

### Stained glass treasure

Q: I have a large stained glass panel made by Louis Heidt and John Dannenhoffer. It was shown at the 1893 Chicago Centennial and, in 1928 was bought by my uncle. Any info? Value? —Elaine, Pittsford, N.Y.

A: Frank Maraschiello, 20th-century decorative arts specialist at Bonhams in New York, looked over the image and supporting paperwork and pronounced it "quite a wonderful window."

It pays to consider when and how the window was made. Louis Heidt and John Dannenhoffer were both glassmakers with studios in Brooklyn, N.Y. They were contemporaries of Louis Comfort Tiffany, and in the 1880s Tiffany did some work in Heidt's studio. Heidt was a developer of opalescent glass. Others, including Tiffany, have patents on opalescent, but Heidt was a seminal figure. Tiffany, Heidt and Dannenhoffer worked independently, but "all were aware of what the others

were doing," says Maraschiello. Recognized glassmakers, Heidt and Dannenhoffer were not known for windows. But the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, also called the Chicago World's Fair, was a showplace for all kinds of glass arts. Tiffany had a major stained glass chapel on site and glass artisans of all kinds showed off their finest. The central question is—could the window actually be by Tiffany?

What is significant, said Maraschiello, is that it has remained in the family since purchase. That is a significant chunk of provenance. He's done some research, and it is his thinking that the window may indeed be Tiffany. If your sincere aim is to sell, Maraschiello will go wherever the window is to assess it firsthand and discuss it with you. It needs to be seen through light by a specialist who knows arts of the period and values in the current market.

Who knows what a lost treasure by Tiffany might bring? The window could sell for \$100,000 or more.

#### Make the Connection

If you're a veteran who is struggling to find ways to improve your life, perhaps because you're dealing with a service-related issue, I invite you to take a look at Make the Connection, a website run by the Department of Veterans Affairs. Make the Connection is a one-stop site for a wide variety of concerns affecting veterans: homelessness, jobs and employment, family and friends, mental-health concerns, transitioning from the service, dealing with physical injury and more.

Most impressive and useful is the Signs & Symptoms section. It's long, with dozens of symptoms, including flashbacks, feeling on edge, noise or light irritation, confusion, trouble sleeping and nightmares, and more. Each section is broken into three parts.

The first part is, "What can I do about it right away?" The steps aren't silly, either; they're ones a counselor or medical adviser likely would talk about first, things you can do at the moment to feel better and regain control. The second step is to make the connection with

medical or mental-health advisers. The third step is links to immediate information.

You even can customize the site to give information tailored more closely to who you are. Select from male/female, the era in which you served, the branch of service and whether you were exposed to combat.

If you don't have a computer, try to find one to use, possibly at your local library, and check in with Make the Connection at <http://maketheconnection.net>. You'll likely find sources of information and help. Don't miss the videos of veterans who talk about their own experiences.

If you're with a veterans' service organization, especially if you're in an advising capacity, look over the Make the Connection site and become familiar with what it has to offer the veterans you help.




## Memory Problems

### ■ Help for Seniors Who Worry

**Dear Savvy Senior,**

My mother, who's 72, has become very forgetful lately and is worried she may have Alzheimer's. Is her forgetfulness really something we should worry about? What should we do?

**Worried Daughter**

**Dear Worried,**

Many seniors worry about memory lapses as they get older, fearing it may be the first signs of Alzheimer's disease or some other type of dementia. To get some insight on the seriousness of your mom's problem, here are some key warning signs to be vigilant of and some resources you can turn to for help.

### Warning Signs

As we grow older, some memory difficulties—such as trouble remembering names of people or places or forgetting where you put your glasses—are associated with normal aging. But the symp-

toms of Alzheimer's disease are much more than simple memory lapses. Knowing the early warning signs is a good first step in recognizing the difference between typical age-related memory loss and a more serious problem. To help you evaluate your mom's condition, here's a checklist of some common early symptoms to watch for:

- Asking the same questions repeatedly.
- Getting lost in familiar areas.
- Failing to recognize familiar people.
- Having difficulty following directions.
- Misplaces items in inappropriate places, for example putting her keys in the microwave.
- Having difficulty completing familiar tasks like cooking a meal or paying a bill.
- Having trouble remembering common words when speaking, or mixing up words.

For more information, the Alzheimer's Association provides a list of 10 warning signs that you can access at [10signs.org](http://10signs.org), or call 800-272-3900 and request a free copy of their booklet *Basics of Alzheimer's Disease: What it is and what you can do*.

Another good screening tool is the self-administered cognitive screening (SAGE) test that was developed at The Ohio State University Medical Center. This test helps identify mild cognitive impairment and early dementia, and can be taken at home in about 10 to 15 minutes. You can download the SAGE test along with scoring instructions

at [sagetest.osu.edu](http://sagetest.osu.edu).

### Get Help

After going through the warning signs and/or testing of your mom, if you're still concerned, get her in to see her doctor for a thorough medical examination. Her doctor may then refer her to a geriatrician or neurologist who specializes in diagnosing and treating memory loss or Alzheimer's disease.

Keep in mind that even if your mom is experiencing some memory problems, it doesn't necessarily mean she has early stage Alzheimer's. Many memory problems are brought on by other factors like stress, depression, thyroid disease, side effects of medications, sleep disorders, vitamin deficiencies and other medical conditions. And by treating these conditions she can reduce or eliminate the problem.

### Free Memory Screening


Another option you should know about is National Memory Screening Day on Nov. 13, where your mom can get her memory tested for free. Sponsored by the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA), this free service provides a confidential, face-to-face memory screening that takes about 10 minutes to complete and consists of questions and/or tasks to evaluate her memory status.

The screening is given by doctors, nurse practitioners, psychologists, social workers or other healthcare professionals in more than 2,500 sites across the country. It's also important to know that

this screening is not a diagnosis. Instead, its goal is to detect problems and refer individuals with these problems for further evaluation.

To find a screening site in your area visit [nationalmemoryscreening.org](http://nationalmemoryscreening.org) or call 866-232-8484. The AFA recommends checking for a screening location shortly before Nov. 13, because new sites are constantly being added.







■ **Winner of largest jackpot won helps hometown high school**

### Historical Happening

On July 1, Wyoming made history by enacting the state's first lottery. The bill, HB 77, was the third lottery proposition brought forward since 2009. The bill faced considerable debate in the House of Representatives, but ultimately passed with a slim majority. The proposal was refined to address several concerns from dissenting representatives. Unlike some neighboring states, Wyoming's lottery won't include scratch-off instant win lottery cards, but rather only ticketed games such as Powerball. The lottery is being run by an autonomous corporate board selected by the governor. It is estimated that the state will receive \$6 million in projected profit from the lottery.

### A Trashed Ticket

A Massachusetts couple won \$1

million on a scratch-off lottery ticket they dug out of the trash after inadvertently throwing it away. The state lottery commission says Joseph and Joanne Zagami of North Attleborough bought the \$5 ticket from a vending machine while grocery shopping. They stuck the ticket in a bag and forgot about it. The next day, Joseph Zagami asked his wife if she had scratched the ticket. She hadn't. They dug through the trash and found it. The couple opted for the one-time lump sum payment of \$650,000 before taxes and \$455,000 after. They plan to pay off their mortgage and other bills and take a vacation.

### Giving Back

The 84-year-old Florida resident who scored the largest undivided U.S. lottery jackpot ever will donate \$2 million to fix the roof of a Maine high school in her hometown. Gloria MacKenzie, who took home a \$590.5 million Powerball jackpot in June, has kept a low profile since she turned in her winning ticket. But the superintendent of schools in East Millinocket, Maine, says MacKenzie has offered to write a hefty check to repair the roof of the town's high school, where her daughter teaches biology, the *Bangor Daily News* reported. MacKenzie is a former resident of East Millinocket, and still has ties to the town, according to the *Bangor Daily News*. In addition to her daughter's job teaching local kids at the high school, her son is a former town selectman, according to the paper.

### Stolen Ticket and a Conviction

A former auto dealership manager convicted of possessing an apartment complex maintenance worker's winning \$5 million New York lottery ticket was sentenced to up to 25 years in prison by a judge who cited his "rapacious greed." The Onondaga County (New York) District Attorney's Office said Andy Ashkar, 35, of Camillus, received the maximum sentence of 8 years, 4 months to 25 years for having the ticket that was stolen from his parents' convenience store in Syracuse in October 2006. Prosecutors said Ashkar, a former finance manager at a Syracuse-area auto dealership, had stolen the winning scratch-off ticket from the real winner, Robert Miles. Lottery officials said they're in the "final stages" of the verification process that will determine if the ticket belongs to Miles. Ashkar's brother, Nayel, was cleared of conspiracy charges during the same trial. Their father, Nayef, owner of the store where the ticket was sold, is charged with conspiracy. He has a separate trial—which began in September.

# GAMING TODAY

**Pennsylvania.** The \$60 million Lady Luck Casino Nemacolin has opened with 28 table games and 600 slots. Located near Pittsburgh, Lady Luck is a "Category 3" facility, which means players must be guests of the hotel to gamble. Otherwise they have to spend \$10 on food, drinks, or merchandise, or purchase an annual membership for \$45.

**Illinois.** Video poker machines in bars and restaurants took in \$23 million in May, more than the win at nine of the state's 10 riverboat casinos. At last count, there were 7,536 machines in operation in the state.

**Colorado.** The former Fitzgeralds Casino in Black Hawk is now the Saratoga Casino Black Hawk. The casino is owned by New York's Saratoga Harness Racing Inc.

**Bahamas.** Resorts World Bimini, a joint venture between Genting Malaysia Bhd. and RAV Bahamas Ltd., has opened in a beachfront resort that also offers restaurants, retail, and the largest marina in the Bahamas. A new cruise ship called Bimini Super-Fast has been launched to make the two-hour (each way) trip to Miami twice daily to supply customers.

**Japan.** With a bill being prepared that would legalize gambling in Japan, revenue estimates are as high as \$10 billion per year, far outpacing Singapore's \$5.9 billion, though well off Macau's \$38 billion. Even if the bill passed, it would take another two years to put firm laws in place and casinos would have to be built, which means casino gambling in Japan is at least five years away.

**Online.** Ultimate Poker has completed its field trial and is now fully licensed in Nevada, and still the only legal option in the U.S. (see here for a powerful LVA sign-up promotion). After missing its hoped-for World Series of Poker launch, Caesars Interactive now says its online poker site will debut some time in the fall. Meanwhile, attention is turning to New Jersey, where industry players are scrambling to partner with one of the 12 bricks-and-mortar casinos, which is required by state law to participate there. The most recently announced affiliations are Ultimate Gaming/Trump Taj Mahal and PokerStars/Resorts. New Jersey officials say the earliest online gambling could begin is Nov. 23, but is more likely to be in 2014.

In bigger news, Phil Ivey has signed to be the face of online gambling for Pala Interactive, a company formed by the Pala Band of Mission Indians out of Northern San Diego. It's the first move in the online space to come out of California, and it's a big one considering Ivey's celebrity status in the gambling world. Despite it all, another bill that would establish federal regulation has been introduced by U.S. Representative Joe Barton from Texas—though its not expected to get any traction.



### Make time for reading

Many shoppers carefully select healthy and nutritious foods for themselves and their families. And yet, even the most conscientious shoppers might be fooled by fancy food labels that cleverly make consumers think they are getting something better than they are. Some tricks have been around for a long time. Here are some described in an issue of *Nutrition Action HealthLetter*:

**Fruit Drinks:** Fruit drinks labeled with "100 percent vitamin C" may have plenty of vitamin C, but what else? If a juice is fruit-flavored sugar water or just a little fruit juice, it is missing many bonuses of 100-percent fruit juice. Orange juice, for example, has vitamin C, as well as calcium, iron, phosphorus, magnesium and zinc.

**Whole Grains:** Marketers know that health-conscious consumers are looking for whole grains. At a glance, the package may say in big bright letters "Whole Grain," but the ingredients show the whole grain as second or third on the list. Ingredients are listed by weight, with the most abundant

by weight listed first, so there may be less whole grain than what one might think. However, the claim is not a lie. The package itself says, in fine print, "made with."

**Real Fruit:** "Made with real fruit" is a claim made in cereals and other breakfast foods. Looking at the ingredient list can reveal that there is fruit in the product, but it may be listed fifth or sixth—not as much as the shopper might hope. A better choice might be to select the whole-grain cereal or pancake and top it with fresh, frozen or canned fruit.

**Omega-3 Fatty Acids:** These are ones that can help lower the risk of heart disease—but not all omega-3's are created equal. EPA and DHA are the two omega-3 fats that research indicates play the biggest part in heart health. ALA, a third kind of omega-3 fat, is the one most often added to foods and touted on the label. Choose to eat fatty fish to get your EPA and DHA. To make the best choices, consumers must read food packages carefully and look at the ingredient lists. Select a time to shop when you have time to read and compare brands. Once you've read the labels and selected your favorite products, your shopping time will be cut in half because you can select the same brands over and over again. This recipe for Spanish-Style Cod with Tomatoes adds a hint of spice and Spanish flair by using fully cooked, Spanish-style chorizo, a pork sausage seasoned with smoked paprika and chili, not the soft, Mexican type. Cod that has been sustainably fished—U.S. Pacific cod or Atlantic cod from Iceland and the northeast Arctic—is the best to use for this dish, so read the label! Pacific cod, which is nearly an identical stand-in or Pacific ling or Alaskan

pollack may be used as a substitute. (Additional information provided by Janet Hackert, Nutrition and Health Education Specialist, Harrison County, University of Missouri Extension.)

### SPANISH-STYLE COD WITH TOMATOES

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil  
1 medium onion, finely chopped  
4 ounces Spanish chorizo or kielbasa, diced  
1 tablespoon poultry seasoning, divided  
1 teaspoon salt, divided  
1 teaspoon black pepper, divided  
1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes or cayenne pepper  
1 (15-ounce) can fire-roasted tomatoes with peppers  
1/2 cup chicken stock, divided  
1 (15-ounce) can great northern beans or cannellini beans, rinsed  
1 1/4 pounds Pacific cod or Atlantic cod, Pacific ling or Alaskan pollack, cut into 4 pieces  
1 teaspoon Spanish paprika  
1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lemon juice  
Cooking oil spray

1. Preheat oven to 425 F. 2. Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Add onion, chorizo (or

kielbasa), 1/2 tablespoon poultry seasoning, 1/2 teaspoon salt and pepper, and the red pepper flakes. Cook, stirring, until fragrant, about 2 minutes. 3. Add the tomatoes with peppers and 1/4 cup broth. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the broth is almost evaporated, 2 to 4 minutes. Stir in beans. Remove from heat. 4. Sprinkle fish on both sides with remaining oil, poultry seasoning, salt, pepper and paprika. Coat a 9-by-13-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Place fish in prepared baking dish. 5. Top each piece of fish with equal amounts of the tomato mixture (about 1/2 cup per fillet). Pour the remaining 1/4 cup broth into the pan and cover the pan with foil. Bake until the fish is just cooked through, 15 to 20 minutes. Serve fish with the sauce over the top. Sprinkle with lemon juice.

## Bingo tips

### ■ The money could be a donation

#### Dear Aunt Bingo,

I am an avid Bingo player. The question I and a lot of other Bingo players that go to Bingo halls with electronic machines want to ask is: Can Bingo machines be rigged?

I keep thinking about this question and do not know what the answer is. I am being a spokeswoman for a lot of players. The operators of the machine can set up the people who ask for six-

packs in them but put in 10-packs. Do you know if that is true?

There has to be honesty and integrity! —*One of Your Bingo Bugle Readers*

#### Dear Reader,

I would guess that in theory any electronic device can be “rigged”—that is, it can be programmed to perform a task in a particular way. So of course, if one of those functions is the number and type of packs a player receives at Bingo, it is logical that a person could request and pay for six-packs and receive 10-paks if the programmer chooses to punch in that code.

However, a Bingo hall that allowed this to happen would not be around for long. As a state licensed wagering entity, Bingo halls must maintain records, which are audited. If the amount of money coming in does not match the number and types of packs being sold, an audit would quickly reveal this corruption, an investigation would result, and possible legal action taken

against those involved. —*Aunt Bingo*

#### Dear Aunt Bingo,

I Am a Bingo “addict”...a woman in her late 70s. I go to a lot of Bingos every week. At some I am a winner and, of course, at most I am a loser. When a person wins, that winner gives a tip to the caller. BUT, the caller is a volunteer and the Bingo is for a church school. I just think that might be a little too much, because that could be a donation for the organization.

—*Curious in Santa Ana, California*

#### Dear Curious,

I definitely think it is too much. If a volunteer accepts tips it could easily be perceived as an attempt by a player to influence the outcome of the games. According to the California Attorney General’s “Guide For Charities,” page 26—“Certain tax-exempt organizations are authorized by state law and local ordinance to raise money from Bingo, provided that: (1) the proceeds are used only for charitable

purposes, (2) the games are conducted by volunteer members of the organizations, (3) no salaries are paid with Bingo proceeds, (4) there is no commingling of Bingo money with any other funds, (5) the organization conducting Bingo holds a valid license issued by the city or county in which Bingo is played.”

Items #2 and #3 clearly emphasize that the games must be run by unpaid volunteers, but unfortunately does not discuss tipping. My suggestion would be to contact the Attorney General’s Public Inquiry Unit (916-322-3360) with this and any other questions you may have. —*Aunt Bingo*

#### Memory Problems

### ■ Help for Seniors Who Worry

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

My mother, who's 72, has become very forgetful lately and is worried she may have Alzheimer's. Is her forgetfulness really something we should worry about? What should we do?

**Worried Daughter**

#### Dear Worried,

Many seniors worry about memory lapses as they get older, fearing it may be the first signs of Alzheimer's disease or some other type of dementia. To get some insight on the seriousness of your mom's problem, here are some key warning signs to be vigilant of and some resources you can turn to for help.

#### Warning Signs

As we grow older, some memory difficulties—such as trouble remembering names of people or places or

forgetting where you put your glasses—are associated with normal aging. But the symptoms of Alzheimer's disease are much more than simple memory lapses. Knowing the early warning signs is a good first step in recognizing the difference between typical age-related memory loss and a more serious problem. To help you evaluate your mom's condition, here's a checklist of some common early symptoms to watch for:

- Asking the same questions repeatedly.
- Getting lost in familiar areas.
- Failing to recognize familiar people.
- Having difficulty following directions.
- Misplaces items in inappropriate places, for example putting her keys in the microwave.
- Having difficulty completing familiar tasks like cooking a meal or paying a bill.
- Having trouble remembering common words when speaking, or mixing up words.

For more information, the Alzheimer's Association provides a list of 10 warning signs that you can access at 10signs.org, or call 800-272-3900 and request a free copy of their booklet *Basics of Alzheimer's Disease: What it is and what you*

can do.

Another good screening tool is the self-administered cognitive screening (SAGE) test that was developed at The Ohio State University Medical Center. This test helps identify mild cognitive impairment and early dementia, and can be taken at home in about 10 to 15 minutes. You can download the SAGE test along with scoring instructions at sagetest.osu.edu.

#### Get Help

After going through the warning signs and/or testing of your mom, if you're still concerned, get her in to see her doctor for a thorough medical examination. Her doctor may then refer her to a geriatrician or neurologist who specializes in diagnosing and treating memory loss or Alzheimer's disease.

Keep in mind that even if your mom is experiencing some memory problems, it doesn't necessarily mean she has early stage Alzheimer's. Many memory problems are brought on by other factors like stress, depression, thyroid disease, side effects of medications, sleep disorders, vitamin deficiencies and other medical conditions. And by treating these conditions she can reduce or eliminate the problem.

#### Free Memory Screening

Another option you should know

about is National Memory Screening Day on Nov. 13, where your mom can get her memory tested for free. Sponsored by the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA), this free service provides a confidential, face-to-face memory screening that takes about 10 minutes to complete and consists of questions and/or tasks to evaluate her memory status. The screening is given by doctors, nurse practitioners, psychologists, social workers or other healthcare professionals in more than 2,500 sites across the country. It's also important to know that this screening is not a diagnosis. Instead, its goal is to detect problems and refer individuals with these problems for further evaluation.

To find a screening site in your area visit nationalmemoryscreening.org or call 866-232-8484. The AFA recommends checking for a screening location shortly before Nov. 13, because new sites are constantly being added.


