



Mud Spring Loop

FS 240 and 132A are fairly wide and smooth. (When we road them they had just graded so there was loose gravel and dirt – use caution).

Shortly after starting up 132A you will come to a small trail on your right. I call it Chicken out Climb. On the loaded GS I eventually ran out of “man parts”. This was after scrambling up rocky steep inclines and jumping downed logs of course. (note: use your own judgement!)

The loop itself is further up and on your left. It was quite muddy in April, but may be dry now. Otherwise a nice easy loop. At point marked “Turn Right for Loop” a trail heads down a rocky downhill toward FS700. We did not follow it out so cannot comment on its quality.
