Sad irons

Q: Our old cast iron cobbler's pedestal has six differing shoe molds. Any value? A person from Texas told us yes, especially in that area. —*Cybercollector, Rock Island, Ill.*

A: Imagine a stand with sole-shaped protrusions sticking straight up on posts. Readers who have visited a shoe repair shop or seen an old-fashioned shoe shine stand will know the look.

Considered a primitive antique, such iron stands are admired as much for their look as for historic impact. Appreciation is universal, not regional. On the other hand, an art fancier may pay more for visual appeal while a primitives collector considers aesthetics a bonus, but not critical. Depending on size, condition, marks, where/how sold and other variables, the unit could sell for \$150 to \$400 or more.

Q: Any info about age of an old sad iron from the Jas. Smart Mfg. Co. of Ontario, Canada? The company operated from 1854-1967. —*Angela, Ottawa*

A: Before electric irons, homemakers heated small heavy metal irons on a wood-burning stove to heat the metal. The hot surface was then pressed to the fabric; that's why it is called iron-ing!

"Sad" refers not to the washday burden on women, but is an old-fashioned word for heavy. You can imagine.

Jas. Smart sad irons are quite common. Placing age depends on the iron's size, technical refinements (is anything sandwiched between the iron plates?), handle and more.

For an informational site with a link to the Pressing Iron and Trivet Collectors of America, a collector club, key www.irons.com. Perhaps a local chapter can fill you in on the fine points of dating a sad iron.

Dear Brittany Ann,
Here's a recipe that made a big hit at a recent party I attended. I doctored the recipe a little by adding two additional types of ham (prosciutto and capicola). I am sure this will make a good

impression on your husband's boss. Good luck! —Annie

ITALIAN APPETIZER BITES

- 2 pkg. (8 oz. each) Pillsbury Crescent Rolls
- 1/4 lb. sliced deli ham, cut-up
- 1/4 lb. deli Genoa salami, cut-up
- 1/4 lb. sweet capicola ham, cut-up
- 1/4 lb. prosciutto ham, cut-up
- 1/2 lb. thinly sliced provolone cheese
- 7 eggs
- 1 c. grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 jars (12 oz.) roasted red peppers—drain well

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Coat a 13-by-9-by-2-inch glass baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. Unroll one package of

crescent rolls and use dough to line the bottom of prepared baking dish. Pinch the seams together with fingers. Cover rolls with half of the cut-up pieces of meat. Top with half of the provolone cheese slices. Lightly beat together 6 of the eggs and the Parmesan cheese, pour half evenly over the top. Top with half of the roasted red peppers. Repeat layering with the remaining meats, cheese, egg mixture and peppers. Top with remaining package of crescent rolls. Lightly beat the remaining egg and brush over the top of the crescent roll layer. Cover dish with foil; bake for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake for 30 more minutes. Cool for approximately 30 minutes. Cut into 32 squares and serve.

Good Housekeeping

Pierogies with Cabbage and Apple

Frozen potato pierogies go gourmet with a savory homemade sauce of golden sautéed onions, crunchy cabbage and tart Granny Smith apples.

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 medium onion, sliced
- 1 bag (10-ounce) shredded red cabbage
- 1 cup apple cider or apple juice
- 1 Granny Smith apple, cored and cut into 1/2-inch chunks
- 1 box (16-ounce) frozen potato and onion pierogies
- Salt and pepper

1. In a 10-inch skillet, heat 1 tablespoon oil on medium until hot. Add onion and cook 5 minutes or until golden and softened, stirring frequently. Increase heat

to medium-high; add cabbage, cider, 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper; cover and cook 5 minutes or until cabbage begins to wilt. Stir in apple; cover and cook 5 minutes or until cabbage is very tender.

2. Meanwhile, in covered 12-inch non-stick skillet, heat remaining 1 tablespoon oil with 1/2 cup water to simmering on medium. Add frozen pierogies; cover and cook 5 minutes. Uncover and cook 10 to 12 minutes longer or until pierogies are heated through and pale golden on both sides. Serve pierogies on cabbage mixture, sprinkled with freshly ground black pepper. Yields 4 main-dish servings.

■ Website offers new health journey

Positive news for those experiencing cancer, premature birth or serious illness and the people who care for them: Staying connected helps make health journeys easier!

Patients say going online to update family and friends about their health condition positively impacts their healing process. That may be one reason half a million people a day turn to a nonprofit that provides free websites to share

health news. A personal CaringBridge website helps patients and caregivers communicate with family and friends when juggling in-person visits and phone calls with medical appointments is challenging. An online journal allows loved ones to stay up to date before, during or after a hospital stay. Followers are notified whenever it is updated and can post messages of support and encouragement. CaringBridge users find that sharing experiences of coping with health challenges with others reduces feelings of isolation. Comparing Hospitals

Since last year we've been able to check out the quality of care at VA Medical Centers on the Department of Veterans Affairs website. Now the VA has added its information to the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services Hospital Compare website. The VA site was limited to medical and surgical statistics, but now we're able to compare local non-VA hospitals with the VA hospitals in additional areas such as heart issues and pneumonia.

To get the information you need, however, you might have to check both sites, as the information isn't posted on the same schedule. Neither site is intuitive for navigation, so instructions are below:

The Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services Hospital Compare (www.hospitalcompare.hhs.gov) has results for a number of categories of patient care issues, including death rates and patient experiences. Put in your ZIP code and select either General, Medical Conditions or Surgical Procedures—click on Find Hospitals. You'll be given a list of medical facilities within 50 miles.

Check the boxes down the left side for facilities you want to compare. If your closest VA Medical Center isn't within 50 miles, it won't show up. Instead use the ZIP code of the Medical Center. You'll find that a lot of categories don't show any VA information at all.

The VA site (www.hospitalcompare.va.gov) compares information between VA hospitals only. It tracks heart problems and pneumonia, as well as infection, respiratory issues and more. Pick a link on the left (Medical or Surgical), select your state from the drop-down menu and scroll down to click on an issue. The next screen will be a full explanation of the quality measure and what it means. If there are multiple centers in your state, you'll see the results for all of them. Your best bet is to gather the information from both sites and combine it.



flopped a pair, at least." Finally, Elezra took a good look at his cards and saw pocket 10s. "Now I know I have an overpair and I know he has either A-7, J-7, or he paired the 8," he said. The turn came the 8 of clubs, a dangerous card for Elezra because it potentially completed a full house with the 8s or a flush draw with the clubs. His opponent checked. Elezra checked behind him.

"When I saw I had the 10 of clubs, I took the free card," Elezra said. The river came the king of clubs, giving Elezra a flush. His opponent thought for a long time, then checked. "He was hoping I wouldn't bet," Elezra said. "I think he has three 8s, and when he checked like that, I made a value bet of \$4,800 because I don't think I can get more than that. He didn't have a check-raising style, so I wasn't worried about that." Elezra's opponent called and mucked his cards when he saw the flush. "He should've led on the turn," Elezra said. "That was his mistake. It would be very hard for me to call there, wondering if he had three 8s or a club draw. It would've been 50-50 that I would've mucked on the turn if he had bet into me. It depends on how much. If he had bet \$3,000, I'd call. If he bet big, I'd probably lay it down."

TABLE TALK

Up-and-down straight draw: Four cards to a straight that can be completed by a card to either end; also known as an open-ended straight draw.

Advice from a pro

Good advice from accomplished pro Eli Elezra: "Look at both of your cards." Elezra, who owns a World Series of Poker bracelet and has won a World Poker Tour main event, was laughing when he said it, but for several betting rounds in this hand he didn't know what he was holding and it almost cost him. With blinds at \$200-\$400 plus a \$50 ante in the WPT's \$15,000-buy-in Doyle Brunson World Poker Classic at Las Vegas' Bellagio in 2007, a player in middle position raised to \$1,200. Elezra raised to \$4,000. "When I raised him, I looked at just the two four-acrosses; I didn't look at the whole card," Elezra explained. "The way you see the cards with four-across is you either have 9-10 or two 10s or two 9s. I raised him just seeing that and hoping to take it right there." But his opponent called, and the two players took a flop of 8-7-2, two clubs. "Right there, I said to myself that even if I have the worst possibility with my cards that I didn't really look at, I still have an up-and-down straight draw or two overcards," Elezra said. His opponent checked. Elezra bet \$4,000. "I was betting without knowing what I had, so I was hoping to take it right there," said Elezra, a regular on the "High Stakes Poker" cash-game show. "That's why I bet so small. Then when he called me so fast, I realized the man

My chief reason for playing Bingo is the other players. I know it's a gambling game so I'm supposed to be in it for the winning of money, but somehow the other players capture my attention more than the exchange of money. The playing of Bingo seems to cross most economic and social class lines, although I doubt if I've ever seen a mega-rich type playing even in the high stakes games. Maybe they have their own private places to play. I'll never know about that.

At a neighborhood place, on the other hand, players can be heard exchanging news or recipes even at the most crucial moments. They keep up with each other and on their Bingo buddies who are not present that day. Sometimes it is possible to observe romances flourish or die. Robin is a very attractive young woman who showed up one day and caught the eye of all the men in the hall. She did not appear to be flirting and was attentive to her game cards. The next time I saw her, however, she sat with Larry, who up to that time had always been by himself. It was hard to tell if she was his date as she seemed to be spending her

own money—not that I would ever be nosey.

The next time I saw them, they were definitely together and he was making decisions for her about what games to play and how many cards to buy. She seemed too independent for that treatment, but what do I know? They are both lucky players and tend to win at least once each session. Robin did not win that day. They were together again the next week, but I suspected trouble in paradise. Robin did not look happy. Larry was his usual take charge self. Then Robin showed up with Tim, a young man she works with. Larry arrived by himself, sat nearby and glared. Robin seemed unaffected by his presence, laughed and enjoyed herself. The couple became the center of a group of spirited young people. Larry scowled and seemed determined to make a big win to show how unaffected he was by Robin's behavior. He bought ten wheel special cards and was hard put to keep track of all the numbers. He worked to keep up while Robin laughed and daubed her one card. I won the game. I was a little worried how Larry would react when I BINGOed as he seemed to be so de-

termined, but he congratulated me through clenched teeth. "Guess I'm just unlucky tonight," he said, throwing a glance at the laughing group.

Robin and Tim were together several times, then Robin was alone again. Larry was alone, too, and they carefully sat several tables apart. "What can I say?" Robin asked me. "I guess I'm just too competitive to be a partner."

"Or you haven't found the right one," I observed. "There are plenty of fish in the sea."

"That is true," she replied. "I'm thinking of changing my Bingo place and going for one of the bigger ones."

"Then how will I keep up with you?" I asked.

"Maybe I should get a web page—or maybe I'll give Larry another chance. He's a good Bingo buddy if he just weren't so bossy."

And that is how it now stands. Larry and Robin play Bingo together most of the time and the wins frequently come their way. Tim is not seen at all. If I played at the big places all the time, how could I keep you posted?




Dear Guy,

Here's a little tip to Bingo halls that serve refreshments: Think about what you're serving and try to make it the best it can be. If it's coffee and donuts, please make sure the donuts are fresh and the coffee is well brewed. If it's burgers, hotdogs and fries, don't cook the meat to death and make sure the fries are crisp and not a soggy, greasy mess.

The purpose of Bingo, whether it's charity Bingo or for-profit, is to bring in players and make money. Just think how many players are lost due to bad food or how many extra players may go to one hall over another because one serves great coffee and homemade cookies and the other doesn't.

We have several Bingos in my area that are ethnic in nature and serve interesting food at Bingo. They also have festivals with lots of food and offer Bingo during the festivals. The places are always packed! —*Vince G., via e-mail*

Dear Vince,

You've served up some good advice here. I hadn't really thought about it, but there are a handful of halls I tend not to go to because they have bad coffee or sell cheap powdered donuts from the grocery store.

We also have two Greek Orthodox churches and one Russian Orthodox church that have annual festivals with amazing food. Unfortunately, they do not offer Bingo during the festivals, which they may want to reconsider.

The hall kitchen is one of those great inducements that will indeed entice players in and keep them coming back again and again. Find yourself a volunteer short order cook and you've got it made! —*Guy*

Dear Guy,

I can't help but notice the shrinking numbers of Bingo players and our local halls' inability to bring in new, younger Bingo players to keep the games going. I know that bars and restaurants have developed different kinds of Bingo games as part of their entertainment and that it is proving very popular with patrons. What can traditional Bingo halls do to attract new players? —*DEH, Illinois*

Dear DEH,

I hate to sound all 21st century corporate business, but I think the difference is marketing. Bars and clubs have managed to make Bingo "hip" and have developed and nurtured their new following. (OK, and they also serve alcohol.) But the prizes they give away tend to be pretty chintzy and the games pretty five-in-a-row Bingo basic. Compare this with Bingo hall Bingo. These games give away thousands of dollars in cash prizes, offer complex game patterns to keep things interesting and throw in pull-tab gaming for added fun. How can young people not be interested in trying it out?

Which brings us back to marketing. I think younger players just don't think of playing Bingo. And they don't think of it because they aren't being told that the games—and the prize money—are out there waiting for them.

Bingo hall managers need to spread the word: Get players to encourage their kids and grandkids to come to Bingo (and bring their friends), get younger people to volunteer, and promote the games in publications and online where younger local folks congregate. Marketing Bingo as quirky, fun and potentially money-making could bring in a whole new crop of players. —*Guy*

opened in July 1986, was the "birth engine" that enabled the tribe to pursue the casino resort that's become the largest in North America. 

This month: *Taking care of the Bingo Wings*

and you should see a definite improvement within a month.

Press-up/assisted press-up: Using your own body weight as resistance is the perfect way to tone up those pesky wings. Build up the number of press-ups you do, starting with 10 and remembering to keep your back straight and legs in a line. If you find it hard to support your weight, do an assisted press-up by dropping your knees to the floor to take some of the strain.

Tricep dip: You can do these on a park bench, in the gym or using a sturdy chair at home. Sit on the bench, grasping the front edge of the seat with both hands. Lower your bum down off the edge of the chair keeping your feet flat and knees bent, with elbows pointing back. Lift yourself up and down, keeping your back straight and not allowing your bum to rise above the level of the chair seat. Start with 10 reps and gradually increase as it gets easier.

Assisted pull-up: You can head to the assisted pull-up machine at the gym for a great arm workout. If you're not in the gym, try and find a park trail outside that has some chest-height parallel bars. Stand side on to the bars, grip onto one of the bars firmly with a parallel grip

and bend your knees until you can feel the strain of supporting your own weight. Slowly try to lift your body from side to side using your feet and bent knees for extra help. Aim for five reps and be careful not to over-strain your biceps.

Priest Chases Bingo Thief





Tipping workers

■ *Getting the facts straight*

My chairperson also showed me the Bingo rules where it states that a worker shall not accept tips from players. I was reprimanded by my chairperson as he

Dear Worker in Michigan,

Let me begin by saying that I am sorry you received a reprimand. The *Windsor Express* of Berkshire, England reports that eight members of a Heathrow Airport syndicate in London organized by Langley lost baggage handler Gerry McNamara have bagged a Lotto prize of £1.2 million (US\$1.9 million). It works out to US\$218,000 each. Most will celebrate by paying off their mortgages and organizing holidays abroad. McNamara is doubly happy because he was playing two of the lines himself after a previous member dropped out of the syndicate. He thanked "natural luck" and his own strategy of buying tickets as late as possible, plus the use of regular winning numbers. "It was only a matter of time," he said. "I never doubted it would happen."

Detour Leads to Big Lotto Win

Michael Alvis Sr., a Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, road-maintenance worker, matched all six numbers in Louisiana's Lotto drawing to win \$425,000. He's decided he won't be doing much that's different, at least for now. "I've got to continue working," the 52-year-old Alvis told the *Daily Comet*, Lafourche Parish, Louisiana. Alvis's daily duties include checking traffic lights on parish roads. Ironically, it was a traffic light that indirectly led him to the store where the ticket was bought. And the ticket that he bought was actually a mistakenly printed "quick-pick" that Alvis agreed to buy rather than wait for a new one to be printed out. Alvis ended up at

the corner store where he purchased the ticket after turning to avoid a red light. It was five minutes before the cut-off time for buying a ticket. Asked if he expects to buy more lottery tickets, Alvis said possibly a few. "I don't want to give it all back to them," he said.

Peter Shumlin and Fish and Wildlife Commissioner Patrick Berry started the computer-generated selection process that randomly selected those who got a chance to take home a moose during hunting season. The drawing was done by a random sort of applications that were submitted by a summer deadline. Veterans who served in Iraq or Afghanistan and people who were unsuccessful in previous moose hunting permit lotteries are given a better chance of winning.
