



**Figure 1.** City of Chicago with Inset Maps of West Town/Humboldt Park and the Mid-South




**Figure 2**. 1991 Assessed Value per Acre by Block Source: Cook County Assessor




**Figure 3.** 1994 Assessed Value per Acre by Block Source: Cook County Assessor

**Figure 6.** Composite Index of Neighborhood Change: 1990-2000 Source: Zielenbach, 2005






Figure 7. Community Area Map with Numbered Legend




**Figure 8.**Percent of Population Age 17 and Under: 1990 Source: U.S. Census, 1990




**Figure 9.**Percent of Population Age 17 and Under: 2000 Source: U.S. Census, 2000




**Figure 14.**Percent Non-Hispanic White: 1990 Source: U.S. Census, 1990











