Selling old guns

Q: My aunt has several guns that belonged to my uncle. What is the best way to sell older guns?
—Tom, Midlothian, Va.

A: According to arms specialist Laurence Thomson of Rock Island Auction Co. in Moline, Ill. (www.rockislandauction.com), many gun queries come from women left with firearms that they have no clue about. The auction house specializes in quality collectible and antique arms, edged weapons and military artifacts, and recently finished a \$12.4 million sale. "We sell thousand-dollar to million-dollar guns," said Thomson. Seen in images, the reader's Colt 22 revolver and Parker Bros. double barrel shotgun each have condition issues. Manufactured in 1873, the Colt would retail at \$400 to \$600 as is—provided a buyer can be found, added Thomson.

The shotgun dating from the 1950s has serious rust on the barrel and a scuffed shoulder stock. Retail is \$600 to \$900, with the same caveat—and provided the gun is cleaned up first. Condition is vital in pricing guns, Thomson said. But, as with many collected objects, some damage is tolerated in the very desirable. FYI: The Rock Island Auction site has an online form for prospective sellers. Other auction houses that sell guns are www.juliaauctions.com and www.gregmartinauctions.com. Another possibility is to donate the guns. Local chapters of wildlife organizations often hold fundraising arms auctions.

Dear Annie,
 I would love to serve beef stroganoff for the holidays, but I don't have a good recipe. I need to make enough for 10 people. Can you help me? By the way, I loved your recipe for "Beef Brisket and Dumplings." It was delicious. My husband and children loved your combination of beef and dumplings. Way to go Annie!!!

BEEF STROGANOFF

- 4 pounds beef tenderloin
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 4 cups beef stock
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup tomato paste
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large package sliced mushrooms
- salt, to taste
- pepper, to taste

Cut the beef tenderloin into thin strips. Sprinkle the beef strips with salt and pepper. Set aside. Using a large soup pot, melt the 1/4 cup of

butter. Add the flour, stirring constantly. Gradually add the beef stock and cook until the mixture begins to thicken. Add the sour cream alternately with the tomato paste, stirring constantly. Do not allow this mixture to boil. Allow to simmer. In a large frying pan, sauté the beef, chopped onion and sliced mushrooms in 2 tablespoons of butter. Add more butter, if necessary. Add the meat, onions and mushrooms to the soup pot with the sauce, adjust the seasoning according to your own tastes, and simmer gently for 20 to 30 minutes. Serves 12.



Good Housekeeping

Simple Holiday Bark

Keep around the house for a holiday treat—or wrap it up as a gift!

- 12 ounces (semisweet) chocolate, chopped
- 8 ounces white chocolate, chopped
- 1/2 cup (coarsely crushed) candy canes or peppermint candies

1. Line cookie sheet with foil.
 2. Microwave semisweet chocolate in bowl on medium power 1 minute; stir. Keep microwaving at 15-second intervals, stirring, until melted and smooth; set aside. Repeat process with white chocolate.

- 3. Spread semisweet chocolate on prepared cookie sheet about 1/3-inch thick. Drop tablespoons white chocolate on top. Swirl chocolates together with tip of knife to marble. Sprinkle with crushed candy.
- 4. Refrigerate 1 hour, or until firm. Peel off foil; break bark into pieces. It will keep for about a month in an airtight container in refrigerator. Serves 11.

Medical Test Results

When you see a doctor and he or she orders tests, you need to know what those results are. If they're normal, you can relax. If there is a problem, you need to know that so there can be a follow up. One way or the other, you expect a call.

Back in 2002, the Department of Veterans Affairs Office of the Inspector General issued a report with recommendations for handling the communication of abnormal test results.

A recent inspection to check on the management of test results looked at three areas to see if further improvement is necessary: 1) Whether the written policies effectively cover the communication of critical test results for radiology, lab and pathology; 2) whether practitioners notify patients of critical test results within the correct time frame; and 3) whether practitioners notify patients of normal test results.

The recent inspection and report

checked outpatient test results at 25 VHA facilities. Here are some of the findings:

Patients not informed (at all) of critical lab results: 4 percent; of critical radiology results: 11 percent; patients not informed within the required time frame of critical radiology results: 10 percent; of critical pathology results: 12 percent; patients not informed (at all) of normal pathology results: 45 percent.

When you're getting medical care, you need to be proactive. When a doctor orders tests, write down what those tests are for. Starting at the 72-hour mark after the tests are done, call your doctor and leave a message, saying that you'd like the results of your tests. The reason: The results of most tests will be completed by then.






Hi LT,


It's going to sound pretty harsh, but frankly, if I were you I'd get the hell away from him!

Manhattan Bingo Attracting Younger Players

Bingo is catching on big time in uptown Manhattan, New York, where younger, often unemployed players are filling halls around the clock. While old-time Bingo players still fill church basements uptown, establishments like West Side Hall and Washington Heights Arcade in Harlem, licensed and incorporated under state law, have lately been attracting a younger crowd, opening at noon and closing when the games are fin-

ished—often not until 10 p.m. "In the last few years we've seen people a little younger mixing in and becoming regular players," West Side owner Belle Fisch, who has been in the Bingo business for 20 years, told the *New York Daily News*. "It's a therapy for some. For others, it's an economic thing." Fisch said the hall's Saturday night games in particular are growing increasingly appealing to young couples. "It's a cheap, fun date," she said. "If someone wants to try their luck and play a game, it's a lot less expensive than a casino."

Filmmaker Vindicated After Bingo Hall Altercation

A California Appeals Court has refused to overturn a lower-court decision dismissing a lawsuit brought by Richelle Olson and her husband against funnyman Sacha Cohen and NBC Universal over his 2009 film comedy *Brüno*. E Entertainment Online reported that Olson initially sued Cohen, accusing him of assault and battery during the filming of *Brüno*, in which Cohen turned up in character at a 2007 charity Bingo game in Palmdale, California. Olson claimed her confrontation with the prankster—she essentially ran him off the stage—prompted her to lose con-

sciousness, fall to the floor and hit her head, during which she suffered "two brain bleeds." A lower court, however, ruled in favor of Universal's argument that the Olsons brought a frivolous complaint and that Cohen's comments were constitutionally protected speech. The appellate panel agreed, noting the "hot button issues" were an area of public interest. "Cohen's verbal exchange with Richelle Olson on stage aided in Cohen's effort to obtain a reaction from Richelle Olson captured on video for subsequent use in the film," wrote the judges. "As such, it is an indistinguishable part of the Constitutionally protected expressive conduct of making the movie."

A new Bingo ad on British television is relying on a near naked man to attract the attention of potential Bingo players. The Boyle Sports advertising campaign features a nude man strutting his stuff, with just a small cue card to hide his "bits," reports BingoSupermarket.com. The ad, which claims "We've Got The Biggest Balls in Bingo," also features the sultry voice of musician Barry White. The company claims that the double entendre message is all in good

fun. A Boyle Sports spokeswoman told BingoSupermarket that there are so many sexy ads targeted at men that the company thought it was time to give the ladies a treat with the racy promotion.





He chose to take the lump sum instead of receiving the money in yearly payments over the course of 26 years. The lump sum totaled \$68 million before taxes.

China Creates Car Registration Lottery

Taking on odds that only gamblers could stomach, the chances of winning in Beijing's monthly car registration lottery are no better than hitting a number on a spin of the roulette wheel. Reuters reports that the only way to get a registration is through the lottery, and without one, Beijing residents cannot buy a new car. As a result, city dwellers are flocking to the lottery in larger numbers to try their luck on a new car registration, which the city started restricting this year as part of efforts to control worsening pollution and traffic congestion. 



