



Metro Tickets

Q: I was in Paris in 1966 and brought back French francs and many Metro tickets. Any collector value? —*Shirley, Tucson, Ariz.*

A: Here's where completed sales on eBay can tell you a lot. Type in "French francs" and see how circa 1966 sells. Note that value is still minimal. The Metro tickets may sell online, though they will be a harder sell.

Q: I just got these commemorative plates and know nothing about them. Any info? —*Wendy, Patten, Maine*

A: During the Kennedy presidential years, many companies made some version of porcelain or pottery commemorative (mainly plates) honoring the president and his wife. Even Wedgwood participated, making JFK Jasperware items!

The reader's set was made by Daniel Greene of New York in 1963. The line was called JFK Fabcraft. The pair of commemorative plates, one of each of the Kennedys, is unusual because the plates are metal. The set is also unusual because there is a plate for each Kennedy. JFK is usually found as a single. Resale value on his single is under \$10. A motivated buyer may pay more for the set, if in excellent condition.



Fruit Pie

A great summer treat

Dear Ask Annie,

Can you recommend a recipe for a fruit pie? We love all kinds of fruit and I thought this would be a good idea for a summer treat. Thank you.

**Ginger from Grand Rapids,
Michigan**

Dear Ginger,

Here's one of my favorite summer pies. The choice of fruits is yours. However, I will make the following suggestions. —*Annie*

SUMMER FRUIT PIE

- 1 c. milk
- 1/4 c. sugar
- 1 1/2 T. cornstarch
- 2 egg yolks, slightly beaten
- 2 T. butter
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 9-inch pie pastry shell
- 1 c. blueberries
- 1 c. blackberries and/or raspberries
- 12 figs, cut in half
- 1/3 c. fruit jam
- 1 tsp. fresh lemon juice

Bring the milk to a simmer in a cast iron or heavy bottomed saucepan. In a large bowl, combine the sugar and cornstarch. Add the hot milk a little at a time, whisking constantly. Return to saucepan and cook over a medium heat until the mixture thickens slightly. This should take 8 to 10 minutes. Whisk in the egg yolks, then cook for 2 minutes. Remove the saucepan

from the heat. Stir in the butter. Allow it cool to room temperature, occasionally stirring. Add the vanilla, cover and chill thoroughly.

Pre-bake the pie pastry according to the instructions on the package. Allow to cool. Spread a thin layer of the pastry cream over the bottom of the pie shell. Add the berries and figs on top of the pastry cream. In a small pan, combine the jam and lemon juice and bring to a boil over a medium to high heat. Allow to cool for a few minutes. Brush this mixture on top of the fruit. Serve immediately. Serves 6 to 8.




Hoping for new glory

■ Two AC casinos go retro

Trop Goes for Bigger Chip

Tropicana Casino and Resort is seeking regulatory approval from the New Jersey Casino Control Commission to introduce \$25,000 betting chips as it continues its new strategy of pursuing big-stakes gamblers. However, this ultimate symbol of high-rollerdom would not be exclusive to Tropicana. Caesars Atlantic City and sister property Harrah's Resort already have \$25,000 chips for their craps and blackjack tables. (Atlantic City gaming chips come in denominations of \$1, \$2.50, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$25, \$100, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000, \$20,000 and \$25,000.) As valuable as \$25,000 chips may be, they are small change compared to "plaques"—larger sized gaming tokens used for higher denominations—that some casinos have at their table games. Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa, for instance, uses plaques, which may be the size of a playing card and run as high as \$100,000. —*Press of Atlantic City*

Two AC Casinos Going Retro

A casino's size and freshness often equate to market success. Yet two of the smallest and oldest gambling halls in AC—Resorts and Trump Marina—are banking on old themes to bring them new glory. At Resorts, gaming-industry veteran Dennis Gomes—who with JEMB Realty Corp., of New York, bought Atlantic City's first casino from its lenders in December for \$31 million—envisioned a return to the Roaring Twenties, complete with flapper dresses (designed by him) for cocktail waitresses and period uniforms for bellmen, butlers, valet staff and table dealers. At Trump Marina, new owner Landry's Inc., of Houston, plans to bring the Golden Nugget brand back to Atlantic City for the first time since 1987, according to CEO Tilman Fertitta. The company's Golden Nugget hotel-casinos in Las Vegas and Laughlin, Nevada, feature a retro-Vegas look. —*The Philadelphia Inquirer*

House of Blues Scores as 'Top Venue'

The House of Blues (HOB) at Showboat Atlantic City is one of the country's premier live music venues, according to *Pollstar Magazine's* "Top 100 Club Venues" list, which documents ticket sales. In 2007, HOB topped ticket sales, reaching a permanent place on the Top 100 list. In 2008, the venue was ranked #38 worldwide and has continued to move up the list, landing itself the remarkable #20 ranking with more than 90,000 tickets sold in 2010. Additionally, the House of Blues at Showboat is the #1 most successful venue in the HOB portfolio. It has played host to such musical talents as Motorhead, Diddy Dirty Money, Blues King of Chicago Buddy Guy, and eight-time Grammy winner Chaka Khan. —*PR Newswire*

The life of a dauber

It's time we settled some issues about daubers. First of all, new daubers should be started by tapping the felt end several times against a piece of paper, not hammering forcefully like trying to drive a rusty nail as Kate does, irritating everyone in hearing range. Kate's favorite is a fat pink elephant head that she transfers from dauber to dauber as they become empty. He looks better on pink daubers than on green ones if you care about color coordination. I like to park the elephant head on top of Barney, my lucky Bingo dragon. Barney enjoys wearing any dauber top as a hat while I am playing a game and thinks the elephant head is elegant even though it dwarfs him.

I had a dauber once shaped like a giraffe and liked it so well I tried to refill it. The top broke as I was prying it off and I had to discard the whole colorful mess. I have to admit it was hard to grip and had a mean tendency to fall over.

Kate got several round daubers, but I don't like them. They are hard to grip and tend to make you dab with a fist instead of your fingers—which destroys the lightheartedness of Bingo. Once Kate got me a whole set of daubers with my name imprinted on them. They are all right, but somehow I object to sitting looking at a whole row of REVA in front of me. They cause a lot of comment and people often ask, "Is that your name?" To which I am tempted to give a smart-mouth answer like, "No, I just thought it would be neat to have that printed on my daubers," or "My name is Bernadette, but that wouldn't fit in the space."

It looks like something a man might carry. One thing I occasionally run across is daubers that daub marks other than round daubs. I have one that daubs a star, but it doesn't like to flow freely or it dumps a whole lot of ink at once—which is a nuisance and means you'd better have a napkin handy. I am looking for one that daubs a dollar sign—wouldn't that be neat? I'd keep it forever.

Atlantic City. Reporters got their first preview of the \$2.4 billion Revel Hotel-Casino being built on the Boardwalk. Like the Cosmopolitan in Las Vegas, Revel figures to be the last megaresort to open in Atlantic City for many years. Along with a 47-story hotel tower that soars above the other AC casinos with 1,100 rooms, a 150,000-square-foot casino, 12 restaurants, retail shops, two nightclubs, pools, and a spa, Revel will feature a two-acre outdoor "rooftscape," complete with a "pine grove" of more than 30,000 live trees and plants. The hotel lobby will be on the same level, six stories high, with an adjacent three-story glass-enclosed nightclub. Revel is on schedule to open in mid-2012.

Michigan. A federal judge has ordered the Bay Mills Indian Community to close its controversial casino in Vanderbilt, Mich., which opened last November without a gaming license.

The Bay Mills tribe claimed it purchased the casino site with funds from its land trust, making it Indian land. But the judge rejected the claim, siding with the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, which operates a competing casino 30 miles from Vanderbilt.

Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania's Gaming Control Board voted (6-1) to grant a gaming license to the Nematolin Woodlands Resort in the southwest section of the state, thereby nixing a casino at a hotel located two miles from the historic Civil War site at Gettysburg National Military Park. Civil War historians and preservation groups emphatically opposed the casino.

Bahamas. Ground was broken in March on the \$3.4 billion Baha Mar Hotel-Casino, the largest project of its kind in the Caribbean, which will include the region's largest casino. The plans call for four hotels with 2,250 rooms, a convention center, a mall, and a golf course. Projected to generate 10% of the Bahamas gross domestic product, Baha Mar is being financed by the Export-Import Bank of China. The megaresort is scheduled to open in December 2014.

China. According to the *Wall Street Journal*, MGM China Holdings Ltd., the joint venture between MGM Resorts International and Pansy Ho, is planning to raise up to US \$1 billion in an initial public offering on the Hong Kong stock exchange.

Juicy peaches, hot off the grill, are perfect with tender seared meat.

1	tablespoon	curry powder

1	clove garlic, crushed with	garlic press

1. In cup, stir curry powder, brown sugar, olive oil, salt, cinnamon, pepper and garlic.
2. With hands, rub both sides of pork chops with curry mixture.
3. Brush cut side of peach halves and 1 side of chops with some jam. Place peaches, brushed side down, and chops, brushed side up, on grill over medium heat; cook 5 minutes.
4. Turn chops and peaches over and brush grilled side of chops with some jam; cook 5 minutes longer. Remove peaches from grill when browned and place on platter. Turn chops and brush with remaining jam; cook 2 to 3 minutes longer, until chops are browned on the outside and still slightly pink on the inside. Place chops on platter with peaches; garnish with arugula. Serves 4.





The Kitchen Diva

GREEN TOMATO AND ORANGE RELISH

4	medium green tomatoes
1	large purple or Vidalia onion
1	cup orange marmalade
2	cups dark brown sugar
1/2	cup apple cider vinegar
1/8	teaspoon red pepper flakes

Green Tomatoes

■ *The fruit of the vegetable patch*

Every year, my small vegetable garden produces far more tomatoes than I can possibly use. As the season wanes, an abundance of green tomatoes forlornly hang on the vine looking for enough sun to turn them into red jewels. I've begun searching for unique ways to use green tomatoes as a vegetable and as a fruit in my recipes.

Scientifically, tomatoes are classified as a fruit, but since they don't contain the sweet flavor of most fruits and are typically used in savory dishes, they're legally classified as a vegetable.

Tomatoes are low in calories and a good source of vitamins C, A and K. They are also a very good source of molybdenum, potassium, manganese, dietary fiber, chromium and vitamin B-1. In addition, tomatoes contain lycopene, which has antioxidant and cancer-preventing properties.

My recipe for Green Tomato and Orange Relish uses green tomatoes like a pickled vegetable. It freezes well, and makes a delicious change from traditional cranberry relish for holiday meals.

The spices and flavors of my Green Tomato Spice Cake act as a showcase for the tomato's fruit-like qualities. Whether you decide to use your abundance of green tomatoes like a vegetable or a fruit, you can't go wrong with these wonderful recipes!

1. Core the bottom of the green tomato and cut them into quarters. Peel the onion and cut it into quarters. Using a food processor, pulse the green tomato and onion 8 to 10 times, until the pieces become small ("pickle-relish" size). Do not puree.

2. Using a 4-quart, heavy-bottomed pot, put in all the ingredients at once. Cook over low heat for 15 minutes, stirring until blended and the sugar begins to dissolve.

3. Turn the heat to medium and cook for 30 to 40 minutes, stirring occasionally. The relish should be syrupy and slightly thick. If it does not seem to have thickened enough, cook the relish 10 minutes more.

4. Cool for 2 hours, and then put the relish in an air-tight container and refrigerate it. The relish can be refrigerated for two weeks. You also can place the cooled relish into plastic zip-lock storage bags and freeze for up to 6 months. Makes 5 cups of relish.







Sharing wins

Video Lotto Debated in Texas

Texas state senator Juan "Chuy" Hinojosa has filed legislation that would legalize video lottery games, a form of slot machine, at racetracks in Texas. Currently there are 13 licensed racetracks in the state of Texas. Senator Hinojosa believes Texas is facing a large deficit, and video gaming slot machines would add an extra boost to the state economy as well as create jobs. Senator Hinojosa says Texans are leaving the state to go and gamble in neighboring states like Nevada and Oklahoma, and this legislation could keep Texans in Texas. —*Action 4 News, Texas*

Store Owner Charged with Ticket Theft

The owner of a liquor store in North Point, Maryland, was arrested and charged with grand theft, petty theft and fraud after she was caught stealing an undercover agent's winning lottery ticket worth \$10,000. A lottery security investigator, acting on a tip, took a winning ticket to the store, but was told the ticket was not a winning number. Police said when the storeowner scanned it, the lottery terminal made a loud noise, which is normal when a winning ticket is cashed in. Investigators said the horn is loud enough for the hearing impaired to hear. The storeowner reportedly told the undercover agent that the ticket wasn't a winner and, later that day, tried to cash in the scratch-off ticket for herself, detectives said. This storeowner wasn't alone; lottery officials said that a dozen Maryland retailers got caught in their sting operation. —*Lottery Post*

Wrong Button Brings \$300,000 Win

Bobbie Ware is no longer upset over a wrong lottery ticket. The 84-year-old woman won \$300,000 after pushing the wrong button on a Georgia lottery ticket vending machine. Ware says she intended to play a different game, but bought a Taxes Paid scratch-off ticket instead. Lottery officials say Ware plans to share her winnings with her family, which includes four children and 10 grandchildren. The former social worker

says her good luck "still hasn't sunk in." —*WANE-TV, Fort Wayne, Indiana*

Lotto Supports Veterans in Missouri

The Missouri House has endorsed a proposed constitutional amendment creating a new lottery game to benefit veterans. Revenues from the Missouri Lottery currently are directed to education. The house proposal would ask voters in 2012 whether to create a new lottery ticket, with the revenues going to the Veterans Commission capital improvement fund which runs seven nursing homes that have a total 1,350 beds. The proposal is sponsored by House Republican Sheila Solon, who says the veterans fund could run out of money in 2013 unless new sources of money are found. Several other states already have lottery games whose proceeds go to veterans. At press time the proposal had received first-round approval and needed another vote before it could move to the state senate. —*The Republic, Columbus, Indiana*





