

Antique means many things

Q: I bought this hutch 15 years ago at a second-hand store. Is it an antique? — *Betty, Wagoner, Okla.*

A: You have opened Pandora's box, Betty. There are so many different opinions on what constitutes an antique that we could argue the fine points for weeks. For example, Greek and Roman marbles are antiques, but so is a very early 1960s pocket calculator. Each is a rarity from a special period. The most generally accepted definition of an antique is an item at least 100 years old, collected because of its desirability, style, rarity or other unique features. So, let's see how this piece stacks up. Seen in photos, the three-drawer chest topped with a bookshelf hutch is mass-produced. A printed paper label has the maker's name, plus info that the piece contains woods of "several species, combining solids and veneered plywoods bonded with moisture resistant glues." The South Carolina maker was one of many churning out furniture made from Southern woods. The piece combines mixed solid woods and plywood. Stenciled numbers and lettering label the components. There goes the rarity qualifier.

Note the heavy, blocky style and unrefined lines of the feet. The look is common to mass made 1940s and '50s furniture, when so much was made for burgeoning suburban growth. At the time, buyers needed reasonable, utilitarian furniture to fill new homes in new subdivisions. So there go the age and style qualifiers.

The piece isn't an antique, and value isn't stratospheric—but so what? You have a solid, useful piece of furniture that looks to be in excellent condition. You've had over a decade of use from it, with more to come. I'd say you bought well. Look at it this way: If I told you this was an antique, you'd start fretting about dings and care, who would end up with it, and so forth.







Good Housekeeping

Seared Steak with Minted Watermelon

Inspired by the exotic flavors of China, this dish is packed with watermelon, cucumber and mint, which provide a cool contrast to savory grilled steak.

- 8 ounces thin rice noodles
- 1 (1 pound) boneless 1-inch-thick beef sirloin steak
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 1 stalk lemongrass, yellow and pale green part only, finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice
- 1 tablespoon lower-sodium fish sauce
- 1/2 small (3 cups) watermelon, rind removed, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/2 seedless (English) cucumber, cut in half and thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup packed fresh mint leaves, finely chopped
- Salt
- Pepper

1. Prepare outdoor grill for covered direct grilling on medium.
2. Prepare noodles as label directs. Drain, rinse under cold water and drain again.
3. Season steak with 1/4 teaspoon each salt and freshly ground black pepper. Place steak on hot grill; cover. Cook 12 to 13 minutes for medium-rare or until desired doneness, turning once. Transfer steak to cutting board; let rest 10 minutes.
4. Meanwhile, in large bowl, stir shallot, lemongrass, sugar, lime juice and fish sauce until sugar dissolves. Thinly slice steak across the grain. Add to bowl, along with watermelon, cucumber and mint. Toss gently until well mixed.
5. Divide noodles among serving plates. Top with steak mixture and accumulated juices. Serves 4.



Lies the FBI tells

The war of intimidation from the federal Department of Justice (DoJ) against Internet gambling has now reached the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This is no minor issue.

I have taught classes to the FBI, including on both Internet and Indian gaming. I have always found them to be professionals. They appreciate both their power and responsibility as the leading law enforcement agents of the federal government.

So, I was shocked to see this on the official FBI website:

"If you've ever thought about visiting a cyber casino, here's something you

should know: it's illegal to gamble online in the United States...

That means:

...No placing cyber bets on sporting events or in virtual card games;
...No transferring money electronically for gambling; and

...No wagers in offshore Internet casinos even if you live in the U.S."

And it's completely untrue.

A quick lesson in the law: always read the actual language of the statutes. So, when the FBI lists what it says "are the primary federal laws that govern online gambling," click on the links. What you will find are the following:

"Transmission of wagering, betting by use of a wire communication" takes you to the Wire Act. The statute's opening words: "Whoever being engaged in the business of betting or wagering..."

Since the law was enacted 50 years ago, there have been only one or two attempts to charge players under the Wire Act. The charges were thrown out. Courts have ruled the Act means exactly what it says: If you are not in the business of gambling, you cannot be violating this law.

The other statutes listed by the FBI even more clearly never apply to mere bettors. In fact, "Broadcasting lottery information," doesn't even directly apply to gambling operators. It is limited to TV and radio broadcasters. There is no way this law could be used against

someone who is merely making bets using the Internet.

Incidentally, courts have held that sports books do not violate this and other federal anti-lottery laws. "Lottery," under federal law, is limited to games that are 100% chance. Betting on sports events requires at least a little bit of skill.

But at least a lottery is gambling. The last two statutes the FBI lists, "Fraud by wire" and "Mail fraud: Attempt and Conspiracy," only apply to schemes to defraud. Even if the gambling is illegal, it does not mean it is crooked, or that the operator lied.

And you can't prosecute a mere bettor by throwing in "Conspiracy." If that were allowed, everyone who bought illegal drugs would be guilty of conspiracy to sell drugs.

How did this happen? Why would the FBI put up information that is 100% incorrect?


Under J. Edgar Hoover, the FBI was a political force. Although Hoover made the Bureau, as Wikipedia puts it, "a large and efficient crime-fighting agency," he also used it as a personal weapon to intimidate Presidents and Congress. Hoover was appointed director of the predecessor Bureau of Investigation in 1924. He helped found the FBI and ran it from its birth in 1935 until his death in 1972.

Naturally, nobody wanted a repeat. So the FBI was reined in, put heavily under the control of the Attorney General and the Department of Justice.

The result, sadly, is this professional

law enforcement agency has become a tool of the Department's war of intimidation against Internet gambling.

Digital magazine, *Culturemap*, reported that the fundraiser served to remind patrons that there are 1.3 million uninsured, that 20% of children don’t have insurance and that 500,000 remain underinsured in Harris County, Texas. The Bingo night helped raise \$12,000 to sponsor a waiting room in the new Pediatric and Adolescent Health Center—Bear Creek.



pered, “I’ve got one, too.” “What?” yelled Kim. “Well, call Bingo.”



A 76-year-old Bakersfield, California woman is suing her son over a lottery ticket worth \$51 million. Etta May Urquhart said she purchased the lottery ticket. When she realized she had won the massive prize, she was so nervous that she asked her son to sign her name on the back of the ticket. According to the suit, her son, Ronnie Lee Orender, claimed the prize and has been spending the money on homes, cars and his daughters. Court papers claim he bought 10 cars and four homes and put millions into various accounts. "Etta May told me, 'I love my son. I trust my son. I trusted him. There was no reason for me to ever think anything would happen. This is not my son,'" Urquhart's attorney Barry Goldner told KABC-TV News, Los Angeles. For now, a temporary protective order has frozen all assets. At press time the case was in the hands of the court.

Couple Wins In Boise

The first ever \$1 million winning Idaho Lottery ticket sold in Nez Perce County was claimed at Idaho Lottery headquarters in Boise by longtime Lewiston couple Richard and Lorraine Hallisy. "I checked our tickets on the computer then called for Lorraine so I could show her," said Richard to KIVI-TV in Boise when he found out they had the winning ticket. "I thought it was one of those internet jokes," said Lorraine. "I couldn't believe it." The first five numbers matched and the ticket won the married couple of 56 years \$1 million. The couple discovered their lucky win on the Sunday morning after the draw. "Oh we saw stories about it in the newspaper and on the television, but we had a few things to take care of before heading down to Boise," added Richard on why it took the couple nearly two weeks to claim their prize.


Philadelphia Workers Win

Four dozen Philadelphia transit agency workers who won a \$172 million Powerball drawing are all still working and don't intend to change much about their lives despite becoming millionaires. A pool of workers at the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority's (SEPTA) headquarters scored the winning ticket in the multi-state lottery. They purchased the ticket at a newsstand across the street. Though the annuity payout of 30 annual installments was \$172 million, the group decided to take a one-time cash payout, reducing their windfall to a mere \$107.5 million, according to the *New York Daily News*. Split 48 ways, it amounts to a little more than \$2.2 million each before taxes. The enviable crowd ranges in age from 26 to 69 and has logged SEPTA tenure from less than a year to 42 years. They work in a variety of departments. They declined to give

specifics on their job titles but said none of the winners currently works as a driver.

Lottery Scam Busted

Police in Jamaica have arrested six people accused of stealing tens of thousands of dollars from U.S. citizens through a lottery scam. A statement from police says that one of the men had more than \$60,000 in an account believed to belong to the victims. Police also seized computers, information on the lottery scam and lists of U.S. victims, with their addresses and other personal information, according to *The Washington Post*. The arrests came after police contacted a U.S. victim they say lost \$120,000 through the scam. Jamaica has long operated as a center for international telemarketing frauds that target elderly Americans and take in roughly \$300 million a year.



