CAROLINE HOUSE RECEIVES GRANT FROM FAIRFIELD COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

BRIDGEPORT, CT - Caroline House is pleased to announce it has received a \$15,000 donor-advised grant from the Fairfield County Community Foundation. This grant will be used to support English as a Second Language (ESL) and life skills classes for women as part of the Mother and Child Literacy Program.

The Mother and Child Literacy Program provides free literacy education and support services to economically-disadvantaged families in the Bridgeport area. The program consists of ESL and life skills classes for women. While mothers attend classes, their preschool children receive school-readiness instruction in a nurturing environment. School-age children attend tutoring after school and in the summer. The children strengthen academic skills and build self-esteem. Over 200 women and children are served per year.

"We are most grateful to the Fairfield County Community Foundation and its donor support of our Mother and Child Literacy Program," said Peg Regan, SSND, Executive Director of Caroline House. "This grant will help provide essential student and classroom needs. In the informal setting of Caroline House classes, a sense of community grows as students share common struggles, joys and hopes for the future. Women attend classes to improve their own lives and the lives of their children. This grant enables us to continue to expand and improve this vital program."
