# A strong quiet

ngie Renfro's beautifully rendered paintings of industrial landscapes, branches, insects and birds capture the everyday color and mood of these small scenes, creatures and places and opens them up to the universality of emotions that exist behind them.

"I'm finding myself most inspired by industrial landscapes at the moment," says Renfro. "The structural shapes, the beauty of the rust and withered surfaces; the loneliness of it. I recently moved from San Francisco to Chicago for a change of input and am finding inspiration all over the place."

This idea of capturing the beauty in overlooked places is the driving force behind many of Renfro's paintings.

"My paintings have a sense of solitude about them—a strong quiet," says Renfro. "I find beauty in subjects and compositions that have a quality of aloneness and believe that this feeling resonates with everyone on some level. There is a feeling of nostalgia and familiarity to my paintings because they are of subjects that everyone has seen or driven past a million times."

Renfro believes that her recent move to Chicago has really given her much-needed inspiration.

"I'm really excited about where I am with my work right now and where my work is going," says Renfro. "My recent move has flooded me with new input and has sparked new ideas that I want to explore. My work is

constantly evolving, and seeing as how I'm fairly new to the art scene, I have a lot of room to grow."
