(SPLIT B) In response to the court order, *some people* have proposed a plan to ease prison crowding without releasing any inmates early.

The plan has a couple parts, but I'll want to get your opinion on the overall plan.

They will ask the courts for more time to reduce the prison population, so they can expand rehabilitation services for inmates, such as drug and mental health treatment. They believe that with such help, more offenders will stay out of prison once they have served their time. Supporters say that will ultimately reduce the prison population. Expanding those rehabilitation services would initially cost 75 million dollars, and an additional 240 million dollars would be divided up between rehabilitation services and the state's general fund.

If the courts do not give the state extra time to reduce the prison population, the state cannot have more time. If that happens, the state will move thousands of inmates to privately-owned prisons in California and other states, and to some county jails and other facilities. That would cost 315 million dollars the first year, paid from the state's budget reserve.
