



Kinnikinick Lake Loop

This route will take you over three hours, but passes through many different topographical and scenic changes.

The section between markers “124 and 82 turn left” and “82 Turn Left” is fairly difficult on big bikes, this stretch offers good technical practice. Slow down and enjoy the challenge!

From the point marked “Cattle Guard” until the route turns north again the terrain becomes more open with Junipers replacing the Ponderosa Pines.

We saw herds of elk along the wide open northward stretch of FS82 as we headed toward the lake. Absolutely worth the struggles of earlier sections!
