
## Holy Cross Day

### September 14

This fall we will be celebrating Holy Cross Day on Sunday, September 14, during our normal liturgies. This festival day is surrounded by legend. In 335 Constantine, the emperor of the Roman Empire, built two basilicas in Jerusalem, one of which was supposedly on the site of the Holy Sepulchre, the tomb where Jesus was buried. The legend holds that the cross on which Christ was crucified was found during the construction, and this fact is attested to by Cyril of Jerusalem in 350. This relic of the true cross was preserved in the basilica of the Holy Sepulchre and was brought out for public veneration on Good Friday.

The Festival of the Exultation of the Holy Cross commemorates the exposition of the true cross after its return from the Persians who had destroyed the church of the Holy Sepulchre. The date coincided with the anniversary of the dedication of the church. This festival became very popular in northern Europe and remained on Lutheran calendars long after the Reformation with the abbreviated title "Holy Cross Day."

The centrality of the "theology of the cross" in Lutheran theology makes celebrating this festival appropriate. Our theology states that through the cross, Christ "has purchased and freed me from all my sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death" (Luther's Small Catechism). Good Friday is the day on which we solemnly meditate on the cross, but Holy Cross Day is the day on which we can celebrate the victory of the cross. - Kyle Schiefelbein, Sacristan and member of St. Mark's

## Blessing of the Animals Sunday, Oct. 5 at 9:00 am



## Luther Lecture October 29 Dr. Jane Strohl to be Honored At Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary





(cont. from page 1) We want to thank you for your faithfulness and generosity to this campaign.

**F**orward in Faith – Serving a New Century three-year appeal is coming to a close this fall. If we stay on track with our giving over the next few months, we will have raised over \$978,500. In the closing weeks

of this campaign, we have an opportunity to finish strong, perhaps catch-up if need be, and be in the strongest financial position as possible when we close the chapter on this current capital campaign.

As we end this three-year appeal,

we look forward to our next campaign that is designed to service the debt we have incurred in our building program. It is the best stewardship of our offerings to continue campaigns back-to-back until we have completely paid off the building.

**C**urrently we owe \$1,288,284 on our building loan with Thrivent. Most congregations who employ this strategy are able to pay off their mortgages in *one-half* the time they borrowed the money for, thus saving tens of thousands of dollars in interest over the life of the loan.

Besides servicing the debt and as an act of faith and trust, we will tithe 10% of all gifts received to two ministries important to this congregation.

**H**alf of the tithed amount will be designated toward an "elevator fund." Due to the forethought of the members of the Renovation Commission, we have already prepared our church building for an elevator. This fund will begin to move us forward in realizing this dream – elevator access to all three levels of our church building!

The second half of our tithe will go toward our Sister Parish in Soyapango, El Salvador. Liv Beck visited this parish last year and has made personal connections with the pastoral leadership and members. Our monetary gift will help this parish in their efforts to build and serve their community.

**T**his new campaign entitled, **Forward in Faith – Together in Mission** will be launched this fall. 


