



Justin Anderson is considered one of the most athletic and aggressive small forwards in the 2012 class, ranked #51 in the ESPNU Super 60. A member of the gold-medal winning USA Basketball Men's U16 and U17 National Teams, Anderson is a fierce competitor who can score from anywhere on the court.

ROAD TO NHSI

At #3 in the ESPN RISE FAB50, Montrose Christian comes into the NHSI as the number one seed in the tournament. Though the Mustangs are a young team, that didn't stop them from playing a challenging schedule and incurring only one loss on the year. Stu Vetter's squad delivered notable wins over Oak Hill Academy (VA), Findlay Prep (NV), and Arlington Country Day (FL) and are ranked number one in the Washington D.C. area. In addition to Anderson, the team features Villanova-bound senior guard Tyrone Johnson (#71 ESPNU 100), a talented playmaker with terrific size and strength.

Headed to Duke in the fall, the senior point guard is ranked #39 in the ESPNU Top 100 and is potent when the game is on the line. He was a member of the USA Basketball Men's U16 and U17 National Teams that won world championships in Argentina and Germany.

ROAD TO NHSI

Oak Hill Academy comes to this year's tournament ranked as the #5 team in the ESPN RISE FAB50. The Warriors ended their season 29-3, notching big wins against Montverde Academy (FL), Arlington Country Day (FL), and Memphis Melrose (TN). Home to alumni such as Carmelo Anthony, Kevin Durant and Rajon Rondo, Oak Hill has three Division I commits on their roster. In addition to Cook, seniors Keith Hornsby and Daniel Gomis are headed to the University of North Carolina-Asheville and Oregon State University, respectively.

The 2011 McDonald's All-American is headed to the University of Texas to play his college ball.

ROAD TO NHSI

The Pilots of Findlay Prep come to NHSI as the two-time defending champions and look to make it three in a row at this year's tournament. Ranked #7 in the ESPN RISE FAB50, the team features three players rated in the ESPNU Top 100. In addition to Kabongo, this talented team includes University of Arizona-bound Nick Johnson (#23 ESPNU 100) and St. John's-bound Amir Garrett (#95 ESPNU 100). Although the Pilots incurred three losses this year, Michael Peck's squad ended Texas powerhouse Yates' 66-game win streak in December and won the prestigious Montverde Academy Invitational tournament in January.

Son of Boston Celtics coach Doc Rivers, Austin Rivers is rated the number one player in high school basketball. Headed to Duke in the fall, he holds the top spot in the ESPNU 100 and is a 2011 McDonald's All-American, 2011 Jordan Brand All-American, the 2011 Naismith Player of the Year, and the 2011 Morgan Wootten Player of the Year. Rivers' averaged 28.8 points as a senior and put himself in the history books as Winter Park's all-time leading scorer with over 2,900 career points.

ROAD TO NHSI

Ranked #15 in the ESPN RISE FAB 50, Winter Park comes to NHSI hot off their second consecutive 6A state championship. The title was the second in Winter Park history and was the first time in central Florida that a 6A school won back-to-back championships. David Bailey's Wildcats recorded several big wins this season against Dr. Phillips (FL), Montverde Academy (FL), and Dwyer (FL).



ROAD TO NHSI

Boys & Girls enter the NHSI 24-6 and are fresh off winning their second consecutive Public Schools Athletic League Class AA title under head coach Ruth Lovelace. Boys & Girls knocked off several nationally ranked teams, including Winter Park (FL) and Academy of the New Church (PA). In addition to Taylor, the Kangaroos rely heavily on 5-foot-4 senior point guard and floor general Antione Slaughter, a competitive and athletic leader who was named MVP of the Class AA championship game.

ROAD TO NHSI

Fresh off a 5A state championship title, Dwyer comes to this year's tournament ranked #16 in the ESPN RISE FAB 50. The state title was the third for coach Fred Ross, who was named Coach of the Year by the Florida Association of Basketball Coaches. The Panther's only loss this season came at the hands of Winter Park in the City of Palms Tournament in December. In addition to Brissett, the team also features junior center Joell James (#33 ESPNU Super 60). The left-handed post player is a solid rebounder and is highly ranked amongst centers in the 2012 class.

ROAD TO NHSI
