## Olympic Collection

**Q:** I have a complete set of Levi's Sportswear posters for the 1980 Olympics. Each is 19 inches by 24 inches and in mint condition. As you know, those Olympics were aborted. Value of the posters? —*Dave, Tucson, Ariz.*

**A:** The 1980 Olympics held in Moscow were not aborted, but they were boycotted by the U.S. and other countries to protest Soviet activity in Afghanistan. Only 80 nations participated.

A collector could reasonably infer that posters custom made for a world sports event must be significant, especially when the event was the focus of a protest. Knowing that the owner has them from association with a Levi's store assures that they are authentic. Add that they are mint and, so far, all looks good.

But this is collecting. And smart collectors know that in this arena, there is often a wildcard lurking to turn things around.

Connecticut poster specialist David Pollack, current president of the International Vintage Poster Dealers

Association, is a specialist in travel, propaganda, American advertising and

war posters. He also sells Olympics posters because they fall into the genre of travel. Check his site for a set of Levi's 1980 Olympics Posters. According to Pollack, only posters printed by the Olympic Organizing Committee have real value. There's the wild card. As Levi's products, the reader's posters are private and unofficial.

Another wild card is that "condition, always important, is not the be-all and end-all" for posters. In other words, having the right stuff trumps mint condition. According to Pollack: "Mint posters are the unused ones. You will see condition issues in high-end posters." Many of the best posters have had quality restoration, and that's OK in the business.

Of the Levis posters, he counsels: "Enjoy them. They're not great, but commercial." Ebay...



**A meatball mixture**

Dear Ask Annie,  
I would like to try making meatballs with different kinds of meats. Do you have a recipe for this type of meatball?

*Rachel from Bryn Mawr, Pa.*

Dear Rachel,  
I have a very good recipe for meatballs from a niece of mine. She uses lean ground beef, ground veal and ground pork. I am sure you

will be pleased with the results. I use this recipe when I am serving pasta to a crowd. Serve with the sauce of your choice. —Annie

**MEATBALLS**

- 1 lb. ground lean beef
  - 1/2 lb. ground veal
  - 1/2 lb. ground pork
  - 2 lg. eggs
  - 1 cup freshly grated Pecorino Romano cheese
  - 1 1/2 T. chopped Italian parsley
  - 1/2 small garlic clove, peeled and minced, optional
  - 2 cup breadcrumbs
  - 2 cup lukewarm water
  - Salt (preferably Kosher or Sea Salt) and freshly ground pepper to taste
  - 1 cup fine-quality olive oil
- Combine the beef, veal, and pork in a large bowl. Add

the eggs, cheese, parsley, garlic and salt and pepper to taste. Using your hands, blend the ingredients together. Blend the bread-crumbs into the meat mixture. Slowly add water, 1 cup at a time, until the mixture is quite moist. Shape the meat mixture into balls (2 1/2- to 3-inch). Heat the oil in a large sauté pan. When the oil is very hot but not smoking, fry the meatballs in batches. When the bottom half of the meatball is very brown and slightly crisp, turn and cook the top half. Remove from the heat and drain on paper towels. Lower the cooked meatballs into simmering spaghetti or marinara sauce and cook for 15 minutes. Serve over pasta or on their own. Makes 28 meatballs.

## Boardwalk Empire takes over AC

■ Offbeat owner buys Resorts Atlantic City

### Book on AC's Black Heritage

Nelson Johnson wrote his second Atlantic City book, *The Northside*, to finish and broaden the tale he told in *Boardwalk Empire*, the local history that's become a national sensation through its jazzed-up adaptation as an HBO series. This time he's telling the story of the city's black residents, from the city's founding as a seaside resort to its modern incarnation as a casino town, in the book, subtitled *African Americans and the Creation of Atlantic City*. *The Northside* was released by Plexus Publishing, which also published *Boardwalk Empire*, which made it into the Top 25 on *The New York Times'* influential best-seller list. Johnson, 62, a state superior court judge in his day job, started right in on "The Northside" shortly after he finished "Boardwalk Empire." But it took a good eight years to research and write the new book—after he spent more than 15 years of


part-time work on the first one. —*Press of Atlantic City*

### Chelsea Hotel Lives On

Timing may not have been fortuitous for the Chelsea Hotel—the spectacular creation of noted hotelier Curtis Bashaw that opened in Atlantic City during the crest of the recession. Like all businesses, the 331-room boutique-style hotel struggled to make ends meet. But the first non-gaming hotel constructed during AC's casino era has refinanced its loan and is here to stay. The Chelsea was unveiled in the summer of 2008. It includes the combined, conjoined \$110-million renovations of the former Howard Johnson's and Holiday Inn hotels into one building with 1950s and '60s style motifs. It has two restaurants (Teplitzsky's and Chelsea Prime), and its fifth floor includes a 15,000-square-foot pool area with private cabanas, a nightclub, game room and fireplace-equipped living room. —*Atlantic City Weekly*

### New NJ Casino Owner is Known for Offbeat Marketing

He once pitted Atlantic City casino customers against a tic-tac-toe-playing chicken. He used billboards of Fidel Castro to hype a Cuban-themed restaurant, and hired a Barack Obama look-alike to tout the opening of a casino in Indiana. Now Dennis Gomes has bought Resorts Atlantic City. Now that the financially ailing casino has changed hands, folks should expect the unexpected. Gomes says skepticism over Resorts' future is wrong. He says buying the casino for \$35 million will enable him and partner Morris Bailey to operate with much lower expenses than the previous owners. Gomes plans to re-brand Resorts with a *Boardwalk Empire* theme, capitalizing on the hit HBO series about Prohibition-era Atlantic City. —*Bloomberg*

**Atlantic City.** The Atlantic City Hilton, the city's smallest casino, stopped paying its mortgage last July and is now in default to the tune of about \$50 million. An initial foreclosure hearing was postponed in January while Hilton and U.S. Bank try to reach a settlement. If they can't reach a settlement, a long legal battle is expected before the bank can foreclose on the Boardwalk casino.

**Pennsylvania.** After failing to launch the last four years, Pennsylvania's Gaming Control Board has stripped Foxwoods of its casino license. Commissioners voted 6-1 to revoke the \$50 million slot license for the proposed South Philadelphia casino. It's

the first time that the state has removed a gaming license and, with no precedent and no clear provision in Pennsylvania's gaming laws, no one's sure what will happen next. But one thing that everyone agrees on is that lots of lawyers will get involved, since the developers have reportedly already invested \$182 million into the venture.

**Missouri.** Gambling regulators have unanimously ratified Cape Girardeau in the southeast corner of Missouri for the location of that state's 13th casino.

**Mexico.** Playboy has opened a \$7.5 million casino in the Mexican resort city of Cancun. The 1,200-square-meter casino offers slots, sports betting, and table games, including roulette, poker, and blackjack.

# Good Housekeeping

**Spring Garden Sauté**

With its bright colors and flavors, this warm dish of spring vegetables tastes even better than it looks.

- 2 pounds asparagus, trimmed and cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
- 8 ounces sugar snap peas, strings removed
- 1 tablespoon margarine or butter
- 1 pound radishes, each cut into quarters
- 4 tablespoons snipped fresh chives
- Salt and pepper

1. Heat large covered saucepot of salted water to boiling on high. Fill large bowl with ice water; set aside. To saucepot, add asparagus and snap peas; cook 4 minutes. Drain vegetables; cool in bowl of ice water. Drain vegetables well. 2. Mean-

while, in 12-inch skillet, heat margarine on medium until melted. Add radishes, 1/4 teaspoon salt, and 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper; cook 10 minutes or until tender-crisp. Transfer to bowl; keep warm. To same skillet, add asparagus, snap peas, 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper; cook 5 minutes or until tender-crisp, stirring occasionally. Stir in 2 tablespoons chives. Transfer to serving bowl; arrange radishes around edge. Sprinkle with remaining chives. Makes 10 side-dish servings.

**Tip:** Asparagus and snap peas can be cooked through Step 1 up to one day ahead. Place in plastic storage bag and refrigerate until ready to use.





## COMBAT STRESS

### Cell-Phone apps help

If you are struggling with stress issues or are just back from deployment and aren't sure how you're doing, there are two new cell-phone applications (apps) that could be of help: The Telephone Mood Tracker and the Tactical Breathing Trainer. These two apps placed first and second in the Apps4Army competition in the General Wellness category. Both apps are free.

The Telehealth Mood Tracker (also called the T2) is designed to track the emotional health of those who are post-deployment or are undergoing treatment for any type of stress. The app helps keep track of changes in moods, emotions and behavior in different environmental settings, and the results of therapy and med-

ications. The big benefit from this app is that you no longer have to try to keep notes about how you're feeling at a particular time so the information can be relayed to your doctor later. It will be much easier, too, to figure out patterns. Note your information on the spot, and you'll have it for future reference. This particular app only works with Android right now, but a version for iPhone is coming next year. You can get it at [t2health.org](http://t2health.org) (put T2 Mood Tracker in the search box). This site also has screen shots so you know what you're getting. The Tactical Breathing Trainer (sometimes called the iBreathe) is used to get control of responses to stress: emotions, hemirate and more. It includes exercises, practice sessions, a place to insert your own notes and charts of your progress. This app is written for iPhone (you need iTunes) and is free. Look for it at [itunes.apple.com](http://itunes.apple.com).

Android development will come soon.






rules to encourage honest charity games. With the ordinance, the council hopes to avoid the kind of political embarrassment that came with Marina Bay Bingo, which opened last year pledging to support veterans through an American Legion post. But the city and the landlord reportedly forced out Marina Bay Bingo after just two months following revelations about the post commander's alleged criminal history and questions about the operation's nonprofit status. Richmond's ordinance doubles local limits on game winnings to \$500, requires criminal background checks for all charity leaders and Bingo managers, and requires about 20 percent of Bingo proceeds go to the organization's stated charitable purpose. —*Contra Costa Times, California*

### Virginia Internet Cafes May Threaten Bingo

Bingo halls cried foul over a new form of gaming quietly popping up around Virginia Beach, Virginia known as Internet Sweepstakes Cafes. The Virginia Bingo Association said lawmakers should ban the cafes that currently enjoy no regulation. Association chairman Ron Smith said the cafes siphoned away customers from Bingo halls, which means charities are suffering. Unlike the cafes, Bingo halls must adhere to a list of state regulations. State law lets only nonprofit groups host Bingo games and 10 percent of Bingo proceeds must go to charity groups like food pantries, children's hospitals and volunteer fire departments. Sweepstakes cafes are run by companies selling Internet time that comes with entries in sweepstakes. —*WVEC-TV, Virginia*

#### Bingo Battle Divides Elderly Residents

In a series of tit-for-tat claims and counter claims, allegations involving late-night partying, loud music, vandalism and even one resident bringing home men for sex, have soured relations between elderly residents of a sheltered housing complex. Problems started when a woman moved in and began hosting regular Bingo sessions in the common room. Her crime was not the Bingo, but that she invited outsiders to come in the form of family and friends. Some of the residents, fiercely protective of their rooms, were infuriated, and sought redress through official channels. A series of ever more lurid accusations followed.

The woman who introduced the Bingo remains defiant and said she will not be intimidated. "Our Bingo will carry on and it will not stop me," she said. "I don't want to vegetate for the rest of my life." —*Telegraph, London, UK*







#### Topeka Woman Uses Buying Formula for Lotto Win

A woman from Topeka who works for the state of Kansas had her "holiday dream" fulfilled when she discovered she had the winning ticket in the Kansas Lottery's \$1 million Holiday Millionaire Raffle. The woman, whose identity wasn't released, took home \$700,000 after 30 percent of the winnings was withheld for state and federal taxes. Kansas allows a lottery winner to claim a prize anonymously. The 61-year-old woman said she studied the strategy used by last year's million-dollar winner—a Wichita resident—and realized she needed to purchase a number of tickets in a wide distribution area. Players choose six numbers from 1 to 42, and can win one of eight different prizes, ranging from \$2 to the grand prize of \$1,000 a week for life. The third number drawn for the game in question was 6, but was incorrectly reported by the Virginia drawing staff as a 9. As a consequence of this error, prizes were paid out for Win For Life lottery tickets bearing either 3, 8, 6, 17, 21, 30, Free Ball: 31 or 3, 8, 9, 17, 21, 30, Free Ball: 31. —*Virginia Lottery*


