John Fulton Paintings

Q: Not sure if you can help, but here goes. I have a 14- by 16-inch painting by John Fulton, the American bullfighter who painted with the blood of bulls he killed. —*Dennis, Lima, Ohio*

A: Born in Philadelphia as Fulton John Schoccitti in 1932, he was the first American to qualify as a matador in Spain, becoming a full matador in 1963. By then he had rearranged his name. Bios tell that, as a child, he saw Rita Hayworth and Tyrone Power in *Blood and Sand*, the story of a doomed matador. As a young adult, Fulton accomplished a year of study at the Philadelphia Museum of Art and learned flamenco dancing. The dance teacher had a barber friend who was a bullfighter, and in short order Fulton picked up a scholarship to art school in Mexico. There he learned bullfighting. Fulton later made his home in

Seville, where he died in 1998. His bullfighting career was a struggle, and he never hit the majors with top bulls in good arenas. To pay bills, he sold his art. The blood of bulls paintings were only a portion of his work. With Fulton, he has no sales trail in the recorded auction market. But he has the legacy of an admiring website, www.johnfulton-matador.com. If the reader seeks info on Fulton's life, the site's contact link is a start. If the goal is to sell, the task is to find an auction house or dealer in tune with both Fulton's career and his work.

Horses for Therapy

Unless you look for it, you wouldn't suspect that research literature is full of glowing praise for using animals as therapy for wounded veterans. Whether it's traumatic brain injury, post-traumatic stress disorder or a physical injury, horses are being used as "animal therapists" in equine facilitated therapy.

Here's why it works:

- Immediate feedback. Pull a horse's reins one way, and it goes in that direction. Groom a horse and the blood pressure goes down.
- Success with the horses increases confidence in skills that can be used in day-to-day life.
- Animals don't judge. They care only about the interaction with their human.
- Caring for an animal can provide the steps to reconnecting on an emotional level.
- Relaxation...deep-down genuine ease and relaxation.

If you think you can benefit from an animal therapy program, inquire at your VA medical center.

There are 30 centers that participate in the horse therapy program. Here are a few examples:

- **Horses for Heroes** (www.horsesforheroes.org) is a non-profit, working New Mexico ranch that provides free hands-on experiences to veterans and active-duty military who have PTSD or physical injuries. While veterans heal, they work toward the goal of training horses for future veterans who will participate in the program. For more info, call 505-798-2535.

- **Injured soldiers with TBI and PTSD** ride and take care of horses in the Therapeutic Riding Program near Fort Belvoir, Va. The horses and the soldiers who run the program are from the 3rd Infantry, the Old Guard.

- **The Lexington VA Medical Center** in Kentucky has an alternative rehab program that pairs veterans with horses. Again the emphasis is on veterans with PTSD and TBI.

A Bingo player's idea of heaven; part Three

Tournaments

These are a special form of Events and Special Promotions. Thanks to television and internet, tournaments whether manual or electronic, have become a magical way to involve players. They should be scheduled for every level of play, every kind of game and as often as possible including day and mid-week events. Halls should include winners, losers and spectators in a variety of ancillary activities.

Paper and Electronic Bingo

Paper is still used by the majority of Bingo halls. Unfortunately, neither the halls nor the manufacturers have done a good job in utilizing the many kinds of new paper that is available. Having said that, let's give a choice of electronics to those players who prefer them beyond the simple card-minders. These should include wireless handhelds, fixed-base, linked, electronic pull-tabs and sweepstake units and, of course, the Class II units of Tribal Gaming.

Mobile Gaming

In other parts of the world, the growth of mobile gaming including Bingo is amazing. There is every reason to believe that North America will follow. The Bingo industry, in general, and the Bingo halls, in particular, should be preparing for players to use their smart phones, lap-tops, tablets and pads to enjoy their game whenever and wherever they please.

Gaming Options

In looking at North American Bingo halls, it is only the antiquated jurisdictional rules and regulations which prevent Bingo from successfully competing for today's entertainment, gaming and recreational dollars. Every hall and every player should have the choice of manual or electronic Bingo and pull-tabs, event tickets, sweepstake games, raffles and lottery tickets. While we're at it, let's include slots, vlt's, sports betting and cross-marketing between online and land-based Bingo halls.

Customer Service

Bingo Halls need to be constantly reminded that the players are NOT an interruption to their program—BUT—are the reason for their existence! The effectiveness of customer service, or lack of it, will always be reflected on the hall's bottom line. Players, similar to all other human beings, like to be recognized and treated with both dignity and respect.

Problem Gamblers

Bingo is NOT immune to problem gambling—look carefully and you will find them in almost every hall. The key is to have a clear policy for staff, volunteers and players. The policy must coordinate with any self-exclusion programs in the area and include training to detect the problem, how to handle it and where professional help can be found.

Rules of Conduct

Make them logical. Make them fair. Make them easy to understand, particularly if they are part of the Rules and Regulations under which you must operate. Dependent on the ethnic base of your players, offer the rules in language(s) other than English. Make them easy to read—large enough to be read without a magnifying glass. Post them in areas where they can be easily seen and read. Have extra printed copies that can be taken away. In summary...POST THEM! EXPLAIN THEM! ENFORCE THEM!

Thoughts and Opinions

Anything but last or least! Players do have thoughts and opinions. When changes are being considered that will affect them, ask for their opinion. Who knows, they may even have suggestions that are helpful, or just as surprising, correct!

An Organized Voice

Bingo needs an organized voice if it is to compete in the 21st century. Antiquated rules and regulations will only be changed when politicians realise that the Bingo Industry represents millions of voters. No more comments from me—just this question, "HOW DOES YOUR HALL MATCH UP TO THE HEAVENLY HALL WANTED BY YOUR PLAYERS?"



Good Housekeeping

Glazed Corned Beef

This recipe appears in *Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow*, an award-winning cookbook created in 1979 to benefit the Baddour Center of Senatobia, Miss. To order, visit the online store at baddour.org.

- 5 pounds corned beef brisket or rump
- 1 lemon, peel and juice
- 1 orange, peel and juice
- 1 can (16 ounce) apricot halves, drained
- 1 can (20 ounce) pineapple chunks, drained
- Apple jelly
- Parsley for garnish

1. Place corned beef in large kettle. Cover with water and simmer 3 to 4 hours or until tender.
2. Combine jelly, lemon and orange peel and juice in saucepan; heat until jelly melts. Remove corned beef from water to shallow baking pan.
3. Arrange apricot halves and pineapple chunks around meat. Baste meat and fruit with half the jelly glaze. Bake at 375 F. for 25 minutes.
4. Baste again with remaining glaze. Bake 30 minutes longer. Remove all to heated platter and garnish with parsley. Serves 8.

Successful Substitutions

I didn't have paprika so I used another spice.

 A friend gave me this recipe and said, "You just can't beat it." There must be something wrong with her; I can't even eat it! —Unknown

How many times have you been ready to cook and found you were out of a certain ingredient? Sometimes it's inconvenient to run out and purchase the necessary ingredient—it's easier to use a similar product as a replacement. There are, however, several factors to consider when substituting ingredients. Take into account differences in flavor, moisture, texture and weight. Substitutions with an acid factor, such as molasses, need to be neutralized to avoid changes in the flavor and texture of the

product. Differences in sweetening and thickening power need consideration in sugar and flour substitutions. To help avoid disappointments when substituting ingredients, understand the physical and chemical properties of all ingredients. Be sure to measure accurately.

The following list gives substitutes that may be used to achieve a product that is similar to the original. There are, however, a number of factors to consider when substituting ingredients. Each ingredient in a recipe has a specific function. Substitution of one ingredient for another may alter the taste, color, moisture content or texture of the product. For this reason, it is suggested that ingredient substitution be used in unexpected situations only.

Save this column, and if someday you don't have one of the ingredients listed below, try these substitutions. Happy cooking!





Dear Savvy Senior,

Can exercise help seniors with arthritis? I have osteoarthritis and have read that certain exercises can help ease the pain, but I don't know where to start, and I certainly don't want to make it any worse than it already is. What can you tell me?

Sedentary Sally

Dear Sally,

Lots of seniors who have arthritis believe that exercise will worsen their condition, but that's not true. Study after study has shown that exercise is actually one of the best treatments for osteoarthritis.

Proper and careful exercises can help reduce joint pain and stiffness, strengthen muscles around the joints and increase flexibility. It also helps manage other chronic conditions that are common among seniors with arthri-

Great Britain's ITV-1 has reported that the British government has launched an investigation into bosses at top security jail Her Majesty's Prison Wakefield located in West Yorkshire, England, handing out thousands of pounds to inmates in Bingo prize money. The jail, which reportedly holds some of Britain's most notorious criminals, has paid out more than £4,000 (US \$6,500) in cash prizes to prisoners playing Bingo behind bars. Prison chiefs say the prizes encourage inmates to take part in "regime activities," but Prisons Minister Jeremy Wright has launched a probe into paying prisoners cash prizes.

tis, such as diabetes, heart disease and obesity. Here are some tips to help you get moving.

Exercises for Arthritis

Determining exactly which types of exercises are best for you, depends on the form and severity of your arthritis, and which joints are involved. It's best to work with your doctor or a physical therapist to help you develop an exercise program that works for you. The different types of exercises that are most often recommended to seniors with arthritis include:

Range-of-motion exercises: These are gentle stretching exercises that can relieve stiffness as well as improve your ability to move your joints through their normal range of motion. These exercises should be done daily.

Strengthening exercise: Calisthenics, weight training and working with resistance bands are recommended (two or more days a week) to maintain and improve your muscle strength, which helps support and protect your joints.

Aerobic exercises: Low-impact activities like walking, cycling, swimming or water aerobics are all recommended three to five times per week to help improve cardiovascular health, control weight, and improve your overall function.

It's also important to keep in mind that when you first start exercising, you need to go slow to give your body time to adjust. If you push yourself too hard

Bingo Ends in Tragedy

What was supposed to be a daily Bingo game routine for local residents in Eb Magalona, a town in Negros Occidental, Philippines, ended in tragedy after the building where Bingo was begun played was rammed by a speeding passenger bus. *Tempo online* reported that Chief Supt. Agrimero Cruz, Jr., director of the Western Visayas regional police, said that the driver of the passenger bus lost control while trying to overtake another vehicle. Cruz said the fatalities were among a group of local residents playing Bingo in one of the houses alongside the national highway that was hit by the speeding bus.

Bingo Initiative

Proponents of a failed Bingo initiative in Guam reportedly paid more than \$60,000 to their supporters during the last week before the nation's General Election. According to a financial report filed with the Guam Election Commission, the Guam Japan Friendship Village, Inc. paid \$60,827 to supporters from Oct. 29 to Nov. 6. This was the last week before the General Election when hundreds of supporters for the Bingo initiative came out in full force along many of Guam's busy intersections. Some of the supporters said they were given \$40 to come out and wave at the events. The financial report does not break

you can aggravate your joint pain, however, some muscle soreness or joint aches in the beginning is normal.

To help you manage your pain start by warming up with some simple stretches or range of motion exercises for five to 10 minutes before you move on to strengthening or aerobic exercises. Another tip is to apply heat to the joints you'll be working before you exercise, and use cold packs after exercising to reduce inflammation.

If you're experiencing a lot of pain while you exercise, you may need to modify the frequency, duration, or intensity of your exercises until the pain improves. Or you may need to try a different activity—for example switching from walking to water aerobics. But if you're having severe, sharp or constant pain, or large increases in swelling or your joints feel hot or red, you need to stop and see your doctor.

To help you exercise at home, there are a number of arthritis exercise DVDs you can purchase to guide you through a wide variety of activities. Collage Video (collagevideo.com, 800-819-7111) sells several at prices ranging between \$10 and \$25, as does the Arthritis Foundation Store at afstore.org or 800-283-7800.
