- **Clinical:**
 - provide psychotherapy and evaluation services to a variety of populations, including evaluations for psychological suitability for infertility treatment, weight management for bariatric surgery patients, & counseling for individuals, couples, and adolescents with mood, anxiety, and/or substance abuse disorders
 - work includes consultation with physicians to insure that psychological services dovetail with patient's medical needs
- **Research:**
 - have been hired for a variety of health-related projects, including quality-of-life questions in medical populations & program sustainability in public health projects
 - consultations generally involved working with medical and public health professionals to identify key psychological constructs and to find best approach for measuring
 - frequently conducted both qualitative & quantitative analyses (e.g. factor analysis & regressions) & co-wrote research papers
 - completed all analyses and paper-writing ahead of schedule
