- 54.3% of teen girls and 49% of teen boys currently have steady girlfriends or boyfriends

 - o 27% for 1 to 3 months
 - o 18% between 3 and 8 months
 - o 5% have been dating this person for less than 1 month.
 - o In comparison, 29% of the boys were dating their current partner for less than 1 month
 - o 25% have been dating their partner for 1-3 months
 - o 18% have been dating that person for 3 to 8 months
 - o 29% have been with their current partner for over 8 months.
