





Lithographs

A reader describing himself as an "artist, scholar and author" e-mailed a beef about our comments concerning prints. To recap, a reader doubted her print was original and asked how to have it verified. We wrote: "Smart collectors know that, in prints, 'original' is a slippery concept. A painting is easier to pin down: only one is the real thing. Your gift print may indeed be an original licensed by (the artist) but it was produced as a multiple." The complainant wrote that lithographs are originals because the artist draws (in this case) on a stone that he calls a tool. Citing U.S. Copyright law, etc., he added, "Lithographs printed from that tool are original works of visual

art."

My original position holds. Legalese aside, for 99 percent of the public, original means one of a kind. Hardly worth getting one's undies in a twist. But now you know a contrary POV.

FYI: *Modern and Contemporary Prints: A Practical Guide to Collecting* by Phoebe Phillips and Tom Robb (*Antique Collectors' Club*, \$40) is an excellent reference on methods and buying.



Carrot Soup
 ■ A new published recipe book!

Dear Annie,

Do you have a recipe for a carrot soup? My Grandmother made me a carrot soup and I loved it. I would like to try it, but Grandmother is no longer with us. Can you help me? Thanks a lot.
 Frieda from New Orleans

Dear Frieda,

Here's a recipe for a Cream of Carrot Soup that was given to me many years ago. Hope you like it too. —Annie

CREAM OF CARROT SOUP

- 1/2 c. celery, finely chopped
- 1/2 c. finely chopped onion
- 1/4 lb. butter
- 3/4 lb. carrots, chopped
- 5 1/2 c. water
- 7 chicken bouillon cubes
- 1 lb. potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 1/2 c. milk
- 1/2 c. flour
- 1/3 tsp. pepper
- 1/8 tsp. nutmeg
- 1 T. lemon juice
- Chopped parsley, optional
- Paprika, optional

In a large soup pot, sauté the celery and onions in the butter for 5 minutes over a low heat. In a separate pot, cook the carrots in the water and bouillon cubes until almost done. Add the potatoes and continue cooking until both are done. Drain and reserve the liquid. Puree the vegetables, using a small amount of the reserved liquid. Add flour to the onion-celery mixture. Blend well into butter and cook several minutes being careful not to let brown. Add the vegetable liquid and milk to the flour mixture and cook over a high heat. Whisk constantly until a medium to thin sauce forms. Immediately reduce the heat and add the puree mixture, pepper and nutmeg. Simmer for 10 to 15 minutes, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking. Add lemon juice to taste and serve hot. Garnish with parsley and paprika, if desired. Makes 8 servings.

A Stage Show boom in AC

Stage Show Comeback in AC

The big stage show is making a comeback in Atlantic City. Long synonymous with Las Vegas, the lavish in-house production had faded away on the East Coast in favor of top-name headliners who would play a casino for one or two nights, then move on. But this year, Atlantic City is reaching back to the past to bring back stage shows and draw more customers. Seven of Atlantic City's 11 casinos now have regular stage shows or will be rolling them out later this year. Casino executives see the shows as a valuable marketing tool and a cheaper option than top-name entertainers. And customers see the shows as a welcome return to the Atlantic City they once knew and loved. —

NJ Gov. Vetoes Online Gambling Bill

New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie vetoed a bill that would have made his state the first in the U.S. to re-introduce online gambling. But he also suggested the state legislature could revive the effort by asking voters to approve the measure by referendum. The bill would have allowed New Jersey residents to place bets through web sites run by casino companies in Atlantic City, the only place gambling is allowed in New Jersey under the state constitution. State legislatures across the country have started work on similar bills in a bid to generate revenue. But Christie said he had a number of "significant concerns" with the legislation. He rejected the theory that by placing servers in Atlantic City, the bill would satisfy constitutional requirements. "If the Legislature believes that expanding gambling outside of Atlantic City is in the best interests of the State of New Jersey, it should place the question on the ballot for the voters to decide," Christie said in the veto message. — *Wall Street Journal*

Trump One Cardholder Wins Big

Teresa Piotti, 78, of Williamstown, New Jersey, won \$200,000 in Trump Entertainment's month-long promotion that guaranteed one lucky Trump One cardholder \$1 million slot dollars or a cash option. When her name was announced during a live drawing, Piotti said she was surprised, but was more excited to hear she was not in trouble for anything. "I thought they came to lock me up," she said, after explaining to Trump Taj Mahal Casino Resort employees that she did not understand why they asked her to follow them to another area of the casino. The in-casino promotion resulted in countless entries by cardholders. While the grand prize was an instant \$1 million slot dollars to play in any of the Trump-owned casinos, there was also a cash option. If the winner opted for the cash, as Piotti did, he or she would be presented with three envelopes and they'd have to pick one without knowing what the cash prize was inside. The winner could have won \$200,000, \$225,000 or \$250,000. — *Press of Atlantic City*

Northern Nevada. The Meruelo Group, an investment company based in Downey, Calif., is buying the Grand Sierra Hotel-Casino in Reno. The 145-acre resort casino has been owned by a subsidiary of JPMorgan Chase since October 2008, when the former owner, Grand Sierra Resort Corp., went bankrupt after buying the property from Caesars Entertainment for \$151 million in 2005. It's worth an estimated \$70 million today. Terms of the sale haven't been disclosed. In other northern Nevada news, the Las Vegas-based 777 Gaming, which operates several small casinos in rural Nevada, has acquired the 91-room Carson Station hotel-casino in Carson City for an undisclosed price.

Atlantic City. Atlantic City's 2010 visitor volume decreased by 6.2% to 26.6 million. However, gambling revenue, though declining for the fifth straight year (3.6%, \$134 per visitor), dropped less than expected, slowing the trend

from 2009's 8% decline. Bus traffic was down 13%, accounting for less than 3.8 million of the visitor count. Analysts were cautiously encouraged by the totals, which might indicate that Atlantic City's five-year attempt to reinvent itself as a higher-end destination could be materializing, especially in light of significant recent competition from Delaware, New York, and Pennsylvania (which analysts believe will overtake Atlantic City in gaming revenues sometime in 2012). The drop-off is primarily in the low-rolling day-tripper; A.C. is earning more from fewer, and bigger, gamblers.

South Dakota. The South Dakota ban on smoking in bars, restaurants, and casinos that went into effect in November is being blamed for a nearly 17% decline in the state's video lottery revenue during the same four months. In some reporting regions, the decline has been in excess of 25%.

- 4 teaspoons (grated) fresh ginger, peeled
- 2 teaspoons (grated) fresh lemon peel
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed with garlic press
- 4 racks (about 1 pound each) pork baby back ribs
- 2 cups BBQ sauce

1. Preheat oven to 350 F. In cup,

mix ginger, lemon peel, salt and garlic until combined. Rub ginger mixture all over ribs.

2. Place ribs in large (15 1/2-by-11 1/2-inch) roasting pan, overlapping slightly. Pour 2 cups boiling water into roasting pan. Cover pan tightly with foil. Steam ribs 1 hour.

3. Carefully remove foil from roasting pan (escaping steam is very hot). Remove ribs from roasting pan and discard water. Ribs may be grilled immediately, or refrigerated up to 2 days before grilling.

4. Place ribs, meat side up, on grill over medium heat, cook 5 minutes, turning once. Turn ribs over, brush with some BBQ sauce and grill 5 minutes. Turn ribs over again, brush with more BBQ sauce, and grill 5 minutes longer. Cut racks into 2-rib portions and serve with remaining sauce.







Road Trip

■ *Take the game we love on the road*

Remember the late radio commentator Paul Harvey? Every year he had certain scripts he did that saluted a special day or the season. I always looked forward to his "Ode to Spring" or his stories at Christmastime. Well, I've been doing this column long enough that I have begun to have some regular ideas that are worth repeating.

I recently got an email (at bobonbingo@earthlink.net) from Julie in San Bernardino, California. She wrote to tell me how much fun she and her husband had on a long road trip last year, driving across the U.S., playing Bingo as they went. In part, she writes:

"My husband and I took your advice in planning a cross-country road trip. We went on the Internet, as you suggested, using search engines, to find Bingo halls in the cities where we would be staying.

"We found motels close to Bingo halls and started each day early enough to get checked into the motel in time to go to Bingo. And, because many of the venues served food, we often had supper as we played. At one location I hit a big coverall. I made enough money to pay most of the gasoline on the first half of our trip. I hope you will again, this year, remind people about the joys of playing Bingo on the road."

Thanks, Julie, and that is exactly what I am going to do. In case you missed my thoughts in previous years, let's let Julie and her husband's experience serve as a good lesson for all of us. Nearly every medium-sized city in the country has some form of Bingo. You don't have to go to Atlantic City or Las Vegas to play the game we all love the best.

When you are planning a road trip, get out a good map and try

to figure out where you want to spend the night, or at least approximately where. Go on the Internet and look for Bingo in those cities. When you find a hall, then see if the day you are going to be there matches the hall's schedule. Find an affordable motel close to the hall, then make some phone calls. Usually, the front desk person at the motel can be of great help.

See if the hall serves supper. Find out the rates. Then mark down that location on your cross-country map.

And, as I have mentioned before, there is an additional layer of fun awaiting you.

When you go to these cities and play Bingo, you will be discovering new friends.

You'll be spending time with the people in that region. Listen for the interesting accents. Savor the local cooking. Your experiences at playing Bingo in Evansville, Indiana, or Bozeman, Montana, or Conyers, Georgia, or Palm Springs, California, can really enhance your trip. These moments can be, to paraphrase Humphrey Bogart in *The Maltese Falcon*, "the things of which dreams are made."

For any Veteran

■ *Your story is important, too*

We recently lost the last surviving veteran from World War I. His name was Frank Woodruff Buckles, and he was 110 years old. He'd been so determined to serve his country that he'd lied to multiple Army recruiting offices in multiple states before he was finally accepted and sent to Europe. He was barely 16 years old when he went in. They made him an ambulance driver.

During World War II, he spent three years in a Japanese prisoner-of-war camp.

His life has been made into a film documentary: *Pershing's Last Patriot: The Frank Woodruff Buckles Story*, which will be out sometime this year.

Your experiences are just as important, and the Library of Congress wants your personal account. For

more than 10 years, the Veterans History Project has assisted veterans in telling of their firsthand experiences in wars and archiving those for future generations.

The project covers these time periods:

World War I (1914-1920), World War II (1939-1946), Korean War (1950-1955), Vietnam War (1961-1975), Persian Gulf War (1990-1995), Afghanistan and Iraq conflicts (2001-present)

There are a number of ways you can tell your story: photos, scrapbooks, postcards, journals or memoirs, letters, military documents, or taped audio or video interviews. Your story, as well as any of the memorabilia you contribute, will be archived forever.

To get the kit, call the Veterans History Project at 888-371-5848 or go online to download it at www.loc.gov/vets. You'll need to send your completed project via FedEx, UPS or DHL instead of the Post Office.




Case study shows exciting data


Q: Is *Dallas* going to be remade for television? What can you tell me about it? —*Kyra L., Tacoma, Wash.*

could bring on this sudden sensitivity—an outbreak of mold or mildew due to overly damp weather; a sudden influx of dust or other particles from a long-idle air conditioner, fan or other device being turned on; new cleaning solvents being used at the halls—the list goes on and on.

You should also keep in mind that people can develop allergies at any time of their lives, and you may now be sensitive to some airborne pollutant that never bothered you before.

The logical first step is to make an appointment with an allergist and get tested to pinpoint specifically what you are sensitive to. Once that is determined, you and the allergist can decide what the best treatment is for you.

According to the lawsuit, WABC-TV, the ABC network station in New York, broadcast the winning numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, with the mega ball 12, for the multistate Mega Millions lottery of June 19, 2009. The correct numbers were 4, 9, 12, 16 and 46, with a mega ball of 44, according to the Mega Millions website. The woman was under the impression that she had won \$250,000 as a result of the broadcast, the suit states, adding that she was "severely damaged" by relying on the "false and incorrect" lottery results. —The Record, New Jersey
