# KLT ANNUAL MEETING OVER 120 MEMBERS HIKE, PADDLE, AND CELEBRATE 24 YEARS OF LAND CONSERVATION


KLT's largest annual meeting to date was held on a beautiful summer day at the Androscoggin Yacht Club in Wayne. Highlights included afternoon field trips, a bountiful potluck and cookout, and KLT land donor and volunteer awards. Enthusiastic hikers and paddlers visited three properties: Macdonald Woods in Readfield, Perkins Woods in Wayne, and Mount Pisgah in Winthrop, with stewards Howard Lake and Stan and Jane Davis and KLT staff. Members visited around picnic tables and the grill and sampled delicious summer potluck dishes prior to the annual meeting.

President Stan Eller, Treasurer Amy Trunnell, and I reported on KLT's "Year of Awards," our land conservation programs, our finances, and our 25th anniversary year goals. Ginny Coady was honored for her dedication with the 2012 Volunteer award. Bob Mohlar, Chair of the Lands Committee, recognized and thanked KLT's 2012 land donors for their conservation vision:

**Berndt and Elaine Graf** of Fayette for the Meadow Brook Farm agricultural and conservation easement; 256 acres of fields, woodlands, and wetlands.

**Arn and Leda Sturtevant** of Fayette for donating a new 67-acre conservation easement. The Sturtevants have now permanently conserved 89 acres of woodland, wetlands, and a Scenic View Area on their family homestead.

**Mary Griffith Lynch** of Fayette for her donation of the David Pond Woodland Conservation Area; 67 acres with woodlands and wetlands, vernal pools, and over 1500 feet of undeveloped shoreline.

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings KLT members and friends,

It's a joy to be a part of KLT's conservation efforts and great successes. This year we have received numerous awards and have been chosen by the Land Trust Alliance to be part of its national "Excellence Program." We are recognized as a model of public stewardship, volunteerism, land conservation, and partnership building, and are highly regarded for our conservation vision. Our success is reflected in the generosity of our donors and members

who share their time, talents, and resources. We have much to be proud of as we create a conservation legacy for our communities. As we prepare to celebrate our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2013, think about all that has been accomplished in the past twenty-five years and all that can be accomplished in the next twenty-five.

Mt. Pisgah — what a success story! Twenty-five years ago I hiked Mt. Pisgah with my wife Peg and our two young daughters. The day was hot; the trail was rutted, steep, and difficult for short legs. At the top we climbed part way up the fire tower, had a picnic in the open field, picked blueberries, and stored memories of

the beautiful views. At the 2012 KLT Annual Meeting I hiked the Mt. Pisgah trail again with Peg and our oldest daughter Allyson. This time the trail meandered through beautiful woods and across bog bridges to reach the summit and the fire tower, which has new stairs. The view was just as beautiful as it was twenty-five years ago!

This fall, with your support, we purchased sixty new acres on Mt. Pisgah, including the old blueberry fields. Over the past twenty-five years the Kennebec Land Trust, the Town of Winthrop, and many friends and donors have made it possible to conserve 800 acres on Mount Pisgah; the Mount Pisgah Conservation Area is now the most visited of all the lands owned by KLT.

All of KLT's 2012 Annual Appeal funds were committed to land acquisition. We have conserved a major portion of the shoreland around Little Cobbossee Lake in Winthrop, and significant funds have been directed to the Mt. Pisgah Legacy. We are still raising funds for these new conservation lands and we hope that you'll consider becoming a part of this legacy in your community.

The KLT board welcomes our newest member, Mike Seitzinger, an attorney living in Augusta. His dedication and expertise will be most valuable to KLT's upcoming major membership drives and capital campaigns. Sue Liebling is leaving the board to attend to a number of pressing family needs. We thank her for many years of dedicated service and are thrilled that she will continue to be one of the KLT stewards for Camp Bearnstow.

John Melrose has provided the KLT development committee with excellent leadership but will be leaving the board due to other professional obligations. He will continue as a steward at the Vassalboro Wildlife Habitat. We offer many thanks for his ongoing commitment to KLT.

Justin Schlawin, KLT's 2011-2012 Conservation Assistant, recently accepted a full time position with the Maine Natural Areas Program. Congratulations to Justin and our thanks for his excellent work for KLT.

#### FROM TERESA WITHEE, KLT SUMMER INTERN

My summer working alongside KLT staff and volunteers as an intern was a truly educational and motivating experience. Each person I met possessed a love for the environment and a desire to protect it for our use and the natural world's use, making each of those people an inspiration to me. From this experience I gained skills that I feel will be helpful in whatever career I eventually choose: skills like grant and press release writing, engaging with the public for educational purposes, and doing effective research. 
