We were looking to include the Boise State game at FedEx field to start the season but for some unknown reason Dan Snyder refused to meet our demands for a suitable location.

In the past two months we have replaced several interior doors that were damaged by vandalism during the summer break, as well as installed a new metal frame and solid core door on the first floor "pit room" bedroom. We received a building permit from the Town of Blacksburg and began work on new bathroom facilities on the first floor this summer. A two-stall bathroom is located in the combined areas that were once the hallway leading to the kitchen and the urinal trough room (and the old pay phone closet before that). Upon completion in September, the facilities will provide for appropriate facilities for guests for, let's face it, the first time ever, at the fraternity house. The actives have even promised to keep it stocked with toilet paper.

We continue to try to install a renewed sense of pride and ownership by those living and using OUR fraternity house. An improved DKE house and a strong active chapter are vital to the sustainability of DKE/DKS Alumni Association. We all want to make the house an asset that: students will want to live in; guests will speak highly of; and alumni will be proud to visit. As always we need and rely upon your support to make this happen.




VT DKE-DKS Tailgate Club
