#### **President's Letter**

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to the membership of the Waukegan Historical Society. As the newly elected President, I look forward to building upon the many successes that have occurred over the past two years under the leadership of Sara Griffin. During that period, I have served as a board member, chaired the museum committee, and assisted with the Tour of Homes and the redesign of the newsletter.

I am a relatively recent transplant to Waukegan, having moved here in April 2000 from the northwest side of Chicago. I was immediately impressed with the many historic homes in Waukegan when I started my house search, and was even more impressed with their affordability, given my knowledge of Chicago area housing prices. Having settled into a comfortable 1920s American foursquare on Douglas Avenue, the area reminded me a great deal of the neighborhood in which I grew up.

I continue to work in Chicago, commuting daily on the Metra. Since 1999, I have been employed by the Society of Architectural Historians as comptroller. In addition, I serve as manager of programs for the Charnley-Persky House Museum, the 1892 National Historic Landmark designed by Louis Sullivan and Frank Lloyd Wright in which the Society maintains its headquarters. My background is in historic preservation, having earned my master's degree in that field from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

I currently serve as Chairman of the Historic Preservation Commission, for the City of Waukegan, and am also active with the history committee at the Genesee Theatre. I have always held a strong belief in the value of community involvement, and it has had the added benefit of introducing me to many individuals whom I now count as good friends.

Our first event under my tenure is the Tour of Homes on June 27th for which you will be receiving a separate mailing shortly. I have personally visited the sites included on this year's tour, and am confident it will be another successful event. I hope you will all plan on attending.

I look forward to working with the membership and board, our museum supervisor Brian Hora, the Waukegan Park District, and the city of Waukegan in advancing the mission of the Society. Please feel free to contact me at anytime about ideas you may have for future programs and events that will make the Society more beneficial for you and the community.

#### The Barns of Lake County



The Land Conservancy of Lake County is pleased to announce the publication of *The Barns of Lake County* by Nancy Schumm-Burgess. The book documents many of the remaining historic Lake County barns in over 200 photographs with family anecdotes and local history information. Burgess has been documenting the barns in Lake County since beginning a 1997 photo project for the Village of Long Grove. The book is the culmination of that documentation. All proceeds benefit the Land Conservancy of Lake County, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation working to protect remaining farmland and open space in Lake County. Book cost is \$39.95 plus \$5 shipping (\$4 shipping for each additional book) and can be ordered by mailing a check or money order to the Land Conservancy of Lake County, P.O. # **Summertime Fun**

Waukegan's sesquicentennial isn't too far away (2009) and many changes have been proposed for our lake-front by then. Let's return to our semicentennial (1909) and see how the people enjoyed that summer along the lake and throughout the city.

Summer was kicked off with a Memorial Day program given by the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) at the Armory. Other local groups were active in providing entertainment, such as the picnic the Danish Brotherhood gave at Electric Park. Events of the Finnish societies were to be enhanced by the ferris wheel built by E. Hanne. It had a 40 foot rise and was located on the Sunderlin pasture on Belvidere Street, near Jackson.

Industry still dominated the area along the lake. Thomas Brass and Iron, Western Coal and Dock, and Ludington Salt Co. were right on the water. Alshuler, Blatchford, Chicago Recording Scale and Cyclone Fence, along with many others, were within a few blocks. Even these were changing. Gourley Co. was removing soft coal sheds. West Coast Roofing was trying to buy lots on the lake shore to build a new factory. Randolph Manning got out of the business when he sold his interest in the tannery to the Wilders.

Even with all the business activity going on, the lakefront was still a major recreational area. For the third year the ship Pere Marquette 18 was running daily excursion service between Chicago and Waukegan. There must have been a lot of passengers. One hundred souvenir cards were mailed daily at the lakefront. Local sensibilities were bruised when one card called Lake Front Park "2 by 4". One day the big boat and its crew of 100 brought many members of the theatre crowd to town where they were entertained by Joe Howard and Mabel Barrison.

Public officials recognized the importance of the lake front. Besides their desire for a new city hall, the City Council discussed opening more streets to the lake. In fact there was an announcement that Gillett Avenue was to be opened to the lake and a drive was to be made along the beach. That was modified almost immediately by acknowledging that there might be difficulties in getting access for the Gillett extension.

One highlight of the summer was the three day Waukegan Day celebration in July. The opening of the new city park (at the location of today's Bowen Park) was a major cause of the celebration. Ruth Norman of north Sheridan Road was queen of the carnival. The Chicago and Milwaukee Electric Railroad said they would build a branch to the new park. B.J. Loftus of Grayslake did his part by exhibiting a six legged calf. But the area didn't become a park, and was later sold to Hull House. There were, however, calls for the creation of a park district.

What would a summer be without a circus? Sells-Floto was in town with a parade and performances at Browning and Marion (today's South Genesee) Streets on August 6. And if one circus is good, two must be great. So, only four days later, Gollmar Bros. Circus was in town.

All these activities had to end sometime, and they did with a Labor Day parade called the "largest ever seen in the city".

While all this fun happened almost a century ago, maybe it wasn't too different from what we see today, or hope to see, along with other changes going on in town.


