In this case, if your cupboard is a perfect match it is from the Midwest, has the same date of origin, has

traces of German influence, is the same size and wood as the one sold, and has boards of the same width.

Q: Value on a Buck Rogers wristwatch that still works? — *Roslyn, Delray Beach, Fla.*

A: I assume you refer to the 1971 Buck Rogers in the 25th Century version with a face that is a redesign of the original Buck Rogers 1935 pocket watch by Ingraham. The box alone lists for \$25 to \$100 (mint) in *Hake's Price Guide to Character Toys*, 6th ed., by Ted Hake (House of Collectibles, \$35). The solo watch books at \$200 to \$800. But a check on eBay shows that ones posted there sold for under \$40.



Never Forget

A veteran was buried in a cardboard box. I read those words on the Internet news, and my stomach did a flip-flop. This didn't happen in an emergency in an out-of-the way place, or as a temporary measure, or as part of a crime. It happened in a National Cemetery.

It never should have happened at all. It only came to light when maintenance workers were re-aligning the veteran's headstone and discovered the cardboard box just below the surface.

The World War II veteran was a man who had no family left to make any arrangements. Cemetery officials did part of their job when they gave him an engraved headstone. The cemetery held a small service. The veteran's name was read in a ceremony that's held a few times a year. But the medical examiner had sent his remains in a cardboard

box...and that's how the veteran was buried, in a shallow grave, in a National Cemetery.

How many others are there like this?

Where I live, if there are unclaimed remains of deceased veterans, they go all out. Two veterans without family were recently buried with full honors, with color guard, "Taps" and folded flags, arranged by a group of funeral directors. The cremated remains in small wood caskets arrived by Hearse. A hundred people attended the ceremony to honor two men who had no one else.

A bill now in Congress, "The Dignified Burial of Veterans Act of 2012," will require the Department of Veterans Affairs to furnish a casket or urn to a deceased veteran when there is no next-of-kin or when there isn't enough money available in the veteran's estate.

If ever there was a time to get on the phone to call your senators about supporting a bill, this is it.

New York. Resorts World, the racino at Aqueduct, was the nation's top generator of slot machine revenue with a \$57.5 million win in May. Resorts World came in ahead of Connecticut's Mohegan Sun, which booked \$55.4 million. Connecticut's Foxwood's was third with \$50.4 million in slot-generated revenue.

North Carolina. The Cherokee casino in western North Carolina will begin offering live table games as early as July 4. Previously disallowed by law, the casino may now deal blackjack, poker, and other "Las Vegas-style" games.

Deadwood. The betting limit in Deadwood, South Dakota will be raised from \$100 to \$1,000 as of July 1. When gambling was legalized there in 1989, the betting limit was \$5.

Macau. Steve Wynn says that his new casino on the Cotai strip will outdo anything he's done to date. Plans call for 2,000 rooms, 10 restaurants, a shopping area, a spa, meeting space, a nightclub, and a casino with 500 table games. Completion is scheduled for 2016. The budget is currently set at \$4 billion.

England. The Hippodrome Casino is set to open in London in time for the summer

Olympics. Touted as the U.K.'s first "international-style casino," the venue underwent a £40 million renovation.

Online. It's looking like all but a sure thing that Nevada will be first out of the gate with legalization of online poker. Bally Technologies and IGT have already been licensed as manufacturers and service providers, and other licenses are pending, as more than 25 companies have filed. Notable new petitioners are Wynn Las Vegas and Fertitta Interactive LLC, the online company formed by the owners of Station Casinos and the UFC. Nevada's games could be live by early 2013 and potentially dozens of other states are expected to follow. H2 Gambling Capital reports that the global online-gambling market produced \$32.8 billion in revenue last year, led by Japan, the U.K., and Germany, and estimates that the U.S. online market could reach 13.4 billion within five years.



Grandkids' Retirement

■ How to help fund for their future

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is there a way that we can put some money in a Roth IRA account for our young grandkids to use for retirement?
Curious Granddad

Dear Curious,

There sure is! Funding Roth IRAs for your grandkids when they're young is a smart move and an incredible gift to their financial future. And you don't have to be rich to do it, either. Here's what you should know.

Roth Rules

The Roth IRA is a fabulous savings tool for your grandkids. A Roth can literally turn a few hundred dollars a year now, into tens of thousands of tax-free dollars for your grandkids when they retire by using the powerful combination of time and compounding.

But in order for you to open and fund a Roth IRA for a grandchild, one primary requirement will need to be met. The child will need to have earned income from some type of work – allowances don't count. So, if your grandkid made a few bucks this year mowing lawns, babysitting, delivering newspapers or working an after-school or weekend job, he or she qualifies. Just be sure you keep good records including a log of the dates and hours worked and amounts paid, as well as any W-2 forms from employers or 1099s.

If your grandkids meet the earned income requirement, there's nothing in the rules that says the child's own money has to go into the Roth. It's perfectly legal if your grandkids keep the money they earned and you make the contributions for them. The key is that you can't contribute more than your grandchild earned in any given tax year, up to the limit of \$5,000.

And to give you an idea of how these early contributions can add up, consider this. Let's say, for example, that you contribute \$500 a year to your grandchild's Roth for nine years from the ages of 10 to 18 (a total of \$4,500). If that money grew an annual rate of 7 percent, that \$4,500 would accumulate to around \$144,000 by the time he or she reaches age 65. And with a Roth IRA, the full amount will be tax-free when it's withdrawn in retirement. It's also doubtful that your grandkids would be on the hook for income taxes. Children who work as employees generally don't need to file a tax return unless their income exceeds the standard deduction amount, which was \$5,700 for the 2010 tax year. They should, however, file if they're due a refund for any withholdings. But a child who has net earnings of \$400 or more from self-employment is required to file. For information on IRS filing requirements for children, visit www.irs.gov and search for the page titled "Taxable Income for Students."

Flexibility

You also need to know that opening a Roth for your grandkids doesn't automatically lock up the money for decades. Like it or not, your grandkids, at age 18, can withdraw the principle contributions (but not earnings) any time, tax free and penalty free. Roth IRAs also offer special withdrawal

rules for higher education expenses. So if your grandkid needs money for college, contributions can be withdrawn tax and penalty free, while the earnings can also be dipped into without penalty, but they will owe taxes on it. And when it comes time to buy a first home, your grandson or granddaughter can withdraw up to \$10,000 (contributions and earnings) tax and penalty free. 




McDonald's Bingo

It's just a group of old friends who gather and play Bingo, eat breakfast and share laughs. The group has been meeting at this location for 23 years, *South Cobb Patch* reported, and the members say it's a way to catch up with friends and establish a sense of community for them, many of whom are retired. Mary and Gerald Peel founded the group by asking the owner at the time if they could begin meeting there to play Bingo. Once they had the go-ahead, they spread the word and raised money to

purchase a tumble basket to call out the letters and numbers. Over the years, the group has purchased other items and newer cards. At one point the group members were investigated after someone alleged that they were gambling. No evidence of illegal gambling was found. The most that the winners get is a free McDonald's breakfast item and a sense of camaraderie.

VFW Hall Fire

WLS-TV Chicago reported that ten people were taken to the hospital following a fire and explosion at a V.F.W. hall in Villa Park, Illinois. The fire broke out at a gun range located in the basement of the building while dozens of people were playing Bingo upstairs. According to investigators, the injured were workers doing repairs to the gun range. At least 50 people were in the hall nearly an hour before the game was supposed

to start. "Over the years, all the gun powder probably built up," an investigator told WLS-TV. "They ignited the gun power, it appears. A fire occurred and when it got to the stairs...an explosion occurred." Some of the workers ran up the stairs to warn the Bingo players to evacuate as smoke filled the building. "I have never seen smoke move like that," one Bingo player told WLS-TV. "It's scary."



Having been on so many cruises, the Connatsers no longer participate in the shore excursions ("We've seen it all," Ralph laughs), opting instead to take

A printing error turns a win into a loss

A Short-Lived Win

Imagine holding what you believe to be a winning lottery ticket worth \$1 million, only to find out that the ticket was printed in error and is worth nothing more than a good story to tell the local news. According to WBZ-TV Boston, that's what happened to Paul Pasquarosa, an unemployed father of two, who spent \$10 on a lottery ticket the day before his birthday. Upon uncovering three red words on a scratch-off Cashword ticket, Pasquarosa believed he'd won the lottery's \$1 million prize. But Pasquarosa's joy was short-lived. When the ticket was examined, it was revealed that there was a printing error. Evidently, of the 20 million tickets printed, 2,200 of them were defective. Pasquarosa's ticket was worth nothing.

Six Million Dollar Win

A suburban Phoenix, Arizona man made a lucky, lucky, lucky, lucky, lucky guess in a recent multi-state lottery game. An Arizona Lottery spokeswoman told *Huffington Post* that the man, who asked not to be identified, claimed six \$1 million prizes after purchasing six Powerball tickets with the same winning numbers. The tickets were good for a half dozen second-place prizes. And he picked up his \$6 million in winnings over the course of several visits to the Arizona Lottery's headquarters in Phoenix. That was an awful lot of money to carry on one trip!

A Business Agreement

A *Winnipeg Free Press* report states that a British Columbia Supreme Court judge has ruled that a Canadian woman's claim for half of a \$12.6 million lottery jackpot will go to a full trial. The Lotto 6/49 ticket was purchased at a Surrey, BC mar-

ket in November 2008 by Maria Fehr, allegedly using a \$20 bill given to her by her husband. But Fehr's business partner at the time, Maria Ganguin, claims the ticket was purchased using funds from their catering business and should be shared between them. The two women had an agreement that business funds could be used occasionally to purchase lottery tickets and they would split the winnings. Fehr and her husband applied for a summary trial, which would resolve the matter quickly based primarily on sworn statements. But Justice Trevor Armstrong ruled that Ganguin, despite a lack of evidence for her claim, should be allowed to test her business partner's credibility at a full trial.

A Trip to Disney World

Herman Dooley Jr., of Wirtz, Virginia is \$100,000 richer after purchasing a \$5 "10x the Money" Virginia Lottery scratcher ticket from a Stop In Food Store in Wirtz where he works. Doo-

ley told lottery officials that he plans to take his son to Disney World with the money. The family traveled there two years ago, but his son was in a wheelchair recovering from surgery at the time. Dooley said in a news release issued by the lottery that he wants to take him back "now that he can run and jump." When the "10x the Money" scratcher game was launched, the odds of winning one of the four top prizes of \$100,000 was 1 in 1.22 million. At press time, three of the four top prizes had been won.


