### Value of lithograph

**Q:** I've been told I have an authentic Michael Parkes. The person who gave it to me has others, and claims they are each worth \$5,000 or more. If it is authentic, what is it worth? How do I verify it?

—*Michele, Tucson, Ariz.*

**A:** Parkes is a contemporary American artist. His works include sculpture, paintings and prints. Born in Missouri in 1944, he is sometimes called a "hippie" artist because he once lived that life in India and other outposts. Now established and living in Spain, Parkes is known for his fanciful imagery of dreams and magic. Works often include gargoyles, either flying or static. Several art databases list auction results for him. On [www.artprice.com](http://www.artprice.com), we see that oil on board paintings have gone to \$15,000 and change. Another sold for about \$8,000.

But—and this is a big but—Parkes is also sold as stone lithography. While his labor intensive paintings are rare and in high demand, lithographs produced in numbers are far more affordable. All savvy artists do this. Paintings go to the buyer with deep pockets; prints are for the masses.

Marketed under a registered name, Parkes' limited edition color stone lithographs are sold only by galleries that represent him.

A gallery that represents the artist can take a look and tell if it is an authorized print. Find one on Parkes' official website; they can work from your clear images. Offer to pay for the opinion. It's only fair.

As for the \$5,000 quote, that seems like a gallery tag price. At auction, color lithos by the artist recently brought \$491 and \$703. On new goods, retail and resale are often worlds apart.





# Good Housekeeping

### Stuffed Pork Chops

The aroma of this dish will remind you of childhood trips to your grandparents for Sunday supper. If you don't have rye bread for the stuffing, use whole wheat.

- 4 teaspoons vegetable oil
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 golden delicious apple, peeled, cored and chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon caraway seeds
- 1 pinch dried thyme
- 2 slices rye bread, toasted and cut into 1/4-inch pieces
- 2 tablespoon chicken broth
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1 tablespoon spicy brown mustard
- 4 (8 ounces each) pork loin chops, 1-inch thick
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

1. In 10-inch skillet, heat 2 teaspoons oil over medium heat. Add onion and cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Add apple, caraway seeds and thyme and cook 3 minutes longer. Transfer apple mixture to medium bowl. Wipe skillet clean. 2. Stir bread pieces, 2 tablespoons broth and mustard into apple mixture. Pat pork dry with paper towels. Holding knife parallel to surface, cut a horizontal pocket in each chop. Stuff apple mixture into pocket of each chop and secure with toothpicks. Sprinkle with salt. 3. In 12-inch skillet, heat remaining 2 teaspoons oil over medium heat until hot. Cook chops until they just lose their pink color throughout, about 7 minutes per side. Transfer chops to warm platter. 4. Increase heat to high. Add remaining 1/2 cup broth to skillet and heat to boiling, stirring to loosen brown bits from bottom of pan. Boil broth until reduced to 1/4 cup, 3 to 5 minutes. Pour sauce over chops. Makes 4 main-dish servings.

**A Present from the DoJ**

**■ Internet Lotteries (and Poker?) Are Legal**

The United States Department of Justice ("DoJ") has given the online gaming community a big, big present, made public two days before Christmas. President Barack Obama's administration has just declared, perhaps unintentionally, that almost every form of intra-state Internet gambling is legal under federal law, and so may be games played interstate and even internationally. Technically, the only question being decided was "Whether proposals by Illinois and New York to use the Internet and out-of-state transaction processors to sell lottery tickets to in-state adults violate the Wire Act." But the conclusion by the DoJ that the Wire Act's "prohibitions relate solely to sport-re-

lated gambling activities in interstate and foreign commerce," eliminates almost every federal anti-gambling law that could apply to gaming that is legal under state laws.

If the Wire Act is limited to bets on sports events and races, what other federal anti-gambling statutes are left? There are prohibitions on interstate lotteries, but Powerball and the other multi-state lotteries show how easily these can be gotten around, even before Congress passed an express exemption for state lotteries. And poker is not a lottery under federal law.

So, all that are left are the federal laws designed to go after organized crime. These all require that there first be a violation of another law, like the Wire Act, the federal anti-lottery statutes, or a state anti-gambling law. If a state has expressly legalized intra-state games like poker, as Nevada and the District of Columbia have done, there is simply no federal law that could apply.

If the bettors and operator are all in the same state, and the gambling does not involve a sports event or race, the Wire Act cannot be used against the operator, even if phone wires happen to cross into another state. And if the state legislature has made the online game legal, it does not violate any other federal anti-gambling law.

I suppose it is possible that the DoJ could argue that poker is a "sporting event or contest." But the language of the Wire Act prohibits "information assisting in the placing of bets or wagers ON any sporting event or contest." If poker is a contest, it is one where players bet IN the contest, not on it. Anyway, the DoJ held that the Wire Act was designed to go after bookies taking bets on horse races and football games, etc., not other forms of gambling. And even the DoJ would not argue that a game like blackjack is a sporting event or contest.

In a footnote, the DoJ expressed no opinion

about the provision in the Wire Act that allows prosecutors to shut down phone lines where true interstate or foreign gambling is taking place. But, since the DoJ has now concluded that every other section of the Wire Act applies only to races and sports events, it would be truly bizarre to believe that Congress intended only this one section to apply to other forms of gambling. This means there may be nothing preventing states from making compacts with other states, and even foreign nations, once they have legalized an online game, like poker. The immediate beneficiaries will be the D.C. Lottery and Nevada-licensed private operators, since those jurisdictions are the furthest ahead. The state lotteries in Illinois, New York and New Hampshire will also initiate or expand their online games. After all, most of the provincial lotteries in Canada are already operating Internet poker. I believe this will be a major incentive for the other states looking at legalizing intra-state poker and other games. First will probably be Iowa. The State Legislature mandated a report, which has already been submitted, concluding that intra-state poker can be operated safely and will raise money. The Iowa Legislature meets for a short period at the beginning of the year, so it has to act quickly, or it will be passed by other states in 2012.

Those other states are California and New Jersey. California is desperate for any source of revenue, and it has so much legal gambling that the only question is which operators are going to be the big winners. The Democratic-controlled Legislature in New Jersey approved intra-state online gaming, but the bill was vetoed by Gov. Chris Christie (R.-NJ). Christie understands his state need the money, so he will probably help put the issue on the ballot in November. Once these jurisdictions open their online

games, even if limited to players who are physically within the state, operators will push for compacts to allow interstate Internet poker among the legal states. And other states, like Florida, will jump on the bandwagon.

The interesting question is what the Majority Leader of the U.S. Senate, Harry Reid (D.-NV) and Kyl, the number two Republican in the Senate, will do. They had sent a letter asking the DoJ for clarification of its position on Internet gambling. They now have their answer, though it may not have been what they had wanted.

My bet is that they, and Congress, will continue to do nothing, while Internet gambling explodes across the nation, made legal under state laws.



### Melanoma

#### Smart ways to protect

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

Is melanoma hereditary? My dad died of it a few years ago at age 71, and I don't want to follow in his footsteps. What can I do to guard against this deadly skin cancer?

*Sun Screened Cindy*

#### Dear Cindy,

While long term sun exposure and sunburns are the biggest risk factors for melanoma, your genes can definitely play a role too. Here's what you should know.

#### Who's at Risk?

Each year, about 65,000 Americans develop melanoma – the deadliest form of skin cancer. While anyone can get it, those most often diagnosed are Caucasians, age 50 and older. And those most vulnerable are people with red or

blond hair, blue or green eyes, fair skin, freckles, moles, a family history of skin cancer and those who had blistering sunburns in their youth.

#### Self-Defense

The best way you can guard against melanoma and other skin cancers (basal and squamous cell carcinomas), is to protect yourself from the sun, and if you're over age 50, get a full-body skin exam done by a dermatologist each year. Self-examinations done every month or so is also a smart way to detect early problems. Check your entire body, and be on the look-out for new growths, moles that have changed, or sores that don't heal. For self-examination tips and actual pictures of what to look for see [skincheck.org](http://skincheck.org).

#### Sun Safety

Even though you can't change your skin or family history, you can control your sun exposure. Here are some tips and products to help, and remember, it's never too late to start protecting your skin:

**Stay in:** Avoid the sun when possible from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. when the ultraviolet (UV) rays are most intense.

**Use sunscreen:** Be sure to choose a "broad-spectrum" product that provides UVA and UVB protection and has a SPF (sun-protection factor) of at least 30. If you don't like the rub-on lotions,

try the continuous spray-on sunscreens which are easier to apply and re-apply and less messy.

**Sun pills:** There's a nonprescription sun-pill on the market called Heliocare that provides additional UV protection. The pills are intended to supplement sunscreen, and are sold at drugstore chains for about \$60 for a bottle of 60 pills.

**Cover up:** Thick or tightly woven cloths can help prevent the sun's rays from reaching your skin or you can purchase a variety of lightweight clothing and hats that offer maximum UV protection in their fabric. [Coolibar.com](http://Coolibar.com) and [sun-precautions.com](http://sun-precautions.com) are good places to find such products.

**Wash-in protection:** SunGuard laundry additive ([sunguardsunprotection.com](http://sunguardsunprotection.com)) is another option that allows you to wash an invisible shield of sun protection right into your clothes.

**Monitor yourself:** Oregon Scientific Inc. ([www2.oregonscientific.com](http://www2.oregonscientific.com)) sells a handy UV monitor for \$24 that will warn you when you've had enough sun exposure. Or, you can check sites like [epa.gov/sunwise](http://epa.gov/sunwise)—which provides UV Index ratings where you are.

**Wear sun shades:** Sunglasses with UVA and UVB protection can help prevent cataracts and macular degeneration along with melanoma of the eye and

skin cancer around the eyelids.

#### Treatment

If melanoma is caught and treated early, it's nearly 100 percent curable. But if it's not, the cancer can advance and spread to other parts of the body, where it becomes hard to treat and can be fatal. Standard treatment for melanoma is surgical removal. In advanced cases however, chemotherapy or radiation may also be used.

**Savvy Tip:** In the spring and summer, there are a variety of places that offer free skin cancer screenings. Check with the American Academy of Dermatology (888-462-3376, [aad.org/public/exams/screenings](http://aad.org/public/exams/screenings)) which offers free screenings done by hundreds of volunteer dermatologists across the U.S. You can also find free screening through the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery ([asds.net/skincancer-screening.aspx](http://asds.net/skincancer-screening.aspx)), and the Skin Cancer Foundation ([skincancer.org](http://skincancer.org)).

#### Lotto Winner Strikes Again

A Home Depot employee from Atlanta has captured his second big Georgia Lottery win. Erik Holmes, 44, claimed a \$500,000 prize less than a year after winning \$104,000. Holmes' recent win was on the new lottery game \$7 Million Jackpot. He was leaving work when he purchased the ticket at local food market. "I scratched it in the store and immediately turned it over and signed it," he told WRBL News in Columbus, Georgia. "Then I gave the clerk a big hug and drove home. I was surprisingly calm." A Home Depot department manager, Holmes will donate some of his winnings to the company's Homer Fund, which helps associates in times of need. He used his previous prize from March 2011 to help family and friends. "Giving back is one of Home Depot's core values, and I firmly believe in that," he said.

#### Supporting HIV/AIDS Prevention & Care

In honor of National Black AIDS Awareness Day, the AIDS Foundation of Chicago (AFC) and a team of advocates made their voices heard in Springfield, Illinois urging the extension of a crucial program that funds HIV prevention and treatment. *Windy City Times* reported that the AFC held a press conference at the State Capitol to support a bill that would extend the sunset date for the Quality of Life Fund's "Red Ribbon Cash" lottery ticket, which is expiring on Dec. 31, 2012. The bill would extend the ticket sunset date to Dec. 31, 2017. Enacted in 2007, 100% of the proceeds from Red Ribbon Cash lottery tickets go to organizations throughout Illinois that provide treatment and prevention services to those populations most affected by HIV/AIDS—such as youth, African-Americans and Latinos, and the LGBT community. The Quality of Life Fund is a self-generating revenue fund based on sales. Last year, the Red Ribbon Cash scratch-off game generated \$1.4 million for HIV/AIDS prevention and care. This year, the lottery ticket will fund 14 community-based organizations across the state.

#### \$50K Ticket Retrieved From Trash

A Clinton, Indiana man found himself in a scenario that strikes fear in the heart of lottery players everywhere. He threw away a \$50,000 winning lottery ticket. After a weird chain of events, Ernest "Ernie" Scott III was able to discover his win, dig his ticket out of the trash, dry it out and collect his winnings. "I don't know what I did, or what I looked at, but for some reason I thought it was no good and I threw it away," said Scott. The next day, a friend of Scott's called to tell him that the numbers Scott plays in a different Hoosier Lottery had just been drawn. Scott hopped online to check the Daily 3 numbers for himself to make sure his buddy wasn't pulling his leg. He was scanning the Hoosier Lottery homepage when a different set of winning numbers for a different game caught his eye. There, on the screen, were the five Lucky 5 numbers he had been playing for months: 5-7-14-18-28. He knew the numbers by heart because they are a combination of his wife and four children's birth dates. He knew they were the numbers he'd played that day—and that he had thrown the ticket away. He scrambled to the kitchen to retrieve the ticket from the trash, which had thankfully not been taken out. The ticket was buried under coffee grounds. It was soggy and stained, but all information necessary to validate the ticket was intact and readable.

#### Pair Won't Share Million Dollar Win

A Seminole County, Florida man who sued his ex-girlfriend for half of her \$1 million Florida Lottery winnings left the courthouse empty-handed. After 1 1/2 days of testimony, Circuit Judge Alan Dickey ruled in favor of defendant Lynn Anne Poirier in what's known as a directed verdict—meaning the plaintiff's case was deemed legally insufficient. The *Orlando Sentinel* reported that Howard Browning, who is unemployed, and Poirier, a Seminole County special-education teacher for more than three decades, had lived together for 16 years. According to Browning, they agreed that if either ever won a lottery, they would share the winnings. Poirier disputed that account. According to her attorneys, she bought the ticket herself, never agreed to share any winnings, had been trying to get Browning to leave her Geneva farmhouse for some time and eventually evicted him. She later sold the house.





