will be responsible for selling MGM's interest within 30 months. The agreement with the state also calls for MGM-owned land leased by the Borgata to be put into the trust and sold in that same period.

Hard Rock Comes to AC

Hard Rock International, famous for its rock 'n' roll-themed cafes, has teamed with private equity firm Och-Ziff Real Estate to develop a \$300 million casino-hotel in Atlantic City, according to Reuters. The move follows recent state legislation aimed at encouraging new development in Atlantic City, whose gambling revenue has dropped amid the recent economic downturn as well as new competition in neighboring states like Pennsylvania, where gambling was approved in 2006. Hard Rock, owned by Florida's Seminole Indian tribe, said the proposed legislation would allow developers to build new casinos in Atlantic City with fewer than 500 hotel rooms, significantly reducing construction costs. Hard Rock, based in Orlando, Florida, has a total of 162 venues in 52 countries, including 13 casino-hotels.

GAMBLING WITH GREG

Turning A Game Wild

A wild player can sit down in a tight poker game, play for an hour, and the game will often open up. The wild player might then take a break, and the same game that had been tight for five hours will stay loose, even if the wild player is gone for an hour. What happens is every player at the table can't wait to get in a hand with the new wild player who's raising with 72. The formerly tight players are now re-raising with hands like J10, trying to isolate themselves with the wild player. The wild player ends up taking on the entire table, usually one player at a time. The tight players are almost working together against this intruder, in the beginning. The first player to raise the wild player back, and the rest of the table almost gives that player a nod of good luck and gets out of his or her way.

Of course, the tight players don't really want the other tight players to win when they wade in against the wild one. They view the wild player as playing with money that will ultimately be spread around the table. Any chips the wild player wins, from the other tight players will be much more easily won if they're sitting, temporarily, in front of the wild player.

Meanwhile, the wild player has tightened up, is only playing loose enough to still seem like the wild player. Now the tight players, who had been contentedly trading their chips back and forth and feeding the house, are either stuck or suddenly running hot. Either way, they're ready to gamble. They're opening pots with weak hands and raising back when a tight player raises. The wild player folds, the game is getting too wild. The tight player with the weak hand is looking to flop big. It worked when the wild player did it to him. That's how he got stuck.

This is somewhat of an exaggeration, but scenarios like this play out in poker all the time. Sometimes the wild player instigating the action is a brilliant player who picks up on exactly how the other players are playing back at him, and capitalizes on his table image. Sometimes the wild player really is giving away chips.

One of these players disrupted a tight 3-6 game I was in one time. I basically waited for aces and watched him. He got most of the table fired up, raising back at him, as he had started raising every hand he played. A table of players who had been playing single bet showdown poker were suddenly capping bets on the river with no more than top pair. He got a little of my money, the few times I dared to see a flop and then folded, but he was catching everything and winning big with any two cards.

The next time I got online to play, I went into a penny limit game and decided I'd play like I'd seen him play. I wasn't trying to learn anything. I just thought it looked like fun, even if I did lose. And I did lose. You can't play almost every hand, fire off a bunch of two cent bluffs on the river, and expect to win money. I learned a lot, though. I learned that by making yourself a presence at a poker table, you force your opponents to react, and you learn about them. After pumping five or six dollars into that table, I had all those players pegged. I could tell the difference between them calling me down because they knew they had me, and them calling me down because it would only cost two cents and I was playing so wild I was liable to have five-high, so why not call?

Of course the trick to poker isn't to figure out what other players have, that can always be accomplished with enough chips. The trick is to figure it out without spending more than you collect back. The trick to poker isn't to sit down and turn a tight, house game into a loose, profitable one, that can also always be accomplished with enough chips. The trick is to do it while also beating it. And as I did later find out, that wild player was a skilled professional who played mostly in the lower limit games.

Camping And Food Safety

■ Tell Bacteria To Take A Hike

When you are enjoying food in the great outdoors, always keep cold foods cold. If cooking over a campfire or portable stove, bring a food thermometer to make sure the food reaches safe temperatures. Food is safely cooked when it is heated for a long enough time and at a high enough temperature to kill harmful bacteria that cause food-borne illness.

If you can't take a cooler, pack only foods that are safe without refrigeration, such as fruits, vegetables, hard cheeses, canned or dried meats, or peanut butter and crackers.

Food Safety

- Never bring meat, poultry or other perishable foods without a cold source to keep them safe.
 - Use an insulated cooler if car camping, or pack foods frozen with a cold source if hiking or backpacking.
 - Keep raw foods separate from other foods to prevent cross-contamination.
 - Bring disposable wipes or biodegradable soap for hand- and dishwashing.
 - Carry bottled water for drinking. Otherwise, boil water or use water purification tablets.
 - Even if you have a cooler, leftover food is safe only if the cooler still has plenty of ice or frozen gel packs in it. Otherwise, discard any perishable leftovers.



South Lake Tahoe. Harrah's Entertainment has sold its Bill's Lake Tahoe casino, shuttered since January, to a northern Nevada attorney for \$5.23 million; the lawyer plans to turn it into a gentlemen's club. If the plan is approved it would be the first strip club in all of Lake Tahoe.

Missouri. St. Louis County's new \$380 million River City Casino opened in early March. Seventh in the St. Louis area, River City is also one of the largest casinos in the Midwest, at 90,000 square feet (with six restaurants). As yet, there's no hotel, but owner Pinnacle Entertainment might build one as part of a \$75 million second phase required within three years. A week after opening River City, Pinnacle agreed to close its aging President Casino, also in the St. Louis area, by July 1.

Indiana. Revenues from Indiana's 13 casinos surpassed the gross from Mississippi's 30 casinos in 2009, positioning Indiana as the nation's new third largest (non-Native) gaming destination. Indiana reported \$2.58 billion, compared to Mississippi's \$2.46 billion. Analysts cite two new casinos that opened in Indiana in 2008 and one in 2009, along with a statewide smoking ban in Illinois, for the new ranking. Nevada

(\$9.76 billion) and New Jersey (\$3.9 billion) retain first and second place, respectively, with Mississippi now in fourth. Indiana's third-place reign may not last, especially with competition from Ohio and possibly Kentucky pending, and Pennsylvania poised to move up in the rankings.

Hawaii. The Hawaii Legislature has killed the bill that would have legalized casino gambling in Waikiki. Opponents successfully argued that gambling would undermine Hawaii's image as a family-friendly destination, plus cannibalize tourist dollars and increase crime rates. Hawaii and Utah remain the only states that don't allow any form of gambling.

Singapore. The Marina Bay Sands celebrated a soft (and partial) opening on April 27—a grand opening is scheduled for June 23. The Sands was originally scheduled to debut late last year, but labor difficulties pushed back the date several months. The Sands is the second casino in Singapore; it's expected to fare better than its competitor, Genting's Resorts World, due to its superior location and higher-end product.




Camping And Food Safety

■ Tell Bacteria To Take A Hike

When you are enjoying food in the great outdoors, always keep cold foods cold. If cooking over a campfire or portable stove, bring a food thermometer to make sure the food reaches safe temperatures. Food is safely cooked when it is heated for a long enough time and at a high enough temperature to kill harmful bacteria that cause food-borne illness.

If you can't take a cooler, pack only foods that are safe without refrigeration, such as fruits, vegetables, hard cheeses, canned or dried meats, or peanut butter and crackers.

General Rules for Outdoor Food Safety

- Never bring meat, poultry or other perishable foods without a cold source to keep them safe.
- Use an insulated cooler if car

camping, or pack foods frozen with a cold source if hiking or backpacking.

- Keep raw foods separate from other foods to prevent cross-contamination.
- Bring disposable wipes or biodegradable soap for hand- and dishwashing.
- Carry bottled water for drinking. Otherwise, boil water or use water purification tablets.

- Even if you have a cooler, left-over food is safe only if the cooler still has plenty of ice or frozen gel packs in it. Otherwise, discard any perishable leftovers.

Competitive play

■ *An experienced gambler speaks up*

Dear Aunt Bingo,

I am so sick and tired of mainly Bingo players complaining about what they think is cheating, or fixed, or a conspiracy. These people are usually the players that play less than \$20 per session and because they don't win often, they think everything is fixed.

I am a racehorse owner, former harness racehorse driver, high stakes poker player, and casino player several times a week. My wife and I also play Bingo several times a week. We spend approximately \$250 per session at local Bingo halls and approximately \$450 per regular session at the Indian Bingo in the local casinos, and of course many visits a year to Las Vegas, Lake Tahoe, and the Bahamas.

We win and lose like others do; however, we do have our good streaks, and t

that's when we hear all the crying from mostly the small-money players. They think we are in a conspiracy with the callers, etc. These people need to pay their few dollars and enjoy Bingo like they claim they do or stay home. If you think everything is fixed, don't go! Stop crying and spend enough to be competitive. If you can't afford it, that's not my problem.

Your response to "At a Loss, Las Vegas" was ridiculous. These people play two six packs (one six pack each) for a total of 12 cards. They are questioning why they can't get a number called on at least three of the cards. They now only get the number called on one or two of the cards. Excuuuuse Meeeee?! We play as many as 36 cards on paper, 72 cards between us, and sometimes we don't get the number called on three or more papers.

Part of your response said that, when it comes to numbers, there are a lot of clever people out there who may know exactly how to combine numbers on Bingo cards to control the number of winners per game. Are you serious!? I don't think you should be writing this column if that's what you actually believe. There are 24 numbers on a Bingo card. There are 75 total numbers. They are called randomly. That's how it works. There is no magic. Just plain common sense—which many of your readers do not have, judging by their beliefs. —*A Very Experienced Gambler, Phoenix, Arizona, via e-mail*

Dear Experienced,

Great letter. I love when a reader really speaks his or her mind!

My only correction is your point that I claimed "there are a lot of clever people out there who may know exactly how to combine numbers on Bingo cards to control the number of winners per game." Apparently my statement was a bit misleading. I did not mean that players do this; that, of course, would be impossible. I was referring to the companies that print the cards: They could print cards with certain numbers that appear a lot and others that are rare—not in an attempt to cheat players, but to make the games last longer or have more multiple winners. I have no idea if this happens, or if this is even legal, as it does manipulate the randomness of the game, as you pointed out. I also have to say that you blew me away with the amount of money you spend on Bingo—from \$250 to \$450 depending on the venue. Wow! It seems to me that in your world, almost everybody is a small-money player! —*Aunt Bingo*

Dear Aunt Bingo,

I believe the letter from "At a Loss, Las Vegas" was referring to the latest Bingo cards being sold at Station Casinos. They are similar to the old Monte Carlo cards that came three on a card and gave you all the numbers except the N row as there was only space for 12 N numbers. These new cards at Station Casinos have all the numbers twice in each pack of six cards (most of the time).

These cards are scanned as they are sold to accommodate a new wrinkle instituted by the casino: There are points awarded if you get within two numbers of a Bingo and also for being on but not winning the game. At the end of the month, the players with the most points are given cash prizes. Personally, I, too, am unable to like the new cards. —*LS, Las Vegas, Nevada*

Dear LS,

I don't get this at all. No N row (which means you are playing BIGO)? Accumulated points for monthly prizes (what good is this for tourists only there for a week or two)? I think I'll stick with my traditional Bingo! —*Aunt Bingo*

California Woman Wins \$37M with Quick Picks

A 77-year-old Salinas, California, retired hospital worker and regular lottery player collected \$21.2 million in cash after winning a \$37 million SuperLotto drawing. Mitsuko Higashi told lottery officials she's been playing regularly for 25 years, always buying her tickets at the same gas station where the winning ticket was purchased. She learned she'd won when she checked the newspaper for the winning numbers. How did she feel when she real

ized all the numbers matched? "How do you think I felt? I thought I lost my mind," she said, describing the experience like being doused with a bucket of ice water. —*Monterey County (California) Herald*

Massachusetts Lottery Launches Red Sox Scratch Ticket

The Boston Red Sox are swinging for the Green Monster with the launch of another Massachusetts State Lottery instant ticket. "Monster Money," the new \$10 Boston Red Sox scratch ticket, offers three \$3 million instant prizes and seven prizes of \$1 million. Other prizes include Red Sox gear such as jackets, pants, warm-up jerseys and duffel bags. There's even some luck for people who scratch off losing tickets: They can be entered into a second-chance drawing for 10 lucky players to win a pair of Monster seats to 10 games. Sales of the new ticket are expected to surpass \$120 million, with \$96.8 million in prizes and \$14 million in local aid to cities

and towns, according to lottery officials. The Lottery's partnership with the Sox has generated \$705 million worth of sales, which has meant nearly \$100 million in local aid for cities and towns. The Lottery and the Sox introduced sports scratch tickets in 2006, North America's first instant game to feature a Major League Baseball team logo. —*Boston Herald*

Man retrieves \$250K lottery ticket from trash

A Maryland man threw away a \$250,000 Mega Millions ticket before realizing his mistake and finding it after a 90-minute search. The 49-year-old man, whose name wasn't released by Maryland Lottery officials, bought several tickets for a recent drawing. After checking them and thinking none was a winner, he threw them out. A Maryland Lottery employee told the winner's brother that a \$250,000 winning ticket had been sold at a local store where the man had purchased his tickets. "I immediately got a report

from the store's lottery terminal to find out what the numbers were," the man said. "I called my wife to tell her we won the \$250,000 winning Mega Millions prize, but I was looking for the ticket in the trash." He said it took about an hour and a half to find the ticket. The winner and his wife plan to use the winnings to pay bills and take a trip to Europe. —*WBAL-TV, Baltimore, Maryland*


